

#### PART II

#### NARRATIVE SUMMARY

- 1. During the period 1-5 August 1969, Special Landing Force "ALFA", embarked in Amphibious Ready Group "ALFA", continued a program of rehabilitation and upkeep at Subic Bay Naval Base, Republic of the Philippines. Special Landing Force/Amphibious Ready Group "ALFA" departed Subic Bay on 6 August 1969, arrived off the Republic of Vietnam on 8 August, and began embarkation of BLT 1/26 from Danang Harbor and detachment "ALFA", HMM 265 from the Marble Mountain Air Facility. Operational control of BLT 1/26 and Det "ALFA", HMM 265 was assumed by CTG 79.4 at O81200H Aug 69.
- 2. On 11 August, SLF "ALFA" began rehabilitation and afloat training for BLT 1/26. HMM 265 conducted night carrier landing qualifications during the period of afloat training. On 19 August, ARG/SLF "ALFA" conducted a demonstration and staff briefing for UNSECNAV John W. Warner. Heliconter augmentation was provided III MAF during the period 20 August to 31 August. This support consisted of resupply aircraft for the 2d ROKMC Brigade and command and control aircraft for the First Marine Air Wing.
- 3. On 25 August, a joint planning conference was held at Second ROKMC He concerning an amphibious operation in the Barrier Island Area. On 27 August 1969, COMSEVENTHFLT approved the concept of operations for Operation Defiant Stand to be conducted on northern Barrier Island beginning on 8 Sep 1969. During the period 27 August through 31 August, ARG/SLF "ALFA" continued planning and preparations for Operation Defiant Stand. On 31 August, Admirál Thomas H. Moorer, USN, Chief of Naval Operations, visited ARG/SLF "ALFA" aboard the USS Iwo Jima. A demonstration and briefing was conducted high-lighting the capabilities of the ARG/SLF.

- g. Equipment and Logistics
  - (1) Background.
- (a) Prior to departure for the rehab period at Subic Bay, the majority of Battalion Landing Team 1/26's personnel and equipment was offlowed from ARG shipping to their CP located in the vicinity of HILL 34 RVN. Additionally, a detachment of HMM 265 was offlowed to Marble Mountain.
- (b) Eight CH-46 helicopters and 150 squadron personnel remained aboard to accomplish the required maintenance, repair and modificantions on the above helos during the rehab.
  - (2) General.
- (a) SLF "ALFA" arrived Subic Bay, Philippine Islands at 220670" July 1969 and began offloading procedures for the rehab of certain items of equipment. The SLF Upper Camp was utilized to house personnel of HMM 265 while SLF and BLT personnel remained aboard ARG shipping. The rehab period continued to the 6th of August 1969, at which time the ARG departed for the Republic of Vietnam.

(b) During the rehab period at Subic Bay, the SLF's communication vehicles were serviced and placed in a satisfactory readiness condition.

(c) Five M50A1 Cntos organic to the BLT were replaced by FSR

while the battalion was at Hill 34.

(d) Other essential equipment returning from dead ine included two M48 tanks, one RFK-60 forklift, one TD-15 tractor and one M5L3A2 wrecker. Still remaining on deadline are the two cranes, crawler, model 2N, M62's that were evacuated to the Third FSR for repair. Considerable improvement in the equipment status area has been noticeable since the SLF initiated daily reporting procedures.

(3) Supply.

- (a) The replacement of all the Mi& rifles with the Mi6 rifle for applicable members of the SLF Staff was completed.
- (b) Discussions held with the Commanding Officer. Headquarters Company, 9th MAB insures that future members reporting in to the SLF, will have the required amount of individual equipment and special clothing items in their possession.
- (c) As a result of the Navy's forthcoming decommissioning program being applicable to certain ships within the ARG, it became necessary to shift personnel and cargo to conform to the characteristics of the new APG shipping.

Medical.

- (a) The SLF received twenty (20) pallets of medical summlies earmarked for Medical Allowance Code 670 in order to bring it into alignment with certain revised requirements published by Bureau of Medicine and Surgery. Washington, D.C.

- (a) ARG shipping and HMM aircraft were utilized during the period for administrative purposes both between ships and for ship to shore movements.
- (b) HMM 265 also provided aircraft to the 1st MAW for support purposes.



- 1. During the period 1-6 Sep 1969, Special Landing Force Alfa continued planning and preparations for Operation Defiant Stand. On 4 Sep 1969, CTG 76.4 and CTG 79.4 hosted UNSECNAV for Manpower HON James D. FITTLE aboard Iwo James for a briefing and tour.
- 2. On 6 Sep 1969, S-Day (D-Day for SLF Alfa) for Operation Defiant Stand was advanced one day from 8 Sep to 7 Sep 1969. H and L-Hours were designated as 0700H and 0800H, respectively.
- 3. From 7 Sep 69 through 19 Sep 69, SLF Alfa conducted Operation Defiant Stand, a joint amphibious operation, with the 2d POKMC Brigade on the northern portion of Barrier Island. ### 2. INCLUSIVE DATES AND LOCATION OF OPERATION

- a. Inclusive dates: Ø7Ø7ØØH Sep 69 to 1917ØØH Sep 69.
- b. Location: Map reference; Vietnam 1:50,000, AMS Series L7014, Sheet 6640I. The Amphibious Objective Area (AOA) was located in Quang Tin Province of ICTZ. The landward AOA was that area encompassed by a line drawn from BT 220516 SW along the Cua Dai River to BT 172542 to BT 165532 to BT 160530 to BT 150530 to BT 145523, thence southward to BT 144513, thence SW to BT 133505, thence southward along the Ly Ly River to BT 146460, then trace to BT 175443, thence NE to the Truong Giang River at BT 220460, NE along trail to the South China Sea at BT 243480, including the air space from 0-25,000 feet, Mean Sea Level.
- c. The boundary between the Republic of Korea Marine Corps (ROKMC)
  Regimental Landing Team (RLT) AOA and the Special Landing Force ALFA AOA is defined as follows: from the Ly Ly River at BT 144480, east along the 48 grid line to the provincial boundary at BT 156480, thence NE along the provincial boundary at BT 183500, thence to BT 190504 to BT 200509, to BT 210510, to BT 215520, to 220523, thence east to the junction of the provincial boundary and the South China Sea. ### 5. <u>INTELLIGENCE</u>

a. Terrain. The study area was located in the southeastern corner of Quang Nam Province and northeastern corner of Quang Tin Province, on the coast of the South China Sea, generally that area south of the Cua Dai River and east of highway one. The area is southwest of the district capital of Hoi An and commonly known as Barrier Island. The area had long been reported

under VC/NVA control with the enemy having full support of the local population.

b. Enemy Situation. Intelligence before the operation indicated that approximately 395 men from the following units were operating in the ACA: the V. 25th LF Bn (160 men) plus elements of the Q. 80th Bn (85 men) in addition to 100-150 guerillas. On 3 and 4 Aug, sightings were made of enemy forces totaling 27 men. On 24 Aug, a 60 man force was taken under fire by arty and fixed wing aircraft resulting in 50 enemy KIA. During the attack 50 Cal. fire was received by the aircraft. A later report indicated that elements of the Q. 80th Bn had been crossing the river into the AOA on the night of 6 Aug, and a number of VC were killed, one reported to be the adjutant of the Q. 80th Bn.

- d. Operational Effects on the Enemy. The enemy evaded large centacts with friendly forces. Enemy initiated activities were limited to small unit encounters at night. The companies in night defensive positions received occasional mortar/RPG fire followed by small arms and sniper fire. Hewever, on one occasion enemy forces used tear fas however no casualties were sustained. The gas was standard U.S. CS type fired by U.S. M79 grenade launcher. The retainers were recovered.
- 6. MISSION. (As stated by COMSEVENTHFLT) Commander Amphibious Task Force (CATF) conduct a combined Search and Clear Amphibious Operation employing SLF ALFA and elements of 2nd ROKMC Brigade against VC/NVA forces in Amphibious Objective Area in Quang Nam and Quang Tin Provinces of ICTZ or other operations as agreed upon with CG III MAF or his designated representative. The mission as stated by Commander Landing Force; commencing at H-Hour, on 3-Day,\*
  SLF "ALFA" conducts heliborne and surface amphibious assault in AOA. Conduct search and clear operations in AOA to locate/capture or destroy all enemy forces and to locate/capture or destroy all enemy caches or installations.

7. CONCEPT OF OPERATIONS. Commencing at L-Hour on S-Day, SLF ALFA, designated Southern Landing Force, conducts amphibious hele assault, landing two companies in central portion of assigned portion of AOA. At H-Hour conduct a two company surface assault over Green Beach and establish a FSB and BSA. When directed sweep to the north conducting search and clear operations. At S+3, BLT to be in blocking positions on the northern boundary of the assigned portion of AOA to block southern boundary of ROKMC RLT-2 portion of AOA. (See enclosures (2), (3), and (5).)

#### 8. EXECUTION

- a. S-Day (Period Ø7Ø7ØØH to Ø718ØØH)
- (1) SLF "ALFA" commenced Operation Defiant Stand at \$\phi70700H\$ Sep 69. The surface assault across Green Beach was unopposed, and companies A and B immediately assaulted and seized Landing Force Objective Charlie, and began clearing the area selected for the FSB/BSA. The heliborne assault into LZ's Eagle and Quail was delayed for 62 minutes due to poor visibility in the LZ's and over the AOA caused by heavy rain squalls. The weather cleared sufficiently to allow Co. "C" to land unopposed in LZ Quail at L+62 minutes followed by Co. "D" on LZ Eagle.
- (2) Heliborne companies, after insertion into LZ's Quail and Eagle, attacked and seized Landing Force Objectives Alfa and Bravo by Ø711ØØH Sep. The heliborne force encountered no opposition during the landing or assaults upon Landing Force Objectives.
- (3) Heliborne insertion of the BLT Command Group into the FSB in the vicinity of Green Beach commenced without enemy opposition at \$\phi7122\$\phi\$\$H\$ and was completed by \$\phi713\$\phi\$\$H\$. (See enclosure (5).)
- (4) Upon securing the initial Landing Force Objectives, assault companies began search and clear operations in their respective AO's. Detainees were moved to a collection point for screening by Interrogator Translator Team (ITT).
- (5) During the first day of the operation, ground contact with the enemy was very light with only two incidents reported with one VC WIA. (POW)

### b. Period Ø718ØØH to Ø818ØØH

- (1) During the hours of darkness, units of the BLT conducted night activities consisting of reconnaissance and ambush patrols. During this period Company C reported receiving seven 60mm mortar rounds from enemy positions at BT 194486, BT 191488 and BT 194488. Casualties sustained were four friendly WIA's. 60mm mortar and artillery fire was employed against the suspected mortar positions, and close air support in the form of one USAF C-118 (Shadow) aircraft was called. Fire from "Shadow's" minigums produced two secondary explosions in the vicinity of the suspected enemy locations and no further enemy fire was reported. No enemy contact was reported by the remainder of the Landing Force during this period.
- (2) During daylight hours of the period, units of the BLT continued extensive search and clear operations. Contact with the enemy was light and limited to sniper fire. Small groups of enemy were observed in widely scattered areas of the AOA and contact with them resulted in 4 NVA/VC KIA. All detainees were moved to a collection point for screening by ITT. Ground Psyops Teams, working from LVTP-5's, moved along the eastern half of the AOA broadcasting evacuation directions to the civilian populace. The indigeneous personnel were told to gather their cooking utensils and move southward and out of the AOA to a Combined Holding and Interrogation Center (CHIC) located at BT 165416.
- (3) Government of Viet Nam Province authorities placed restrictions on the AOA as set forth in CG III MAF message Ø7133ØZ Sep. (See enclosure (4).) Commander Landing Force instructed all LF units not to manuever or fire into the prescribed area except in response to enemy fire or other hostile actions initiated by enemy forces.

- (1) Landing Force offensive operations were limited to patrols and ambushes in accordance with instructions from higher headquarters.



- (2) During the period, contact with enemy units was light, however movement of small groups of enemy increased in the western portion of the AOA. Friendly units received sniper fire from positions west of the Truong Giang River. Employment of recon units into the western portion of the AOA significantly reduced enemy fire from that area. Numerous groups of 5-6 enemy were observed moving southward toward the AOA from the vicinity of BT 2252 and BT 2253. Artillery and NGF were employed in these areas, however results remain unknown since these areas were outside the AOA. Six enemy were killed during the period as patrols made point contact with small groups of enemy. Detainees continued to be screened by Interrogator Translator Team at the BLT collection point.
- (3) One LVTP-5 was destroyed by an unknown type mine at BT 240480. The vehicle was on a resupply mission, and loaded with 106mm RR rounds. The LVT was completely destroyed by the explosions and fire.

in the AOA. In contrast to previous days of the operation, most contact with enemy forces occurred during daylight hours. However, contact continued to be light. - (1) During daylight hours of the period, Landing Force units continued search and clear operations. 

### g. Period 121800H to 131800H

### h. Period 131800H to 141800H

- (1) Contact with the enemy remained light during this period. Landing Force units continued search and clear operations during daylight hours and patrolling during the hours of darkness. Blocking positions along the northern AOA boundary in apport of ROKMC operations were maintained. At 1840H, D/1/26 killed 11 enemy who were attempting to cross the Truong Giang River by boat at BT 201468. At 132045H an enemy force estimated at platoon size, employed CS gas. The gas was standard U.S. type fired by M-79 grenade launchers. The enemy attempted to exploit the gas attack with small arms, but were beaten off by the quick reaction of D/1/26. The enemy broke contact immediately and fled to the east. There were no U.S. casualties. D/1/26 immediately swept the area of enemy contact under illumination with negative results.

- (1) Rifle companies in blocking positions on the northern boundary of the AOA conducted search and clear operations southward in their zones, and were prepositioned in preparation for heliborne and surface withdrawal from the AOA.
- (2) Contact with the enemy remained light and the only notable action occured at 172045H, when A/1/26 and B/1/26 were simultaneously attacked with 60mm mortars, automatic weapons fire, and RPG's from BT 209490, BT 209494, and BT 212494 by an enemy force estimated at platoon size. 4 Marines were wounded during this attack. All enemy positions were engaged with small arms, mortars, artillery, and naval gunfire. An early morning sweep of enemy positions revealed blood trails and numerous drag marks, indicating probable enemy casualties.



### e. Logistics

- (1) Equipment
- (a) Ten (1¢) LVTP-5's were utilized in the landing, thereafter their primary function was that of resumply. The performance of the LVTP-5's was considered satisfactory. One LVTP-5 hit a single unknown sized land mine and began burning while on a resumply mission. The vehicle was loaded with



Class V supplies which exploded and resulted in the destruction of the vehicle. During the later stages of the operation two additional LVTP-5's were evacuated to Danang for repair and were not returned.

- (b) The five (5) M5ØA1 Ontos's organic to the BLT were not used extensively during the operation. One (1) vehicle was damaged by salt water emersion during the offloading from the LSD and was evacuated to the fourth echelon repair facility.
- (c) Five (5) M48A3 Tanks were used during the operation. One M48A3 Tank was damaged and disabled from a RPG direct hit, another was deadlined due to an oil leak. Both vehicles were evacuated.
- (d) One M62, 2N Crane Crawler with operator was provided for the operation by the First Marine Division.
- (e) Two M49 Truck, Tank, Refuelers were used during the operation. One was filled with MOGAS and the other with diesel. It is considered that based on the type of missions performed by the tactical and tracked vehicles during this amphibious operation that an additional refueler for MOGAS would have been desireable.
- (f) The refuelers were refilled from the bulk fuel assets of the LSD's.

### (2) Supply

- (a) A BSA was established on S-Day. Two days of Class I and Class V were maintained at the BSA for resupply of all elements within the BLT. Class II, III and IV supplies were available aboard ARG ships as required.
- (b) Resupply requests were submitted to the BLT S-4 thru the BSA Taclog Net. BLT supply stocks were maintained aboard the LPH, LSD, LKA and LST.
- (c) Resupply of the rifle companies was by LVTP-5's from the BSA and Ch-46A8s from the ships. All other units were supplied directly from the BSA.
- (d) Resupply requests for replenishment of Class I, certain catagories within Class III and Class V supplies for the BSA commenced on S-Day with subsequent pickup and delivery by ARG ships scheduled for the next day. Resupply requests thereafter were submitted to FIC on S plus 2, S plus 4, S plus 6 and S plus 7.
- (e) The policy of having no more than two days, and no less than one day of supplies on the beach at any one time proved to be impracticable because of the following reasons:

- a. ARG shipping not being available for scheduled pickup and delivery due to initial debark damage to ship/s concerned.
- b. Unavailability of a loading berth at the staging area for supply pickup.
- c. Modifications to ARG shipping schedules for pickup and delivery of resupply requests.
  - d. Time frame allowed for no safety margin.
- e. Resulted in poor usage data being used as a basis for future requisitions.
  - (3) Medical
- (a) The USS Iwo Jima (LPH-2) was designated as the Casualty Evacuation Control Ship.
- (b) Most friend'v military casualties were evacuated by helo to the USS Iwo Jima, with serious head injuries being evacuated to NSA, Danang.
  - (4) Transportation
    - (a) All types of transportation organic to the ARG, BLT and HMM.
- (b) Helo's were used for the movement of personnel from the AOA's to Danang for administrative purposes.

### f. Casualty Reporting

- (1) Casualty Reporting was conducted in accordance with current directives.
- (2) The 9th MAB CRCC-ALFA was located aboard the USS Iwo Jima (LPH-2). BLT 1/26, HMM 265 and TG 79.4 casualty representatives were positioned aboard the USS Iwo Jima and at in-country medical facilities to collect and pass casualty information concerning SLF ALFA personnel to the 9th MAB CRCC-ALFA.

- g. Civic Action. There was no civic action conducted during Operation Defiant Stand.
  - h. ISO. Journalists from LEATHERNECK Magazine and the Stars and Stripes

collected information from the Landing Force during the operation.

### i. Psyops

- (1) Psychological operations conducted in support of Operation Defiant Stand were designed to prevent animosity between the civilian populace and the Allied Forces and to reduce the combat effectiveness of the VC/NVA combatants in the AOA.
- (2) To aid in population control, a Combined Holding and Interrogation Center (CHIC) was established in Quang Tin Province by Province officials. Aerial loudspeaker broadcasts and a ground psychological operation team was used by BLT 1/26 to inform the populace of the operation and to direct them to move from the AOA. The civilians were directed to move to collection points where they were provided medical care, food, and water before proceeding on their own to the CHIC.
- (3) The VC/NVA combatants in the AOA were urged to Chieu Hoi by aerial and ground psychological operations broadcasts. They were advised that they were surrounded and given the opportunity to become Hoi Chanhs in order to avoid a senseless death and burial in an unmarked and unattended grave.
- (4) As a result of the psychological operations conducted in Operation Defiant Stand, 928 innocent civilians were moved to safety in the CHIC and 1 VC returned to the GVN under the Chieu Hoi program.
- j. Communications. Communications were established in accordance with Task Group 79.4 Operation Plan 120 (-YR) and Task Group 79.4 Communication Operation Instructions (COI) of 5 Sep 69. Reliability of communications was greatly improved by the effort of the USS Iwo Jima to remain within the ACA. The following information is accompanied with notations of problems encountered during operation, corrective actions taken, and/or recommendations and opinions.

### (1) Equipment

(a) AN/PRC-77:

Problem: There were difficulties in cipher mode using the PRC-77 with the KY-38. The PRC-77 would operate in plain mode, but, when in cipher mode, a continuous alarm was experienced with no transmission. This same problem was experienced by BLT 1/26 with their PRC-77. Action: Returned PRC-77 to Fifth Comm. replaced PRC-77 and KY-38 with RT-524 and KY-8. Recommendation: Reevaluate the cipher circuit within the PRC-77.

- (b) RT-524:
  No problems encountered with this equip.
- (c) KY-8

Problem: Failure to transmit, and receiving only tone burst. During long transmissions (3-5 minutes or more) the KY-8 would drop all signal, causing no emission. This is possibly caused from overheating or strain on circuitry. Action: Used other sets and instructed operators and user to keep transmission short.

### (d) AN/GRA-39:


No problems encountered with this equip.

- (2) <u>Personnel</u>. Problem: Nine radio operators were sent TAD from Co., 9th MAB due to shortage of personnel in this command. All personnel were unfamiliar with radio equipment (KY-8, PRC-77, KY-38), Codes and Keylists used aboard ship and in-country. Action: Held classes on equip., codes and keylists, and conducted C.J.T. for all personnel. Recommendation: All personnel in Comm Co, 9th MAB should be trained in all codes, keylists, and equip. used aboard ship and in-country.
- (3) <u>Message Center</u>. A message center was maintained afloat in conjunction with USS Iwo Jima Naval Communication Center for the distribution of message traffic to CTG 79.4, HMM-265, and BLT 1/26. No problems encountered with message center.

#### (4) Radio

- (a) III MAF CMD #2 (AM-RATT): was entered and maintained by USS Iwe Jima Communication Center to provide orestes teletypewriter communication with III MAF C.O.C. (No other III MAF nets entered during the Operation.) No problems encountered with this net.
- (b) SLF TAC #1 (FM): was established for Nestor Communication. Difficulties on this net due to failure of PRC-77 radio sets. AN/PRC-77 sets replaced as previously noted. Stations included on this net:

### (5) Security

- (a) Wheel Codes (USKAK-288) were tested from \$7\$7\$\$\text{0}\$\$ H Sep 69 to 15\$\$\text{0}\$\$\text{0}\$\$ IH Sep 69. Used on the following nets and proved to be rapidly and easily used, requiring a minimum of training.

  - (b) Security violations decreased greatly over past operations.

#### k. Sensors

- (1) Operation DEFIANT STAND is believed to be the first amphibious combat operation in which seismic intrusion devices were utilized. The capability of planting, monitoring and recovering hand-emplaced sensors was developed within the ARG/SLF. Liaison was established with III MAF Special Projects Branch who in-turn provided necessary training and equipment for selected personnel of the Phibron/SLF and the BLT. Patrol Seismic Intrusion Devices (PSID's) were issued to the companies to provide security for CP's, and to enhance the effectiveness/security of the night activities (patrols/ ambushes). Miniature Seismic Intrusion Devices (MINISIDS) were hand-emplaced (three strings of three each) at points where intelligence holdings indicated probable infiltration/exfiltration routes existed within the ACA. Initial Minisid monitoring was to be done from the LPH, utilizing the Portatale (a seismic intrusion device monitoring unit) connected to a ground plane antenna, however, the sensor implantation and simultaneous establishment of the BLT CP ashore indicated a more efficient/effective monitoring readout could be conducted from a shore station.
  - (2) General observations on use and effectiveness of the implanted sensors:
- (a) PSIDS were considered effective and were well received by units once their use and effectiveness were demonstrated/experienced. They should be valuable tools for small units in the conduct of night activities, perimeter defense of CP's and ambushes, however, specific data on their effectiveness has not yet been assembled. On occasion, the PSID's were considered toe sensitive, taking too long to settle down following an activation due to the impact of supporting arms fire nearby. Some activations were also believed to be the result of artillery/NGF projectiles passing overhead.



- (b) Minisids-with few exceptions, were effective and worked well. Many artillery/NGF missions were conducted based on activations obtained.

  (3) Comments
- (a) Maximum effectiveness in the utilization of sensing devices depends on their acceptance as reliable indicators of activity by unit commanders. This necessary level of confidence can only result from training, experience, and command interest prior to their use. These conditions were not satisfied for Operation Defiant Stand.
- (b) A site selected for the implantation of a string was apparently too close to a local village, resulting in many insignificant/meaningless activations. The normal local traffic in and around the village, especially during daylight hours, made detection of military targets difficult if not impossible to detect due to excessive ambient "noise" level.
- (c) It is also believed that the sensors were planted too close together to take maximum advantage of the sensors' capabilities. (The sensors were planted approximately 35-40 meters apart.
- (d) Failure to readout any activations on the two northern most strings was believed to be due to improper setting/implantation, however, activation readout toward the end of the operation confirmed the proper functioning of the sensors, and the failure on the part of the monitor station to recognize that the negative activation was due to inactivity in the area, as opposed to faulty equipment/implantation.
- (e) The availability of only one Portatale hindered the effective readout of all strings in view of the fact that not all MINISIDS furnished were on the same channel (three were on channel 30 and six were on channel 29, necessitating switching channels on the portatale frequently and detracting from the effective/efficient monitoring of the enemy activity.)
- l. An after action critique was not conducted due to the scheduled withdrawal of the BLT and their immediate offload from ARG shipping to assume defensive positions and free BLT 2/26 for embarkation. All key participants from the BLT, HVM, SLF and Phibron should be available to conduct an after action critique to identify areas in which improvement or corrective action are desired to insure efficiency of future operations.

### 11. LESSONS LEARNED

a. More effective use can be made of artillery and naval gunfire by utilizing surprise fire, consisting of batteries firing for effect with fuze



mixed without adjusting individual rounds on each fire mission. This technique can be used with normal FDC and observer procedures; if shift from previously fired targets, registering on possible points of contact, and accurate initial target location. By utilizing a radar beacon team to provide accurate ranges and bearings, the naval gunfire ships are capable of firing surprise fire also, depending upon danger element to troops. Radar beacon teams should be requested for future operations.

- b. Over confidence on supporting arms complicates the ground tactical effort, leads to wasteful ammunition expenditures, and detracts from the proper use of small unit tactics and weapons. This is particularly true in the use of illumination, where each contact seemed to require rapid and continuous light from all available sources. Illumination is most effective when used sparingly, employing acceptable observer and FDC techniques in coordination with aggressive ground action. Primarily, illumination should be used as a defensive measure when a unit is seriously threatened and unable or does not desire to exploit a contact. Extensive use of illumination is an indication of a nervous, defensive attitude toward night operations that can assist an enemy in location of their own position relative to the defenders position being probed. Night Observation Devices (NOBs) should be available to the SLF to provide the capability of observing avenues of approach into the AOA and/or unit positions. When these NOBs indicate a worth while target, then HE and III fires can be used to destroy the intruder. In addition NOBs can assist in increasing the effectiveness of sensors without prematurely revealing to the enemy that they have been detected.
- c. In combining the search and destroy mission with that of providing a blocking force along the Northern Boundary of the AOA, units had a tendency to move rapidly through the approach area to the blocking position, missing possible areas of enemy concealment or positions. Upon reaching the blocking positions, the majority of the forces available were emplaced to provide for strong blocking positions to prevent enemy entrance into the AOA. Defense against enemy activity originating within the AOA was a secondary concern. As a result enemy activity from by passed forces posed a significant threat, particularly at night when by harassment and probes the attention of the blocking forces could be diverted from their primary mission. Therefore, when the scheme of manuever chosen is one that produces a perimeter of blocking forces and lightly swept area all units should be prepared for harassment and probes from 360 degrees.
  - d. On several occasions, small unit leaders found it necessary to call for

heavy supporting arms fire into areas fringing the assigned ACA. In most cases, called artillery silenced small arms and crew served weapons being fired from these areas, but it was virtually impossible to estimate damage on casualties. Through close coordination with adjacent units buffer zones and areas contiguous to the AOA should be swept by recon elements to establish accurate evaluation of the effectiveness of the total amphibious operation.



#### NARRATIVE SUMMARY

- 1. From 1 Oct 69 through 2 Oct 69, Special Landing Force/Amphibious Ready Group "ALFA" continued enroute from Hong Kong B.C.C. to Okinawa for offload of the SIF. On 3 Oct 69, due to tropical storms near Okinawa, ARG ships were diverted to Danang, RVN for the loading of troops for Operation Keystone Cardinal.
- 2. ARG/SIF "ALFA" arrived in Danang, RVN on 5 Oct 69, completed the embarkation of Keystone Cardinal troops on 6 Oct 69, and departed for Okinawa on 7 Oct 69. The ARG arrived in Okinawa on 10 Oct 69 and offloaded SIF "Alfa" to Camp Hansen and the aircraft of HMM 265 to the Air Facility at Futema. HMM 265 was chopped to 9TH MAB upon the commencement of the aircraft offload.
- 3. During the period 11-31 October SLF "ALFA" commenced initial coordination in preparation for the predeployment training of BLN 2/9, and conducted General Military Subjects training for the enlisted personnel of the SLF staff.
- 4. On 25 Oct 69, the T/O of the SLF staff was revised in accordance with the instructions contained in OG FMFPac Message of 2521172 Oct 69.



- 1. On 1 December 1969, SIF ALFA completed loading of all troops and equipment aboard the USS TRIPOLI, USS CGDEN, USS POINT DEFIANCE, and the USS SEMINOLE. On 2 December 1969, SIF AIFA/ARG ALFA deperted Okinawa enroute Subic Bay, RPI where HLT 2/9 and HM 165 were offloaded upon arrival on 5 December 1969.
- 2. From 6 December 1969 through 11 December 1969, ELT 2/0 and HMM 165 conducted training ashore while the SIF Staff continued planning for Zambeles Phiblex 1-69. On 9 December 1969 CTG 79.4 hosted Major General W. K. JONES, Commanding General, I Marine Expeditionary Force/3rd Marine Division. After a briefing and tour aboard the USS TRIPOLI, the general visited ELT 2/9 at the SIF Camp. - 3. SLF ALFA/ARG ALFA departed Subic Bay, RPI on 15 December 1969 enroute littoral RVN to conduct Ready Operations off coast of RVN. SLF ALFA/ARG ALFA reached coast of RVN on 17 December 1969 and continued to conduct Ready Operations until departing for Subic Bay on 26 December 1969.
