1. The contact made by Marine Forces sweeping westward along the southern part of the DMZ continued into the second day. The action is taking place in the vicinity of hill 117, which is about 8 miles northwest of Cam Lo and about 1/2 mile inside the DMZ. Enemy positions there consists of heavy fortified bunkers in an area of dense foliage. Although the size of the enemy force is not yet known, it appears to be at least a reinforced company. During the morning hours of the 25th of May, a 2d marine battalion joined the assault, and in the afternoon both units initiated a combined attack on hill 117. By 1:30 P.M. their initial objective had been secured and the assault continued against heavy resistance. This part of the contact lasted until 5 in the afternoon with air and artillery supporting the ground attack. Casualties at this time are 14 marines killed and 102 wounded. There were 41 enemy killed (body count) and 37 additional enemy probably killed.

2. About 3 miles northeast of hill 117, on the southern edge of the DMZ, other Hickory forces discovered 40 bunkers and connecting tunnel lines. Another 30 bunkers were discovered about 1/2 mile east of that position. Neither complex was occupied and complete information on the rest of the search is not yet available.

3. An observation aircraft on station at midnight, in support of Operation "Hickory", was fired on by .50 caliber and 37 millimeter weapons from the vicinity of the mouth of the Ben Hai river. The pilot called artillery on the location from which firing had originated and observed a number of secondary explosions. Fires in the area continued to burn until 3 o'clock in the morning.

4. Operation UNION II commenced early on the morning of the 26th with elements of the 5th Marine Regiment, an ARVN Task Force, and the 6th ARVN Regiment. The operation is being conducted in the same geographical area as where Operation UNION I recently terminated.

5. In Operation THUNDER DRAGON, the 3d Company, 2nd ROK Brigade, engaged an unknown number of enemy in well fortified positions about 19 miles south of Chu Lai. The results of this contact were 38 enemy killed and 2 weapons captured.

1. Major ANDERSON passed the following:

Artillery and air strikes called to support units maneuvering against enemy position. Initial casualty report: USMC - 17 KIA, 40 WIA; Enemy - 128 KIA (Conf), 199 KIA (Prob). Contact continues. 14 helos received hits in the LZ. Two helos are down in the LZ but are repairable and under guard.

THE HIGH LEVEL OF THE DAY'S ACTIVITY CONTINUED THE PATTERN OF THE PAST WEEK, WHEN FIXED WING OPERATIONS IN THE SEVEN DAY PERIOD INCLUDED 1524 STRIKE SORTIES, 437 OF WHICH WERE CONTROLLED BY GROUND RADAR TEAMS UNDER CONDITIONS OF LIMITED VISIBILITY. ALL TOLD, THESE TACTICAL STRIKES KILLED 137 VC/NVA (CONF) AND PROBABLY KILLED 172 OTHERS. ADDITIONALLY, 499 STRUCTURES, 117 BUNKERS AND 23 GUN POSITIONS WERE CONFIRMED AS DESTROYED BETWEEN 18 AND 25 MAY.

1. The total enemy killed in Operation Hickory has now been set as 362 confirmed and 528 probable, plus 108 weapons captured. A number of the Marine units which participated in Hickory have now shifted their operations westward from Con Thien to join Operation Prairie IV. Shortly before noon on the 29th, two companies of 4th Marines made heavy contact on Hill 174, about 4 miles west of Con Thien. Hill 174 is about 1.5 miles southwest of Hill 117, where elements of the 4th and 26th Marines had an intense two day battle (fire fight) before seizing the hill on Saturday the 27th. The enemy encountered on the 29th on Hill 174 were in mutually supporting bunkers with connecting trenches and fighting holes. By late afternoon on the 29th the Marines had taken the hill and the enemy broke contact. The number of enemy killed confirmed thus far is 13 and another 9 probable.

2. Also on the 29th, 2,000 additional refugees began evacuation from two hamlets near Gio Linh, to the Cam Lo resettlement center. Cholera and plague inoculations for the refugees continue.

3. It appears that the enemy may be beginning to focus attention on the CUA VIET River, which connects Dong Ha with the South China Sea. Earlier in the month, on the 9th of May, a U. S. Army dredge hit two mines in the mouth of the CUA VIET. It has now been learned through agents that a meeting was held last week by Viet Cong who live along the river, to distribute anti-tank and under-water mines. The mines are to be placed in the river at choke points and fording area.

4. Operation Union II shifted its effort southward. 1/5 was lifted to positions 12 miles west of Tam Ky beginning early on the 30th. They are to be followed by 3/5 who will land in the same general area. Other 5th Marines elements will establish blocking positions, while ARVN units sweep westward toward the Marines.

1. Marines in Operation UNION II made heavy contact yesterday in the relatively open region west of Thang Binh and Tam Ky. This is the same general area where the recently completed operation UNION I accounted for 865 enemy confirmed killed and another 777 probable killed from 2 regular NV regiments. About noon on the 2d, Marines of UNION II succeeded in making contact with other elements of the 2 NVA regiments in heavily fortified positions apparently waiting for the Marines. In addition, a large number of the NVA troops were detected to the rear of the fortified positions, apparently on the way to reinforce them. Air and arty of all caliber including 175MM guns from Tam Ky were brought to bear. Intense ground action followed through the afternoon and night. As of noon on the 3d, 117 enemy bodies had already been counted, however, continuing contact prevented accurate count of the large numbers of additional enemy bodies in the nearby rice paddies. Now committed to Operation UNION II are 3 Marine Bn's, 2 ARVN Regiments and an RVN Ranger TF.
2. Operation BEAR BITE, an amphibious Operation carried out by Marine SLF-A, SE of Quang Tri, continued without significant contact; however, an RVN Bn from Opn LAM SON 63, the Vietnamese companion operation, made contact with estimated enemy Bn. Preliminary results were 150 enemy killed, 2 prisoners cptrd and 30 weapons seized. The contact was terminated shortly after noon on the 2d. Farther to the south, a Marine Bn from Operation CHOCTAW, was maintaining blocking positions, south of the direction of advance of the SLF Marines.
3. A little before midnight on the 2d, other Marines from Operation CHOCTAW, about 9 miles southeast of Quang Tri received 2 moderately heavy probing attacks. Results of the attacks were 10 enemy confirmed killed and 16 more probable killed.
4. Operation CUMBERLAND was launched on the morning of the 3d. CUMBERLAND will be a clearing operation by elements of the 4th Marines to provide security for engineer development of the road extending into the mountains west of Hue. An inland fire support base, will be developed about 15 miles from Hue, to deliver 175MM gun fire into the ASHAU valley.

(4) OPERATION UNION II (FIRST MARINE DIVISION)

(A) THE FIFTH MARINES TERMINATED SEARCH AND DESTROY OPERATIONS IN QUANG NAM AND QUANG TIN PROVINCE WITH LIGHT CONTACT REPORTED FOR THE PERIOD. DURING THE PERIOD, RECONNAISSANCE TEAMS ACCOUNTED FOR ELEVEN VC KILLED (CONF) AND FIFTEEN VC KILLED (PROB). SIX DETAINEES WERE CLASSIFIED AS PW/VC.

(B) IN SUPPORT OF OPERATION UNION II, FIXED WING AIRCRAFT FLEW 7 SORTIES CONSISTING OF 7 DIRECT AIR SUPPORT (4 VISUAL AND 3 TPO-10) SORTIES, WHICH EXPENDED 11.8 TONS OF ORDNANCE. HELICOPTERS FLEW 109 SORTIES TRANSPORTING 79 PERSONNEL AND 11.3 TONS ON CARGO. ARTILLERY UNITS FIRED 100 MISSIONS AND 459 ROUNDS OF AMMUNITION IN SUPPORT OF INFANTRY OPERATIONS.

(A) AT 0700H, THE SECOND BATTALION OF THE SECOND ROKMC BRIGADE (WITH COMPANIES 5, 6, AND 7) COMMENCED A SEARCH AND DESTROY OPERATION IN QUANG NGAI PROVINCE WITH LIGHT CONTACT REPORTED FOR THE PERIOD. AT 0945H, THE 6TH COMPANY (BS 640934) DETONATED AN UNKNOWN TYPE EXPLOSIVE DEVICE RESULTING IN ONE KMC KIA AND ONE KMC WIA. AT 1530H, THE SECOND BATTALION CALLED AN AIR STRIKE ON AN UNKNOWN NUMBER OF VC (BS 630954). FIVE VC WERE KILLED (CONF). DURING THE PERIOD, TWO MINES WERE FOUND AND DESTROYED IN PLACE.

(B) IN SUPPORT OF OPERATION ANGRY DRAGON, FIXED WING AIRCRAFT FLEW 17 SORTIES. HELICOPTERS FLEW 112 SORTIES TRANSPORTING 120 PERSONNEL AND 16.8 TONS OF CARGO. ARTILLERY UNITS FIRED 14 MISSIONS AND 168 ROUNDS OF AMMUNITION IN SUPPORT OF INFANTRY OPERATIONS. NAVAL GUNFIRE FIRED FIVE MISSIONS AND EXPENDED 114 ROUNDS OF AMMUNITION.
