NARRATIVE SUMMARY

During the first four days of January 1968 BLT 2/4 continued embarking aboard ARG/SLF ALFA shipping. Operational control (OPCON) of BLT 2/4 was passed from CG III MAF to CTF 79 at 020600H and OPCON of BLT 2/4 was passed from CTF 79 to CTG 79.4 at the same time. Embarkation of BLT 2/4 was completed at 040810H and all ARG/SLF ALFA ships departed RVN for Subic Bay, R. P. The USS IWO JIMA (LPH-2), with CTG 79.4 embarked, arrived in Subic Bay on 6 January. Vehicles and personnel were debarked and a ten day REHAB/TRNG period commenced immediately. During the period 6 Jan-13 Jan CTG 79.4 and his staff supervised and coordinated the BLT 2/4 REHAB/TRNG Program and planned for HILL TOP XIX, an amphibious training exercise which was to be conducted in the Zambales Training Area in Subic Bay.

On 13 January CG III MAF requested ARG/SLF ALFA return to I CTZ waters as soon as possible and not later than 17 COMSEVENTHELT concurred in the request and an immediate re-embarkation of BLT 2/4 commenced. Colonel B. F. MEYERS rolling d Colonel J. A. CONWAY as CTG 79.4 on 14 January in an informal ceremony. CTG 79.4, with staff planners from TG 79.4/76.4, departed for RVN by aircraft on 14 January in order . to attend a planning conference at the III MAF Command Post. HILL TOP XIX was cancelled and all ARG/SLF ALFA ships were underway for RVN by 15 January. On 15 January CTG 79.4, with the planning staffs of TG 79.4/76.4, made liaison visits with the 3D MARDIV at Dong Ha and with the 26th Marines at Khe Sanh. COMSEVENTHELT issued an initiating directive for Operation BALLISTIC ARMOR at 1523187Z. The USS IWO JIMA, with TG 79.4 embarked, arrived in the I CTZ waters late in the evening of 16 January.

Because of the tense situation ashore during the Vietnamese New Year Celebration (TET), ARG/SLF ALFA was directed to remain off the coast of northern I CTZ, beyond visible range, and be prepared to reinforce any one of a number of possible areas of employment in the event of a NVA/VC attack.

On 22 January CG III MAF requested ARG/SLF ALFA conduct an amphibious operation to land BLT 2/4 by helicopter at Camp Evans in Thua Thien Province in order to provide secruity for the Camp. Within two hours and twenty minutes the first wave of sixteen helicopters was airborne and enroute to Camp Evans as Operation BALLISTIC ARMOR commenced. An increasing volume of enemy ground fire and pilot fatigue caused the helicopter lift to cease late at night and to resume at first light on 23 January. CLF reported to CATF that BLT 2/4 (-) was firmly established ashore as of 231130H. ARG/SLF ALFA remained in support of operations ashore during the follow-on operation, NEOSHO II.

On 24 January ARG/SLF Λ LFA received a request to reconstitute SLF ALFA and to conduct an amphibious operation in the

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3D MARDIV area as soon as possible. COMSEVENTHFLT issued an initiating directive for Operation FORTRESS ATTACK at 261604Z. OPCON of BLT 2/4 (-) was passed to CTG 79.4 at 261200H and re-embarkation of BLT 2/4 was completed at 261830H, five hours and fifteen minutes after it had begun. Operation FORTRESS ATTACK commenced at 270930H with the landing of leading elements of BLT 2/4 in the 9th Marines Area of Operations. CTG 79.4 reported selected elements of SLF ALFA were firmly established ashore and simultaneously passed OPCON of BLT 2/4 (-) to CG III MAF at 271500H.

ARG/SLF ALFA remained in support of operations ashore

during the remainder of the month of January.

1. OFNERAL

- a. Operation WALLISTIC ARMOR was a unilateral amphibious operation using helicopters to land the Landing Force. The operation included support of a follow-on "in country" operation. Inclusive dates of BALLISTIC ARMOR were 22-26 January 1968. The operation was conducted in accordance with NWP-22(B).
- b. Operation NEOSHO II was a continuing search and destroy operation being conducted by the 1st Marines in THUA THIEN Province northwest of the city of HUE. BLT 2/5(-) was under the operational control of the CO 1st Marines during their participation in this operation. BLT 2/4 (-) was given a mission of providing security for CAMP EVANS (vic YD534315) while one company remained in I Corps Reserve, embarked aboard ARG/SLF shipping.
- c. Operation BALLISTIC APMOR/NEOSPO II was conducted in the PHONG DIEN District of THUA THIEN Province.
- d. The operation commenced with the landing of BLT 2/4(-) by helicopter at 221530F. Operational Control of PLT 2/4(-) was passed to CG III MAF at 231130H.
- e. The Commander, Task Group 79.4, embarked aboard ARG/SLF shipping, retained operational control of HMM-361 and provided helicopter, medical and limited logistic support for BLT 2/4 during operation NEOSHO II.
- f. Operation BALLISTIC ARMOR was terminated by the Commander, U. S. Seventh Fleet on 26 January 1968.

3. INTELLIGENCE

a, Terrain, The Amphibious Phiestive Amon (ACA) is located in the rolling hills and flat office puth and wet of the Song C (a); piver, The Song O Lau Piver use yest to east through the middle of the ACA. Drainage is from the west to the east on the flat plains. The hills are covered with short elephant grass to secondary forest in the ACA and the area immediately surrounding the ACA. The most prominent terrain feature in the vicinity is Hill 674 which over looks the ACA.

b. Fnemy Situation,

(1) General. Intelligence prior to the operation indicated that there were no large enemy units in or around the immediate area that the BLT was to occupy. Combined strength of the enemy units in the general area was 8000 to 10,000 NVA troops with supporting elements.

4. MISSION.

a. BALLISTIC APMOP. As directed by COMSEVENTERIN 1523187 Jan 68 (Initiating Directive), the mission assigned to CATE and CLE was to "conduct a search and destroy amphibious operation against VC/NVA forces in the mission assigned area in QUANG TRI Province of I CTV or other operations as agreed upon with CG III MAF or his designated representative."

h. MYONIO II. As mutually acreed between COT and CO in MAR. Selected elements of SLF ALFA were chopped to CG III MAR. CATF remained in support of operations ashore.

5. CONCEPT OF OPENATION .

a. Operation PALIFFIC ARMOR was to be a unilateral amphibious operation conducted against VC/NVA forces located near CAMP FVANS (vic 534315) northwest of the city of HDE

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(see operations overlay, enclosure (4) to the basic letter). The operation was to be conducted in two phases.

- (1) Phase I was to earlier of the other-borne amphibious landing of three rife commander (rin), Ptry W/3/12, and the Neba Command Group into L7 Lemon (YD534315) and be prepared to effect the relief of the 1st Battalion, 9th Marines and to assume responsibility for the security of CAMP FVANCE the remaining units of the BLT were to be prepared to land by either helicepter or assault craft as directed.
- (2) Phase II was to be an amphibious withdrawal of BLT 2/4(-) from RVN soil to the ARG/SLF shipping.
- b. TG 76.4/79.4 were to provide helicopter and limited logistic support to BLT 2/4 during any follow-on operations a shore.

6. EXECUTION.

a. BALLISTIC ARMOR.

- (1) Operation BALLISTIC ARMOR was executed in accordance with CTG 76.4 Operation Order 317-68 and CTG 79.4 OP PLAN 120A-(YP) supplemented by CTG 79.4 frag orders for operations in the ambhibious objective area.
- (2) The Initiating Directive was issued by COMSEVENTHELT prior to a recific objective being assigned in order to allow the ARG/SLF to assume a quick reaction posture. This quick reaction capability was specifically required during the tense period just prior to the TET (Vietnamese New Year) Celebration.
- (3) At 221245H CATF and CLF received a request for a proposed amphibious landing of ARG/SLF ALFA at CAMP EVANS.
- (4) CATF, in coordination with CLF, promulgated a proposed AOA for the operation at 221330H.
- (5) At 221419 concurrence was received from COMSEVENTHELT on the proposed amphibious operation.
- (6) At 221420H CATF, in coordination with CLF, submitted the concept of operations and requested that an "in country" commander be designated to control all supporting arms in the AOA.

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- (7) The first helicopter wave departed the USS IWO JIMA at 221505H and touched some in the landing zone at 221530H.
- (8) Helicopter operations were secured at 222237H due to excessive flying hours for the pilots coupled with darkness and receipt of enemy small arms, automatic weapons and 50 caliber machine gun fire.
- (9) Helicopter operations were resumed at 230730H and the remainder of BLT 2/4(-) was landed at CAMP EVANS.
- (10) BLT 2/4(-) was chopped to CG III MAF at 231130H, and TG 76.4/79.4 remained in support of operations ashore.
- b. NEOSHO II. During this "in country" operation, TG 79.4 provided helicopter, medical, and limited logistic support for BLT 2/4(-).
- c. Phase II of Operation BALLISTIC ARMOR commenced at 261315H. The amphibious withdrawal was completed and all BLT 2/4 units, less one security squad were aboard ARG/SLF AIFA shipping by 261830H. http://doi.org/10.1001/10.
- 7. RESULTS, See enclosures (2) and (3).
- 8. COMMANDER'S ANALYSIS. This analysis is limited to matters at the TG 79.4 level. The BLT and HMM Commander's analysis are included in their reports, enclosures (2) and (3) respectively.

u. <u>Planning</u>.

- (1) On 13 January 1960, CG III MAF requested that ARG/blar ALTA cut short their training/rehabilitation period and oroceou to RVN as soon as possible. COMSEVENTHFLT concurred with the request and CTG 79.4, with planning staff and representatives of CTG 76.4, returned to RVN in order to attend briefings and planning conferences on 1 Jan 1968.
- (2) The "in country" situation was tense and CTG 79.4 was informed to prepare for possible employment at any one of a number of possible areas.

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- (3) Concurrent planning was conducted by FG 79.4 and TG 76.4 staffs in order to accomplish as much advance planning as was possible without being assigned a specific objective.
- (4) CTG 79.4 and various members of his staff made daily liaison visits with members of the 3d MAR DIV staff for updating of the situation as it existed ashare prior to the operation.
- (5) Due to the nature of situation and the uncertainty of a specific area of employment in special arrangements were made for area studies special intelligence studies and aerial photographs. Current intelligence information was acquired on a daily basis by attending 3d MAR DIV intelligence briefings.
- (6) Radic frequencies were obtained on a tentative basis but the Communication Operating Instruction (COI) was not published prior to the operation.
- (7) Tenative arrangements were made for augmented helicopter support in the form of armed UH-1E's for help escort and CH-53's or CH-46's for heavy lift requirements.
- (8) Due to the rapid reaction remainment, no prior logistics liaison was conducted. CTG 79.4 OP PLAN 120A-(YR) provided immediate logistic instructions for use during the operation. The CAMP EVANS LSA had been used by SLF BLT's in previous operations and it was determined that resupply support would originate from there.
- (9) Arrangements were made with the 1st Marines to assume responsibility for fire support coordination during the amphibious operation.
- (10) The ACA was discussed, agreed upon, and command relationships were finalized.
- (11) Establishment of a SIF limison team with the "in country" commander who would noise OPCON of BLT 2/4 was discours.
- (12) Additional planning conferences were attended by CTG 79.4 and various staff officers throughout the poeted during Operation SALLISTIC CHON/NOONO II.
 - b. Command Pelationships.
 - (1) Operation BALLISTIC ARMOR was a unilateral

amphibious operation with command relationships in accordance with NWP-22(B). Responsibility for control and coordination of supporting arms was passed to an "in country" commander during the ship to shore movement. CLF reported the Landing Force firmly established ashore on 23 January. OPCON of BLT $2/\mu(-)$ was chopped to an "in country" commander during the operation.

- (2) At 231130H CTG 79.4 chopped OPCON of BLT 2/4(-) to CG III MAF (CTG 79.4 220344Z Jan 68). CG III MAF simultaneously passed OPCON of PLT 2/4(-) to CG 3d MAF DIV (CG III MAF 221544Z Jan 68) and CG 3d MAR DIV chopped OPCON of BLT 2/4(-) to the CO 1st Marines concurrently. OPCON of HMM-361 remained under CTG 79.4 during Operation BALLISTIC ARMOR/NEOSHO II. Operation BALLISTIC ARMOR was terminated on 26 January and OPCON of PLT 2/4(-) was returned to CTG 79.4 at 261200H (CG III MAF 251626Z Jan 68).
- c. Enemy Contact. There was no significant contact during the amphibious landing of BLT 2.1.1.1 into the CAMP EVANS area. HMM-361 helicopters received light to moderate small arms, automatic weapons and 50 caliber machine gun fire during the hours of darkness on 22 January.

d. Supporting Arms.

(1) Two UH-IE (armed) helicopters provided approach and retirement lane escort during the troop lift. No other supporting arms were planned for or used during the ship to shore movement.

(2) All supporting arms were the responsibility of the 1st Marines FSCC.

e. Logistics.

- (1) To provide the necessary coordination of supply support for the BLT, the Shore Party Detachment was assigned to the CAMP FVANS ISA under the supervision of the 1st Marines,
- (2) The three rifle companies. 106mm RR Plt, 81mm mortar plt and the 4.2" mortar battery landed with a class V prescribed load of B/A plus 1-DOA. This quantity of ammunition proved to be excessive for the operation. An adequate class V supply was already on hand in the CAMP EVANS LSA.
 - (3) No major logistic problems existed.

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- (4) The USS IWO JIMA was designated the Primary Casualty Evacuation Receiving Station.
- (5) No maintenance problems were incurred during the operation.
- f. Casualty Reporting. Casualty reporting was conducted in accordance with current directives. The 9th MAB CRCC-AIFA was located aboard the USS IWO JIMA (LPH-2), which was designated the Primary Casualty Evacuation Receiving Ship. BLT 2/4 and TG 79.4 casualty representatives were positioned at "A" Co. 3d Medical Bn. Thu Bai. SVE to collect and pass on to the 9th MAB CRCC-ALFA, information of special Landing Force ALFA casualties.

g. Civic Action. No civic action program was conducted due to the area of operation and the operational commitments.

h. ISO. A photographer and journalist were sent ashore with BLT 2/4 to provide informational services coverage.

i. Communications.

(1) Communications were established in accordance with CMC 79.4 37 Plan 120-67 and with the COI issued separately. A message center was maintained affoat in conjunction with the USS IVO JITA Naval Communications Center with CTG 79.4 assuming communications guard for BLT 2/4 and HMM-361. The following nets were entered or established during operation BALLISTIC ARMOR/NEOSHO II,

(a) III MAF PAC $\neq 2$ CTG 79.4 entered this net (RATT, Orestes, 60 WPM) and maintained direct communications with III MAF and 3d Mar Div.

- (b) 3RD MAP DIV TAC #1 CTG 79.4 entered this net maintaining covered (Nestor) communications with 3rd Marine Division.
- (c) SLF TAC #1
 (1) CTG 79.4 established a net with liaison personnel in the field. An AN/MRC-110 radio jeep with a secure voice capability was placed at CAMP EVANS which relayed traffic to battalion personnel and to a Med Rep located at Alfa Med, Phu Bai. This net was used for situation, spot, casualty and administrative reporting, as well as being used for Med-Evac requests.
- (2) During the initial landing a number of problems were encountered with the frequencies allocated. One of the problems was mutual interference, as frequencies assigned to TG 79.4 were being used by units operating in the same area. Most problems were encountered because of the urgency of the landing, which precluded proper frequency assignment and coordination. Communications during the operation ranged from very good to fair.
- 9. The following comments are included on the subordinate commander's combat after action reports:
 - a. BLT 2/4 After Action Report (enclosure 2):
- (1) Paragraph 13 concerns the establishment of an "emergency radio frequency block" that would be available for each area that was being considered for BLT employment. Operationally the recommendation is sound and would alleviate many of the problems encountered during the initial stages of this operation. However, in reality, the VHF frequency spectrum is so crowded throughout I CTZ that no frequencies exist that are available for assignment to the recommended "emergency block". Mutual interference among radios and frequency coordination continue to be major problem areas for SLF operations.
 - b. HMM-361 After Action Report (enclosure 3). None.

NARRATIVE SUMMARY

As the month of February began, the majority of BLT 2/4(-) (Command Group ALFA, Companies E, F, and G) were OPCON to the Fourth Marines participating in Operation LANCASTER II. H/3/12 was located at Dong Ha and W/3/12 was located at A-3. Both artillery batteries were under OPCON of 2/12. Co H and 1st Plt, Co A, 5th AT Bn were OPCON to the Ninth Marines participating in Operation KENTUCKY. 1st Plt, Co A, 5th Tank Bn was OPCON to BLT 3/1 participating in Operation SALINE. 4th Plt, Co B, 1st AmTrac Bn was OPCON to 1st AmTrac Bn participating in Operation NAPOLEON. HMM-361 continued in support of CTG 79.4.

The month of February was characterized by marginal weather conditions causing reduction in the amount of helicopter support which could be provided.

During the evening hours of 6-9 Feb the IWO JIMA acted as Helo Haven for Marble Mountain CH-53's. During the period when the IWO JIMA was absent from the vicinity of the Cua Viet River mouth med evac responsibility for BLT 2/4(-) was assumed by CG Third MarDiv.

On 10 Feb the exchange of HMM-361 to Marble Mountain and HMM-363 to CTG 79.4 began. The move was completed on 11 Feb. HMM-363 began day and night pilot carrier quals on 11 Feb.

During the month of February BLT 2/4(-) provided security for the Khe Gio Bridge and the bridge at YD 043566; conducted road security along Route Nine between Khe Gio Bridge and YD 043566; provided a reactionary force for the defense of Camp Carroll; and conducted extensive patrolling and ambush activities to deny the enemy access to the area south of the Cam Lo River.

NARRATIVE SUMMARY

As the month of March began, the majority of RET 2/4(-) were Opcon to the Fourth Marines participating in Operation LANCASTER II. H/3/12 was located at Dong Ha and W/3/12 was located at Camp Carroll. Both artillery batteries are Opcon to 3/12. 1st Plat, Co A, 5th AT Bn was Opcon to the Ninth Marines participating in Operation KENTUCKY. 1st Plat, Co A, 5th Tank Bn was Opcon to BLT 3/1 participating in Operation NAPOLEON. HMM-363 continued in support of CTG 79.4. The month of March continued to produce marginal weather conditions causing reduction in the amount of helicopter support which could be provided. On 3 March in response to a verbal warning order by CG Third MarDiv, CTG 79.4 and planning staff conducted liaison with CTG 79.5 and CO's Third and Fourth Marines to plan exchange of BLF 2/4 and BLT 3/1 AO's. On 4 March BLT 2/4 and BLT 3/1 commenced exchange of forces, Co G, H and a portion of the Comd Group moved, and exchanged positions with two companies of BLT 3/1, the remainder of BLT exchange to be completed on 5 March. Two companies of BLT 3/1 were helo-lifted by HMM-363 to Camp Carroll during the initial exchange of units and AO's. On 5 March BLT 2/4(-) continued participation in Operation NAPOLEON/ SALINE II and terminated participation in Operation LANCASTER II. BLT 2/4(-) assigned mission is to clear the north bank of the Cua Viet River to allow safe and uninterrupted passage from the Cua Viet River mouth to Dong Ha, to deny the "Jones Creek" drainage system (a known infiltration route) to the enemy and to conduct search and destroy operations in the assigned AO. On 6 March between 0145H and 0420H companies E and F, in vic of YD 306650 and YD 280667, respectively, received approximately ninety rounds of mortar and artillery fire, followed by two significant enemy probes initiated utilizing S/A, RPG, and machine gums. Counter-... battery fire was called for and units alerted for ground attack engaged the enemy with S/A's resulting in eleven NVA KIA and eleven weapons captured. This was the first significant contact in the new AO.

The period from 7 March - 14 March was characterized by company size search and destroy missions and sweeps, in the Lam Xuan (east), Lam Xuan (west), and Nhi Ha areas to the north and the Vinh Quan Ha, Vin Quon Thuong areas to the west of the Mai Xai Chanh combat operating base established by BLF 2/4(-) on the Cua Viet River. Significant contact was made in each of these villages and produced large quantities of arms and ammunition. The 4.2 inch mortar battery W/3/12 moved from Camp Carroll to Mai Xai Chanh and relieved in place the W/2/12 battery that was in direct support of BLF 3/1. BLT 2/4 s own tank and amphibian tractor plateons were in direct support of the BLT during this period but remained under the Opeon of the First Amtrac Battalion. The 1st Plat, Co A, Fifth Antitank Battalion remained under the Opcon of Task Force "Robbie" throughout this month. Hotel Battery (H/3/12) remained under the Opcon of the Twelfth Marines during the month. During the remainder of this period BLT 2/4(-) conduct aggressive patrols and ambushes, maintained strong defensive positions, destroying enemy emplacements and caches and conducted MEDCAP within the AO.

1. GENERAL

- a. Operation FORTRESS ATTACK was a unilateral amphibious operation using helicopters to land the Landing Force. The operation included support of a follow-on in-country operation. FORTRESS ATTACK was commenced and OPCON passed to the in-country commander on 27 January 1968. The operation was conducted in accordance with NWP 22(B).
- b. Operation FORTRESS ATTACK commenced with the landing of BLT 2/4 (-) by helicopter at 270903H Jan 68. Operational control of BLT 2/4(-) was passed to CG III MAF at 271500H Jan 68.
- c. The Commander, Task Group 79.4, embarked aboard ARG/SLF shipping, retained operational control of HMM-361 (27 Jan = 10 Feb) and HMM-363 (10 Feb = 14 Mar) and provided helicopter, medical, and limited logistic support for BLT 2/4(-) during Operation FOn MESS ATTACK/KENTUCKY/LANCASTER II/NAPOLEON/SALINE.
- d. Operation FORTRESS ATTACK was terminated by the Commander, U.S. Seventh Fleet on 14 March 1968.
- e. Operation KENTUCKY was a continuing search and destroy operation being conducted by the Ninth Marines in QUANG TRI Province north of Cam Lo. BLT 2/4(-) was under the OPCON of the CO 9th Marines during their participation in this operation. BLT 2/4(-) was given the mission of conducting an amphibious search and destroy operation against NVA forces in the amphibious objective area in the vicinity of C-2 (YD 135645) in QUANG TRI Province and other operations as ordered.
- f. Operation Lancaster II was a continuing search and destroy operation being conducted by the 4th Marines in QUANG TRI Province in the vicinity of Camp Carroll. BLT 2/4(-) was under the OPCON of the CO 4th Marines during their participation in this operation. BLT 2/4(-) was given the mission of providing the security of Khe Gio Bridge (vic YD 026562), the bridge vic YD 042566, and Route Nine between the two bridges.
- g. Operation NAPOLEON/SALINE was a continuing search and destroy operation being conducted by the 3rd Marines in QUANG TRI Province in the vicinity of the Cua Viet River. BLT 2/4(-) was under the OPCON of the CO 3rd Marines during their participation in this operation. BLT 2/4(-) was given the mission of securing the northwest bank from NVA interdiction and infiltration from vicinity YD 266635 to vicinity YD 310682.

3. INTELLIGENCE

a. Terrain. The Amphibious Objective Area (AOA) is located in the northern portion of OUNG TRI Province, RVN. The specific area is bounded on the east by Highway #1, on the south by the Mieu Giang and Cam Lo Rivers, on the west by grid line YD 09 and on the north by grid line YD 71. The principal drainage media are the Mieu Giang and Cam Lo Rivers in the south. Except for the strip of rice cultivation in the southeastern portion of the AOA the landscape is characterized by gently rolling hills, these areas are open, seasonally inundated fields which are surrounded by dikes, often lined with hedgerows. The central portion is covered with dense to open broadleaf evergreen, secondary forest and brush, and some cultivated dry crops, and grassland. Towards the west, grassland and brush, with some light forest prevail. The most prominent terrain feature is Hill 158 at coordinates YD 114701.

b. Enemy Situation.

(1) General. Intelligence prior to the operation indicated that the 803rd Regiment, the 27th Independent MF Battalion, two unidentified units of company and battalion size and the Cam Lo LF Company were operating in the AOA. All of those units have the capability of reinforcing one another. All of the above units can be supported by the Van An Artillery Regiment located north of the Ben Hai River and the 164th Artillery Regiment located below the DMZ northwest of Con Thien. Combined strength of these forces totaled approximately 3,000.

4. MISSION

As directed by COMSEVENTHFLT 251604Z Jan 68 (Initiating Directive), the mission assigned to CATF and CLF was commencing O/A 27 Jan 68, conduct a search and destroy amphibious operation against VC/NVA forces in Amphibious Objective Area vic C-2 position (YD 135645) in QUANG TRI Province and operations as agreed upon with CG III MAF or his designated representative.

5. CONCEPT OF OPERATIONS

- a, Commencing at L-Hour on D-Day, selected assault elements BLT 2/4 are helicopter-borne into LZ Ash (Alternate LZ Fir) and artillery batteries into predesignated positions provided by 12th Marines. Heavy combat support and support equipment to be surface landed as directed.
- b BLT 2/4: starting at L-Hour on D-Day, three rifle co's (Rein) and Alfa Command Group are helicopter-borne into LZ Ash. Btry W/3/12 is helicopter-borne into positions via 172723 (A-3 position). Btry W/3/12 is helicopter-borne into positions via YD 228598 (Dong Ha). One Co to remain as SLF reserve. Prepare for initial employment in C-2 area via (YD 135645). Tank, antitank, and LVT plats to be surface landed on order. BLT comdr will recommend time of commitment of SLF reserve upon completion of landing of assault elements.
- c. Ham-361 to provide helicopter support for movement of BLF 2/4 and required SLF ALFA comm equipment/personnel. Provide observation/fire suppression as required from avail helo augmentation.
- d. Hotel Co 2/4 (Rein) was designated SLF reserve. Prepared for employment as ordered, maintain Sparrow Hawk plat, anticipate their commitment upon completion of held lift of BLT 2/4 into LZ Ash.

6. EXECUTION

a. FORTRESS ATTACK.

(1) Operation FORTRESS ATTACK was executed in accordance with CTG 79.4 Operation Order No. 1 (DTG 261350Z Jan 68) and CTG 79.4 OP PLAN 120-(YR) supplemented by CTG 79.4 frag orders for operations in the amphibious objective area.

- (2) The Initiating Directive was issued by COMSEVENIFLT prior to a specific objective being assigned in order to allow the ARG/SLF to assume a quick reaction posture.
- (3) At 241540Z Jan 68 CATF and CLF received a request for a proposed amphibious landing of SLF ALFA units at C-2 area.
- (4) CATF, in coordination with CLF, promulgated a proposed AOA for the operation at 2608262 Jan 68.
- (5) At 260826H Jan 68, CATF, in coordination with CLF, submitted the concept of operations and requested an in-country commander be designated to control all supporting arms in the AOA.
- (6) At 261108Z Jan 68 concurrence was received from COMSEVENTH-FLT on the proposed amphibious operation.
- (7) The first helicopter wave departed the USS IWO JIMA at 0900H and touched down in the landing zone at 270926H.
- (8) BLT 2/4(-) was chopped to CG III MAF at 271500H Jan 68, and IG 76.4/79.4 remained in support of operations ashore.
- b. KENFUCKY. During this in-country operation, IG 79.4 provided helicopter, medical, and limited logistic support for BLT 2/4(-).
 - c. LANCASTER II. (Same as KENTUCKY).
 - d. NAPOLEON/SALINE. (Samo as KENTUCKY).
- 7. RESULTS. See enclosures (2) through (4).
- 8. <u>COMMANDER'S ANALYSIS</u>. This analysis is limited to matters at the TG 79.4 level. The BLT and HMM Commanders' analyses are included in their reports, onclosures (2) through (4).

a. Planning.

- (1) On 22 January 1968 CG, III MAF held an intelligence briefing at his CP for CIG 79.4 and CIF 76.4 representatives. No firm concept emerged, but the possibilities were discussed.
- (2) SLF/ARG planners continued to visit Third MarDiv on a daily basis to keep abreast of the changing tactical situation.
- (3) On 25 Jan 1968 CTG 79.4 and representatives of CTF 76.4 made liaison visits to Third Marine Division, 1st Marine Regiment, and 9th Marine Regiment to coordinate planning for a proposed operation in . the C-2 area to commonce on the 27th of January 1968. Planners returned to Third Marine Division CP the following day and the planning for Operation FORTRESS ATTACK commenced.
- (4) The planning continued through the issuance of the final order on 26 January 1968. During the planning phase the following steps were accomplished:

 ENCLOSURE (1)

- (a) Intelligence was obtained from current INISUMS, area studies, and by liaison with in-country units. Maps were issued by CFG 79.4. No interpretor or interrogator/translator support was available.
- (b) Radio frequencies were obtained on a tentative basis but the Communication Operating Instruction (COI) was not published prior to the operation.
- (c) Arangements were made for augmented helicopter support in the form of armed UH-LE's for helo escort and CH-53's and CH-46's for heavy lift requirements.
- (d) Due to rapid reaction requirements no prior logistics liaison was conducted. CTG 79.4 OPlan 120A-(YR) provided immediate logistic instructions for use during the operation. An ISA was established within the Dong Ha Combat Base and that all resupply support would originate from there.
- (e) Arrangements were made with the Ninth Marines to assume responsibility for Fire Support Coordination. This was to be coordinated by the Third Marine Division.
- (f) The AOA was discussed, a greed upon, and command relationships were finalized.
- (g) Establishment of a SLF liaison team with the "in-country" commander who would exercise OPCON of SLT 2/4 was discussed and finalized.

b. Command Relationships.

- (1) Operation FORTRESS ATEACK was a unilateral amphibious operation with command relationships in accordance with NeP 22(B). Responsibility for control and coordination of supporting arms was passed to an in-country commander during the ship-to-shore movement. CLF reported the Landing Force firmly established ashore on 271500H January. OPCON of BLT 2/4(-) was chopped to an in-country commander during the operation.
- (2) At 271500H CTG 79.4 chopped OPCON of BLT 2/4(-) to CG III MAF (CTG 76.4 270736Z Jan 68). CG III MAF simultaneously passed OPCON of BLT 2/4(-) to CG 3rd MarDiv (CG III MAF 280224Z Jan 68) and CG.3d MarDiv chopped OPCON of BLT 2/4(-) to the CO 9th Harines. OPCON of HMM-361 remained under CTG 79.4 during Operation FORTRESS ATTACK/KENTUCKY/LANCASTER II/NAPOLEON/SALINE. Operation FORTRESS ATTACK was terminated 14 Harch 1963 (CC SEVENTHELT 121306Z Apr 68).
- c. Enemy Contact. There was no significant contact during the amphibious landing of BLT 2/4(-) into the C-2 area. HMM-361 helicopters reported three fire incidents during the afternoon resupply but no aircraft damage resulted.

d. Supporting Arms.

(1) Two UH-IE (armed) helicopters provided approach and retire-

ment lane escort during the trooplift. No other supporting arms were planned for or used during the ship-to-shore movement.

(2) Third Marine Division provided coordination for fire support in AOA and approach and retirement lanes.

e. Logistics.

(1) Planning.

- a. Prior to the commencement of Operation FORTRESS ATTACK, liaison was established with the 3rd MarDiv to coordinate logistic requirements.
- b. It was determined that the 3rd MarDiv (9th M.R) would immediately assume operational control of the BLT upon arrival in-country. In-country supply sources would be available from FLSG BRAVO. The BLT LSA would be established in Dong Ha.
- c. BLT 2/4 operations stocks afloat would be made available as required.

(2) Execution.

- a. To provide for the necessary coordination of supply support, the BLT Shore Party Team was initially positioned at the Dong Ha LSA on D-Day.
- b. During this operation (27 Jan 14 Mar 1968) the BLT was under operational control of a number of Marine Regiments and operated from Camp Carroll northeast of Dong Ha and from the Cua Viet River region. The BLT LSA was relocated from Dong Ha to the 1st AMTRAC BN area at the mouth of the Cua Viet River when the BLT finally shifted its operation to that area. A Shore Party Liaison Team remained in the Dong Ha area to facilitate the transfer of supplies from FLSG BRAVO to the new LSA site and/or direct to the BLT position.
- c. No insurmountable problems in re-supply were encountered. LFORM Class III, IV and V supplies were made available when critical needs existed.
- d. The USS IWO JIMA was designated the Primary Casualty Receiving Ship (PCRS). Casualty liaison representatives from the BLT were positioned at Co D, 3rd MED BN, Dong Ha. Due to the distance involved in evacuating casualties directly to the PCRS when the BLT moved to the Camp Carroll area, the 3d Medical Bn facility was primarily utilized.
- e. In-country maintenance facilities were available at FLSG BRAVO, however, both combat damage and required 3rd/4th echelon maintenance precipitated seaward evacuation, by ARG shipping to FLC, Da Nang, of one (1) M48A3 tank and two (2) LVTP5's. Numerous portable items were evacuated to FLG Da Nang where repair could not be accomplished at FLSG BRAVO.

f. Casualty Reporting. Casualty reporting was conducted in accordance with current directives. The 9th M.B CRCC-ALFA was located aboard the USS IWO JIMA (LPH-2), which was designated the Primary Casualty Receiving Ship. BLT 2/4 and FG 79.4 casualty representatives were positioned at CO "D", 3rd Medical Bn, Dong Ha, RVN to collect and pass casualty information concerning Special Landing Force ALFA personnel on to the 9th MAB CRCC-ALFA.

g. <u>Civic Action</u>. No civic action program was conducted due to the area of operation and the operational commitments.

(1) III MAF Cmd #2 (HF/RATT)

CIG 79.4 entered this net (ORESTES-60 WFM) and maintained direct communications with III MAF, 3d MarDiv and CIG 79.5.

*All enemy casualties were reported to Ninth Marines, (KENTUCKY) Fourth Marines (LANCASTER II) or Third Marines (NAPOLEON/SALINE)

h. ISO. A photographer and journalist were sent ashore with BLF 2/4 to provide informational services coverage.

i. Communications. Communications were established IAW CTG 79.4 OP Plan 120-67 and with the COI's issued separately. A message center was maintained afloat in conjunction with the USS IWO JIMA Naval Communication Center with CTG 79.4 assuming communications guard for BLF 2/4 and HMM-361/363. The following nets were entered or established during Operation FORTRESS ATTACK.

(2) 3d MarDiv TAC #2 (VHF)

CTG 79.4 entered this net maintaining covered (NESTOR) communications with 3d MarDiv, 3d Marines, 4th Marines, 9th Marines and CTG 79.5.

(3) SLF TAC #1 (VHF)

CTG 79.4 established this net with SLF ALFA liaison personnel in the field. Stations on this net were located at Dong Ha (3d MarDiv/9th Mar and Delta Med), Camp Carroll and with BLT 2/4 (at Camp Carroll/Cua Viet). An MRC-110 with KY-8 equipment was initially positioned in the 3d MarDiv/9th Marines area while AN/PRC-25's were utilized at the other positions. The MRC-110 was later positioned at the 3d Marines CP and finally in the BLT 2/4 CP to better satisfy the existing communications requirements. This net was used for situation, spot, casualty and administrative reporting as well as for Med-evac requests.

(4) SLF TAC #2 (HF)

Long range communications were needed frequently when the USS IWO JIMA moved to the Danang area to act as a Helo Haven, and also during certain Unrep conditions. An AN/MRC-83 (provided by BLT 2/4) was positioned with the AN/MRC-110 at Dong Ha and later with BLT 2/4 on the Cua Viet to provide HF communications between the ship and the in-country units. This net proved to be invaluable for backup to the VHF nets particularly so when both radios in the MRC-110 went out at the BLT 2/4 position.

Outstanding cooperation was provided by 3d MarDiv, 3d Marines, 4th Marines, 9th Marines and CTG 79.5 in relaying traffic to and from BLT 2/4 when the SLF could not contact the BLT over internal nets. Direct coordination was effected by the SLF Communication Officer with the Communication Officers of these units; the willingness of all units to give every possible assistance was outstanding.

Problems

- a. Difficulties in maintaining communications were minimal but persistent. The usual VHF frequency interference was a comstant problem, however, by trial and re-trial it was possible to come up with fairly consistent and reliable frequencies for both daytime and night-time operations. Distances in excess of 20 miles between the ship and the land station make VHF communications uncertain and unreliable. KY-8 operation at this distance is impossible unless the signal is excessively strong.
- b. This Headquarters was without the effective editions of the KaC-PX Operations Code during the period 11-12 March 68 due to the BLT displacing ashore and not issuing the SLF its copies prior to displacing. This problem was purely an oversight on the part of the BLT and will be closely watched on future BLT displacements from the ship. In the near future III MAF will issue all codes and keylists direct to the SLF vice 9th MAB and 3d MarDiv (via the BLT) which will preclude this same problem from happening again.

NARRATIVE SUMMARY

During April BLT 2/4 continued its participation in Operation NAPOLEON/SALINE under the OPCON of the Third Marines. BLT 2/4(-) assigned mission continued to be to keep the north bank of the Cus Viet River clear to allow the safe flow of naval logistic traffic. Further, it is to deny the "Jones Creek" drainage system (a known infiltration route) to the enemy and to conduct search and destroy operations in the assigned AO.

As the month progressed, the mission of pacification grew in importance as thousands of Vietnamese Nationals moved back into the AO. MEDCAPS were conducted and three Popular Forces platoons trained with the BLT in general military subjects and small unit

tactics.

H/3/12 was located at Dong Ha and was OPCON to the 12th Marines. W/3/12 was located at the BLT CP at Mai Xa Chanh and was OPCON to 3/12.

BLT 8/4. 1st Platoon, Co A, 5th AT Bn remained under the OPCON of Task Force Robbie. 1st Platoon, Co A, 5th Tank Bn was OPCON to BLT 2/4. 4th Platoon, Co B, 1st Amtrac Bn remained OPCON to 3d Amtrac Bn.

The first two days of April, the BLT was assigned as part of Operation TASK FORCE KILO, an operation that swept to the southern boundary of the DMZ. A night attack that involved the maneuver elements of the battalion on 27-28 April was a highlight of the month; this operation was nicknamed NIGHTOWL.

Generally, contact was light during the month until 30 April. After a three day battle (30 April - 2 May) in a village complex just outside the southwestern corner of the AO, it was realized that the

- enemy had been fortifying this complex for a long period.

HMM-363 and HMM-362 exchanged locations between the USS IWO JIMA and Phu Bai Air Facility on 15 April. Poor flying conditions prevailed through the first half of the month. The embarked UH-34D squadron continued to support BLT 2/4 by making admin, logistic, liaison, and medevac flights in support of Operation NAPOLEON/SALINE. Additionally, limited helo augmentation was provided to in-country commanders throughout the month.

NARRATIVE SUMMARY

Special Landing Force ALFA participated in Operation Fortress Attack II/Napoleon/Saline from 1 May to 190001H May. The remainder of the month was spent enroute to Subic Bay, R. P. where an exchange of Amphibious Ready Group shipping took place. On 31 May, Special Landing Force ALFA embarked in ARG shipping at Subic Bay for return to the coastal waters of RVN.

On 3 May Colonel A. I. THOMAS relieved LtCol Paul R. FIELDS as Commander of Special Landing Force ALFA.

During May, BLT 2/4 continued participation in Operation Napoleon/Saline under the OPCON of Third Marines. Its mission continued to be that of keeping the Cua Viet River open to logistics traffic.

The first two days of the month found the entire BLT committed in a fierce battle that commenced 30 April outside the southwestern corner of the BLT AO in the village of Dai Do. On 2 May, the NVA launched two separate counterattacks that seriously threatened the BLT positions in Dai Do. Use of artillery, naval gunfire, close air strikes, and gun ships enabled the BLT to push the NVA out of Dai Do and reopen the Cua Viet River by 3 May.

During the critical stages of the battle on 2 May, a Sparrow Hawk platoon was formed from BLT personnel affoat and SLF personnel who augmented the BLT forces at the CP and the maneuver companies.

The CO of BLT 2/4 (LtCol William WEISE) was wounded on 2 May and the BLT Sergeant Major (SgtMaj John MAINAR) was KTA on that same day. On 16 May the BLT CP, formerly known as Mai Xa Chanh, was renamed Camp Big John in honor of SgtMaj MAINAR.

Total NVA KIA during the battle of Dai Do was 537; \$ POW were captured.

Eith the heavy casualties suffered by the BLT during this action and replacements arriving daily, the BLT AO was cut to approximately two grid squares during a reorganization and training period.

Significant contact occurred on 25 May at Nhi Ha 2 (YD 284714) with what was later discovered to be an NVA battalion. Artillery and air strikes were employed extensively in this 12 hour battle. The action resulted in 241 NVA KIA and 5 POW captured.

BLT $2/\mu$ inflicted the following casualties on the NVA during May: KIA 751, 7 POW, 8 detainees.

HMM-362 continued participation in Operation Fortress Attack II/ Napoleon/Saline in support of BLT 2/4. HMM-362 offloaded from the USS Iwo Jima on 18 May to Phu Bai and were chopped to the First Marine Air Wing. An average of six aircraft were provided to the First Marine Air Wing daily for augmentation purposes beginning 9 May.



1. GENERAL

- a. Operation FORTRESS ATTACK II commenced at 270800H March 68 upon return of ARG/SLF AND A from upkeep/rehab at Subic say, R. P. An am hibious landing was not conducted to commence this Operation.
- b. BLT 2/h(-) continued to be chopped OPCON to Third Marines and participated in Operation NUFCLEON/SALINE throughout the period covered by Operation FORTRESS ATTACK II.
- c. Commander, Task Group 79.4, embarked aboard ARG/SLF shipping, retained operational control of HMM-363 (27Mar 15 Apr) and HMM-362 (15 Apr 18 May) and provided helicopter, medical, and limited logistic support for BLT 2/4(-) during Operation FORTRESS ATTACK TI/NAPON SON/SALINE.
- d. Operation NAPOLEON/SALINE was a continuing search and destroy operation being conducted by the 3rd Marines in QUANG TRI Province in the vicinity of the Cua Viet River. BLT 2/4(-) was under the OPCON of the CO 3rd Marines while participating in this operation. BLT 2/4(-) was given the mission of securing the northwest bank of the Cua Viet River from NVA interdiction and infiltration from vicinity YD 266635 to YD 318690 and deny enemy use of rocket sites in AO.

3. INTELLIGENCE

a. Terrain. The BLT Area of Operation (AO) was located in the northeastern portion of QUANG TRI Province, RVN. The specific area is bounded on the east by a line drawn approximately parallel to the coast of the Gulf of Tonkin about 2000 meters inland from that coast, on the west by grid line YD 26 and on the north by the southern line of the Demilitarized Zone. The landscape throughout the AO is

characterized by rolling said dunes interspersed with areas of rice cultivation around the villages in the area. The area is primarily open with little cover or concealment. hat little concealment that is offered is provided by hedgerous in the rice growing area and small bushy areas along the Cua Viet River and Jones Creek, a small stream running north and south from the Cua Viet River to the Ben Hai River, through the villages of Lam Luan (East And West) and Nhi Ha. The most prominent terrain feature is Hill 23 at coordinates YD 279719.

b. Enemy Situation.

(1) General. Intelligence prior to the operation indicated that the 270th Ind Reft., the 5th and 6th Battalions of the 52d Regt., 320th Inf. Division, the 3rd Battalion, 27th Ind. Regt., and the KhOO Local Force Company were operating in the AO. All of these units had the capability of supporting each other and reinforcing each other and all of these units were supported by the Van An Artillery Regiment located north of the Ben Hai River through the eastern portion of the DMM. The KhOO IF Company's primary mission in this area was to act as guides and intelligence patherers for the regular NVA units sent to operate there. One of the enemy's major infiltration routes from the DMZ south to the city of Quang Tri ran through the middle of the AO closely following the trace of Jones Creek. The combined strength of these forces was approximately 2,105 personnel.

(3) Operation's Effect on Snemy. During the month of April the enemy deployed the 320th Infantry division composed of the 48th, 52nd, and 64th Regiments into the AO or in close proximity to the AO. The mission of these units was to interdict the protection Allied Forces were giving to the rice harvest and to cut off the shipping of supplies along the Cua Viet giver thereby isolating Dong Ha. The morale of these enemy units was very high and they were well trained and equipped with exceptionally new weapons and uniforms. Once in the area, the enemy due in well and established excellent defensive positions utilizing mutually supporting bunkers with interconnecting trenches. These bunkers were capable of withstanding air strikes, artillery and naval sunfire.

- (b) At the end of April and the beginning of May, the enemy initiated a major offensive throughout the AO. In the resulting battles the enemy suffered heavy losses of men and equipment. Since that time the enemy has gotten a high percentage of new replacements. It is unlikely that these replacements are as well trained or appressive as the men who initiated the offensive at Dai Do. Prisoner of War interrogation reports indicate that the morale of the enemy is low and that his food supply is small.
- (c) Apain, on the 28th of Apr, 1968, the enemy renewed offensive action in the AO. Major units committed in this action were the 1st and 3rd Battalions of the 48th Regiment. The enemy again sustained heavy losses.
- (d) Neither the 270th Independent Regiment nor the 27th Independent Regiment were committed in strength during Operation FORTAINS ATTACK II. Poth of these units are reported to be at full strength and could be utilized to spearhead a new major offensive in the AO.

4. MI SION.

- a. FORTRESS ATTACK II. COMSEVENTHELT directed SLF/ARG ALFA to provide BLT 2/4(-) helicopter, medical, and limited logistic support during Operation NA OLEON/SALINE.
- o. NAPOLEON/SALINE. Third Marines directed BLT 2/4(-) to continue the mission of securing the northwest bank of the Cua Viet River from NVA interdiction and infiltration from vicinity YD 266635 to vicinity YD 310682.

- a. CTG 79.4 maintained a liaison net with Third Marines and BLT 2/4(-) and made daily liaison visits to Third Marines and BLT 2/4(-).
- b. The embarked squadron (HMH-363 or HMM-362) maintained a medevac standby and provided liaison, logistic, Command and Control, and admin flights. Additionally, two to six aircraft were provided daily to augment the First Marine Aircraft Ming in-country helo assets.

6. EXECUTION.

a. FORTRESS ATTACK II. Due to the support nature of this operation, execution of the mission was generally an extension of procedures used during the latter part of FORTRESS ATTACK/KENTUCKY/LANCASTER II/NAPOLEON/SALINE. BLT 2/4(-) has operated in the vicinity of the Cua Viet River since 5 March.

- b. NAFOLEON/SALINE. BIT 2/4(-) was assigned as part of Task Force Kilo, a multi-battalion operation that swept to the southern boundary of the DMZ, early in the month of April. As this operation terminated, BLT 2/4(-)'s mission returned to that of aggressive day and night operations and patrols within its AO.
- 7. NSULTS. See enclosures (2) and (3).
- 8. COMMANDER'S ANALYSIS. This analysis is limited to matters at the 76 79.4 level. The HAM Commander's Analyses are included in their reports, enclosures (2) and (3).

a. Flanning.

- (1) Since Operation FURTRESS ATTACK II did not commence with an amphibious operation, no planning, as such, was necessary or required prior to initiating the operation.
- (2) Throughout the operation continuous liaison was conducted with OPCON and supporting commands, particularly 3d MarDiv and 3d Marines, as well as BIT 2/h(-). Liaison officers were established, as required, at 3d Marines and a liaison team was continuously present at the BLT CP.

b. Command Relationships

- (1) OFCON of BLT 2/4(-) was retained by 3d Marines during the period Operation FORTHESS ATTACK II was being conducted.
- (2) OPCON of HIM-363 and HRM-362 remained under CTG 79.4 during Operation FORTRESS ATTACK II (27 Mar 15 Apr and 15 Apr 18 May, respectively).
 - c. Enemy Contact. None in peration FORTRESS ATTACK II.
 - d. Suprorting Arms. Not Applicable.
 - e. Logisites.
 - (1) Planning.
- (a) Prior to the commencement of Operation FORTRESS ATTACK II liaison was effected with III MAF and ForLogComd to reestablish the arrangements for ARG/SIF assistance to BIT 2/4 without interference with in-country channels.
- (b) BLT 2/4 was to continue under operational control of 3d MarDiv (3d Marines). The Class II supply source was to remain at ForLogComd; source of other supplies would continue to be FISG Bravo. The BLT ISA was split between Dong Ha and Cua Viet River mouth.

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(c) Access to supplies/equipment afloat and emergency access to IFORM supplies were to become available to the BLT upon arrival of ARG shipping.

(2) Execution.

- (a) During this operation BLT 2/4(-) remained under the operational control of 3d Marines and operated from Mai Xa Chanh (West) (later designated as "Camp Big John") on the north bank of the Cua Viet River at Jones Creek. Supplies were available from both Dong Ha and Cua Viet River mouth and the ISA was split between these two locations. As supply traffic on the river increased, transportation from the river mouth to Mai Xa Chenh became less readily available. Accordingly, the ISA was concentrated at Dong Ha.
- (b) Then the Guz Viet River was closed due to enemy mining, and when emergency resupply requirements arose, the BLT was resupplied by SLF ALFA helicopters lifting supplies from Dong Ha and/or ARG shipping.
- (c) No insurmountable problems in resupply were encountered. Class III, IV, and V LFORM and rations were made available when critical needs existed.
- (d) BLT 2/4 assets were used not only to supply the BLT, but also on occasion to supply adjacent U.S. Army units in the 3d Marines AO.
- (e) The USS TO JIMA was designated as Primary Casualty Receiving Ship (PCRS). Casualty liaison representatives from the SIF were positioned at Co D, 3d Med&n (Delta Med), Dong Ha. 'To enhance control of the flow of casualties, a system was developed for shifting Medevac helicopters and communication guard to the USS CIEVELAND whenever the T-O JIMA had to move beyond effective communication/reaction range. Then the flow of casualties overloaded TWO JIMA's facilities during the period 29 Apr 2 May, arrangements were made for USS VALLEY FORGE and USS REPOSE to receive the overflow.
- (f) In-country maintenance facilities were available at FLSC Bravo, however, many major items were evacuated by ARG shipping to FLC, Danang, where parts availability and facilities were better.
- f. Casualty Reporting. Casualty reporting was conducted in accordance with current directives. The 9th MAB CRCC ALFA was located aboard the USS IWO JIMA (LEH-2), which was designated the Frimary Casualty Receiving Ship. BLT 2/h and TG 79.h casualty representatives were positioned at Co "D", 3d Medical Bn, Dong Ha, RVN to collect and pass casualty information concerning Special Landing Force ALFA personnel on to the 9th MAB CRCC ALFA.

- g. Civic Action. No civic action program was conducted due to the area of operation and the operational commitments.
- h. ISO. A photographer and journalist were sent ashore with BLT 2/4 to provide informational services coverage.
- i. Communications. Communications were established IAU CTG 79.4 OP Plan 120A+(YR) and TG 79.4 COI dtd 28 Mar 68. A messa; e center was maintained affoat in conjunction with the USS IMO JIMA Naval Communications Center; CTG 79.4 maintained message distribution responsibility for BLT 2 and HEM-363/362. The following nets were established/entered during Operation FORTRESS ATTACK II:

(1) 3d MarDiy TAC #2 (VHF)

CTG 79.4 entered this net establishing communications (covered uncovered) with 3d MarDiv, 3d Marines, 9th Marines, 26th Marines, CTG 79.5 and 1st AmTrac Bn.

(2) SIF TAC #1 (VHF)

CTG 79.4 established this net with SLF ALFA liaison personnel in the field. Equipment and personnel were utilized in the same manner as for Operation FO-CTRESS ATTACK. Liaison stations were established in the following manner:

- (a) Delta Med (Dong Ha) utilizing PRC-25 and RC-292.
- (b) BLT 2/4 CP (Mai Xa Chanh) utilizing MRC-83, MRC-110, PRC-25, PRC-h7 and RC-292. The MRC-110 was moved to the 3d Marines CP for approximately one neek during the operation/sweep north of the Cun Viet (Task Force Kilo); this was done to facilitate more rapid transmission

of reports to the SIF Hqtrs coming direct to the 3d Marines CP from the field. The FRC-25 was utilized at the BIT 2/4 CP location whenever possible to relieve the strain on the MRC-110 radio vehicle. The MRC-110 was used extensively for passing traffic in the covered mode. This net was used for situation, spot, casualty and administrative reporting as well as for Med-Evac requests.

(3) SLF TAC #2 (HF)

This net was activated when SIF TAC #1 was non-operational due to distance factors or equipment outages. The MRC-83 assigned to the SIF liaison team by BIT 2/4 was deadlined after approximately two weeks operation and was unavailable for SIF liaison team use for the remainder of Operation FORTRESS ATTACK II. The MRC-83 used by the BIT 2/4 S-4 was available when needed for passing traffic back to the SIF Hqtrs. Repeated attempts were made to utilize the PRC-h7's on this net, however, communications via this means was unsatisfactory due to the non-availability of operational BB-451 batteries.

Operations codes were used extensively for passing classified and unclassified traffic when out of range for KY-8 utilization.

Outstanding cooperation was again provided by 3d Markiv, 3d Marines and TG 79.5 in relaying traffic to and from field units when TG 79.4 was out of voice contact with the applicable field units.

NARRATIVE SUMMARY

On 2 June Special Landing Force Alfa arrived off the coastal waters of RVN from Subic Bay; HNM-362 backloaded from Phu Bai Air Facility to the USS Princeton this same day. BIT 2/4 (-) had been helilifted from Mai Xa Chanh ID 279668 area to LZ Stud XD 002483 helilifted from Mai Xa Chanh ID 279668 area to LZ Stud XD 002483 on 31 May and chopped OPCON to Task Force Hotel to participate in Operation Scotland II.

The first 13 days of June, the BLT (-) was under the OFCON of the First Marines and participated in a series of helicopterborne assaults on a series of objectives South of National Roate 9 and the Khe Sanh Combat Base.

On Ili June the BIT (-) was chopped to the Fourth Marines and immediately helilifted to a known NVA road just north of Laos/Vietnamese border. The mission was to conduct a three day search and destroy operation along the road. Attacking eastward along the road the BIT maneuver elements met little resistance but uncovered and destroyed much NVA equipment.

On 17 June two of the maneuver elements and the Alfa Command Group were helilifted to IZ Cates to prepare positions and provide security for the construction of a fire base. Companies "G" and "H" were helilifted to IZ Stud.

On 20 June Company "H" was helilifted to hill 504 XD 966467 and on 21 June, Company "G" was helilifted to hill 512 XD 954451. This gave BLT 2/4 (-) mutually supporting positions along the high ground north of route 9. The primary mission was that of preventing the interdiction of Route 9 from the north while the Combat Base at the interdiction of Route 9 from the north while the Combat Base at Khe Sanh was being dismantled and evacuated. The remaining assets of the BLT were deployed throughout the northern I Corps area.

HMM-362 participation in Operation Fortress Attack III/Scotland III was in support of BLT 2/4 after having been chopped from the First Marine Aircraft Wing on 2 June. An average of 7.1 aircraft were provided to the First Marine Aircraft Wing daily for augmentation purposes beginning 3 June.

1. General

- a. Operation Fortress Attack III commenced at O21200H June 68 upon return of ARG/SIF Alfa from upkeep/rehab at Subic Bay, R. P. An amphibious landing was not conducted to commence this operation.
- b. BLT 2/4 (-) had chopped Opcon from Third Marines in the Napoleon/Saline area to Task Force Hotel at 311400H May 68. BLT 2/4 (-) was moved from Mai Xa Chanh (YD 279664) to LZ Cameo (YD 002483) in the Scotland II area. Initially BLT 2/4 (-) was chopped Opcon to First Marines; at 140720H BLT 2/4 (-) was chopped Opcon to Fourth Marines until the conclusion of Fortress Attack III at 100001 H July 68.
- c. Commander Task Croup 79.4 embarked aboard ARG/SIF shipping, retained operational control of HMM-362 and provided limited helicopter, medical and logistic support for BLT 2/4 (-) during Operation Fortress Attack III/Scotland II.
- d. Operation Scotland II is a continuing search and destroy operation being conducted by Task Force Hotel (First and Fourth Marines) in Quang Tri Province in the vicinity of Khe Sanh. From 1 June through 13 June BIT 2/4 (-) was given the mission of securing various positions, often in a coordinated attack with 1/1. From 14 June to the operation termination BLT 2/4 (-) was given the task of keeping Route 9 open from Khe Sanh to the East by occupying the high ground to the North of Route 9. During this period the Khe Sanh Combat Base was dismantled leaving only 1/1 in the vicinity of Khe Sanh.

3. Intelligence

a. Terrain. The BLT area of operation (AO) was located in the Western portion of Quang Tri Province, RVN. The BLT was constantly on the move during its participation in the operation. The general area in which the BLT operated is bounded on the North by XD 7948, on the

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East by YD Ohls, on the South by YD Oh23 and on the West XD 7923. The landscape throughout the AO is mountainous, characterized by extremely steep slopes that are covered by dense undergrowth and double canopy forest. Concealment and cover is from fair to good throughout the area. The most prominent terrain features are hills: 749 (XD 865271), 663 (XD 828321), 843 (XD 893326), 908 (XD 942312), 691 (XD 927443), 512 (XD 953451), 504 (XD 967466) and 950 (XD 845455).

b. Enemy Situation

(1) General. Intelligence prior to the operation indicated that the following units were within the AO; the 304th Division with it's 9th, 24th, 57th and 66th Infantry Regiments, supported by the 68th Artillery Regiment; The 95th Infantry Regiment, 101st Infantry Regiment and the 78th Artillery Regiment from the 325C Division; the 308th Division with two Regiments, the 88th and 102nd. The combined strength of these forces was approximately 20,000 personnel. All of these units were regular NVA.

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(3) Operation Effect on Knemy

a. There were two new units employed during the operation, they were:

1. The 308 Division was introduced into the area when friendly forces threatened enemy operations south of Khe Sanh. This division conducted a brief but limited offensive with two of it's regiments (the 88th and 102). The 308 Division was well trained and equipped for night operations. The 308 Division was new in RVN and was known to the NVA as one of the five "Steel Divisions". (The Steel

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Divisions were noted as having been composed of crack, elite troops, and were organized for the defense of the homeland). This division also made use of luminous ID tags which helped greatly in night attacks. However, even with it's training and preparation the 102nd Regiment alone lost approximately 330 men in three night attacks against friendly forces. The unit deployed with outstanding control until the attacks started on the friendly positions. At this time the enemy's attacks were broken by the confusion resulting from concentrated fires from allied defensive positions.

- 2. The 83d Engineer Regiment was deployed during the operation. The mission of the regiment was to build a road (Route 926) from Xe Pon River (Laos/Rvn Border) through RVN and link up with points further east.
- b. The enemy's mission in the AO was to inflict heavy casualties on friendly forces and to use combat units to engage friendly forces, keeping them away from their road. Of this mission the enemy only managed to give the 83d Engineer Regiment time to move ahead, as friendly forces pushed along this road destroying construction equipment and cratering the road.
- c. The enemy, desperate because of the upset in his plans, tried again to get a military victory at any cost. He attempted to inflict heavy casualties on friendly forces by attacking during the daylight hours, generally at dawn. These attacks resulted in the enemy suffering heavy casualties without causing excessive damage to allied forces. Friendly operations placed the enemy forces off balance to some degree, forcing him into an evasive/defensive posture. Sweeps conducted during the latter part of the operation proved this to be true for the enemy would abandon his positions without contact.
- d. The BIT moved to positions on the high ground to the north of Route 9 in order to protect the allied forces from attack as they withdrew from Khe Sanh. While the BIT was at this position, the enemy shifted his tactics from avoiding contact to attacking with small units elements of the BIT in attempts to lure them from their defensive positions into the enemy's killing zones. This maneuver worked on several occasions and has resulted in the enemy being able to inflict casualties on the BIT while suffering very few himself. The enemy has not made an attempt to penetrate the BIT's screening position and attack the withdrawal of friendly units from Khe Sanh but has appeared content to harrass the BIT with the above mentioned tactics.
- e. Indications are that the 308 Division is to move to the south once the withdrawal is completed and construct bunkers and fighting positions on the move so that they will be ready for occupation in the event allied forces should re-enter the Khe Sanh area in strength again.

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It is probable that the Khe Sanh area will be occupied by an enemy force of regimental size or less to act as a screening and harrassing force after the 308 Division withdraws.

4. Mission

- a. Fortress Attack III. COMSEVENTHFIF directed SIF/ARG Alfa to provide BLT 2/4 (-) helicopter, medical and logistic support during Operation Scotland II.
- b. Scotland II. Task Force Hotel directed BIT 2/4 (-) to continue the search and destroy operations in the vicinity of Khe Sanh. On 14 June, after being chopped opcon to Fourth Marines, Fourth Marines directed BIT 2/4 (-) to deny the NVA interdiction and infiltration routes from the north to Route 9.

5. Concept of Operations

- a. CTG 79.4 maintained a limison net with Third Marine Division, First Marines, Fourth Marines and BLT 2/4 (-). CTG 79.4 made daily limison visits to Task Force Hotel, First or Fourth Marines, and BLT 2/4 (-).
- b. The embarked squadron (HMM 362) maintained a medevac standby and provided liaison, logistic, and Command and Control flights. Additionally, an average of 7.4 aircraft were provided daily to augment the First Marine Aircraft Wing in-country helo assets.

6. Execution

- a. Fortress Attack III. Due to the support nature of this operation, execution of the mission was generally an extension of procedures used during Fortress Attack II/Napoleon/Saline. Due to the distance from BIT $2/l_1$ (-), medical and logistic support was limited somewhat compared to the time frame in which BIT $2/l_1$ (-) was in the vicinity of the Cua Viet River (5 March 31 May 68).
- b. Scotland II. BIT 2/4 (-) was open to First Marines the first half of June and conducted search and destroy operations in the mountainous terrain around Khe Sanh. During the remainder of June and through 9 July, BLT 2/4 (-) became open to Fourth Marines and occupied the high ground north of Route 9 between Khe Sanh and Calu to keep this road open for vehicular traffic. BIT 2/4 (-) also assisted in the construction of fire bases at their positions for USMC artillery units.
- 7. Results. See enclosure (2)

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8. Commander's Analysis. This analysis is limited to matters at the TG 79.4 level. The HAM Commander's analysis is included in his report, enclosure (2).

a. Planning

- (1) Since Operation Fortress Attack III did not commence with an amphibious operation, no planning, as such, was necessary or required prior to initiating the operation.
- (2) Throughout the operation continuous liaison was conducted with OPCON and supporting commands, particularly 3d MARDIV and Task Force Hotel, as well as BLT 2/4 (-). Communications liaison teams were established at varying points throughout the operation to maintain communications between the SLF, BLT 2/4 (-), and medical facilities.

b. Command Relationships

- (1) OPCON of BLT 2/4 (-) was retained by First Marines until 140720H June 1968, when BLT 2/h (-) was chopped opcon to Fourth Marines.
- (2) HMM 362 was open to CTG 79.4 during Operation Fortress Attack III.
 - c. Enemy Contact. None on Operation Fortress Attack III.
 d. Supporting Arms. Not applicable

e. Logistics

- (a) At the conclusion of Operation Fortress Attack II liaison was effected with III MAF and ForLogCond to resume ARG/SLF assistance to BLT 2/4 upon commencement of Operation Fortress Attack III.
- (b) BIT 2/4 was to continue under operational control 3d MARDIV (3d Mar). The class II supply source was to remain at ForLogComd; source of other supplies was to continue to be FISG Bravo. The BIT ISA was located at Dong Ha.
- (c) Helicopter support having been curtailed, BLT access to supplies and equipment afloat was to be limited to that which could be landed by surface means.

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(2) Execution

- (a) Upon return of the SIF from Subic it was determined that BIT 2/4 (-) had chopped to Task Force Hotel and was operating in the vicinity of Khe Sanh. The bulk of battalion supply had been shifted from Camp Big John to Dong Ha. A forward element of the ISA was operating at IZ Stud, receiving supplies by "Rough Rider" convoy from Dong Ha and forwarding them via available helo-lift.
- (b) This relocation did not affect the degree of logistic assistance provided by the ARC/SIF, but transit times were greatly increased for both delivery and retrograde of material.
- (c) ARG landing craft carried personnel, supplies and equipment between the ships and Dong Ha at least once each week. They were also used to complete the move of equipment from Camp Big John to Dong Ha and to evacuate BIT deadlined equipment from Cua Viet River mouth. Boat convoys ranged in size from two to four ICM-8s.
- (d) No insurmountable supply problems were encountered. In-country supply sources provided essential supplies to the BIT.
- (e) In-country maintenance facilities were available at FISG Bravo; however, many major items were evacuated by ARG shipping to FIC, Danang, BIT elements were spread from Khe Sanh to Cun Viet River mouth and from Con Thien to Quang Tri, which degraded the capability to exercise maintenance control. This difficulty was partly overcome by eliciting the cooperation of Opcon commanders, notably 1st AmTrac Bn and 3d Tank Bn.
- (f) The USS Princeton was designated as primary Casualty Receiving Ship (PCRS) and SIF casualty liaison representatives were positioned at Company "D" 3d Medical Bn (Delta Med), Dong Ha. The Medevac comm guard remained with 3d MARDIV because of time/space factors, and additional emphasis was placed on evacuation of casualties from Delta Med to the PCRS.
- f. Casualty Reporting. Casualty reporting was conducted in accordance with current directives. The 9th NAB CRCC Alfa was located aboard the USS Princeton (LPH-5) which was designated the Primary Casualty Receiving Ship. BLT 2/4 and TG 79.4 casualty representatives were positioned at Company "D" 3d Medical Bn, Dong Ha, RVN to collect and pass casualty information concerning Special Landing Force Alfa personnel on to the 9th MAB CRCC Alfa.

- g. Civic Action. No civic action program was conducted due to the area of operation and the operational commitments.
- h. ISO. A photographer was sent ashore with BIT 2/4 to provide informational services coverage.
- i. Communications. Communications were established IAW CTG 79.4 Op Flan 120A (YR), TG 79.4 COI dtd 28 March 1968 and TG 79.4 COI dtd 15 June 1968. A message center was maintained afloat in conjunction with the USS Princeton Naval Communication Center; CTG 79.4 maintained message distribution responsibility for BIT 2/4 and HMM = 362. The following nets were established/entered during Operation Fortress Attack III/Scotland II.
- (1) 3d MARDIV TAC # 2 (VHF). CTG 79.4 entered this net establishing communications (Plain/Cipher) with 3d MARDIV, 1st Marines, 3d Marines and 4th Marines.
- (2) SIF TAC # 1 (VHF). CTG 79.4 established this net with SIF Alfa liaison teams in the field. Equipment and personnel were utilized basically in the same manner as for Operation Fortress Attack II. BLT 2/4 Rear located at Dong Ha also entered this net to provide direct communications between the BLT Rear CP and SIF units afloat; This station was also utilized for relaying traffic from the ship to the BLT CP. SIF liaison team stations were established in the following manner:
- a. Alfa. Initially located at Khe Sanh (1st Marines CP) and LZ Robin (4th Marines CP) for relay of traffic between BLT 2/4 and CTG 79.4. Operated directly from BLT 2/4 CP during last week of Fortress Attack III. Equipment utilised was PRC-25 and RC 292.

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- b. Bravo. Located at Dong Ha (Delta Med Bn) primarily for passing of casualty reports; this station was also used as a relay between the ship and Alfa team. Equipment utilized was MRC-110, PRC-47, PRC-25 and RC-292.
- c, Charlie, Located at Camp Carroll for relay of . traffic between CTG 79.h and units in the field (primarily other SIF liaison teams and the BLT). Equipment utilized was MRC-109, MRC-83. FRC-25 and RC-292. This net was used for situation, spot, casualty and administrative reporting as well as for Med-evac requests.
- (3) SIF TAC # 2 (HF). This net was activated when SIF TAC # 1 was non-operational due to distance factors between the ship and shore stations or when equipment outages occurred, Cipher operations utilizing the KY-8 were limited to the Division Tac Net due to the type of fast moving operations and remote positioning of CP's by the BLT. Portable FM equipment was utilized as the primary means of communication. Operations and numerical codes were used as required.

The Theorem is been about the second of the second The Third MARDIV changed all of its call signs and frequencies on 18 June 68 creating confusion and interference problems for approximately one week. The Comm-Blec section at 3d MARDIV was extremely helpful and cooperative in attending to the frequency problems encountered by the BLT.

A week long attempt to operate the MRC-62 Radio Relay between Dong Ha and the ship proved unsatisfactory, Non-availability of good frequencies and inadequate siting of shipboard antennas prevented satisfactory and reliable operations of the radio relay equipment.

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Outstanding cooperation and assistance was provided by FLC, 3d 💛 MARDIV, 4th Marines and FISG Bravo in relaying traffic to/from CTG 79.4 and in repairing SIF communications equipment that went down during the operation.

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
