



- 1. As result of SecDef conference at CINCPAC 6 May 1963, it was decided to transfer 24 Marine UH-34D Helicopters to the Republic of Viet Nam. The primary reason for transfer of USMC helicopters (as opposed to Army H-34's) is that they were physically present in Viet Nam (T. E. 79. 3. 3. 6) and transfer of these aircraft could be readily effected. Accordingly, present plans are to withdraw the Marine Helicopter Task Group (T. E. 79. 3. 3. 6) from South Viet Nam (less 24 UM-34D's and associated equipment to operate these aircraft) on 30 June 1964. This Task Group will return to MCAS Futema, Okinawa and HMM-364 will be reoutfitted with aircraft and equipment which are at Futema for this purpose. MAG-16 will then have one squadron operating aboard the LPH as part of the Special Landing Force and two HMM squadrons at Futema.
- 2. A decision to retain the Marine Helicopter Task Group in South Viet Nam will not create any major problems. In that aircraft and equipment required to replace that which is to be turned over to VNAF will be on site in Okinawa by 30 June (the current date for relief of T. E. 79.3.3.6), the only significant action required would be an onward movement of these replacement aircraft and associated support equipment to South Viet Nam. This is within 1stMAW/7th Fleet resources to accomplish.
- 3. The COMUSMACY message at Tab A proposes to relocate the U. S. Marine Squadron to the southern area (III Corps, 7th Div) of South Viet Nam if retained. While this area is more "active" than our present area around Danang, there are certain advantages

relating to an improved Marine Corps posture for larger contingencies in South Viet Nam which tend to indicate that we should press for retention of the squadron at Danang. These reasons are set forth in greater detail in the dispatch at Tab B. If general helicopter reinfercement of the delta area is desired, the RVNAF squadron which we are "equipping" at Danang could be deployed to that area.



- 1. A Marine project has been conducted during the past several months in VMO-6 at Camp Pendleton where the T-28 aircraft has been evaluated in the role of a Light Armed Reconnaissance Aircraft. The project has determined that the T-28, while limited in rough field capability, is suitable in this role. Minor aircraft modifications were recommended in order to make the aircraft more suitable. Evaluation of the aircraft has been accomplished with the objective of augmenting present CTE 79.3.3.6 capability. It is firmly believed that effective helicopter escort can be adequately provided with these aircraft if put under the operational control of CTE 79.3.3.6.
- 2. Reference (a) stated that augmentation of CTE 79.3.3.6 with additional aircraft and personnel might not be feasible in light of present studies to reduce personnel in RVN. Reference (b) recommended study of use of A-1G (AD-5N) aircraft for such support. Reference (c) recommends T-28's replace O-1B (OE-1) aircraft in RVN if personnel levels are a major problem and non-concurs with the introduction of A-1G (AD-5N) aircraft for this mission in light of maintenance and logistic support required. Reference (d) recommends employment of A-1 (AD) aircraft for the mission from 7th Fleet resources and further recommends shore-basing the aircraft, if required. Reference (e) concurs with these recommendations.
- 3. Reference (f) recommends that four T-28 aircraft be assigned CTE 79.3.3.6 for test. As a result of this message CINCPAC will probably concur and state a requirement to CNO which will then clear the way.

#### TALKING PAPER

MINIECT: Weekly Vietnom Briefing (U)

- 1. (U) Purpose. This paper provides information on operational activities in the Republic of Vietnam and it is based primarily upon CONUMNACV's Headway Report for the period 3115002 July 1963 071600 August 1963.
- 2. (8) Friendly Activity. RVM initiated ground operations decreased for the second consecutive week since initiation of phase II of the Mational Genpaign plan at 1 July 1963. Battalian and larger-size operations decreased by one (from 65 last week to 64 for this pariod). However, the total remains well above the weekly average of 19 operations conducted during the mouth of August 1962. The number of small-unit actions decreased by 12 percent (from 3116 to 2742); however, the number of small-unit actions with VC contact increased by five percent (from 100 to 104). This decrease in operational activity is raflected in reduced casualties inflicted on the VC, which dropped from 726 for the previous period to 546 for this week.
- a. Status of Infentry Battalions. As of 30 July 1963, EVNAP had the equivalent of 130 infentry battalions available for duty. Of this total, 10 are in training, 22 on Static accurity (not available for operations), 28 on other occurity (available for operations) and 61 were conducting or supporting offensive operations. The remaining 9 battalions were engaged in miscellancous activity not included in the above catagories.





S. (S) Over-all evaluation. Despite chart periods of intense activity, WE offensive actions have decreased by over 13 percent over the first clumonths of 1963, when compared with the first six months of 1962. GVM actions have improved. GVM easualties have increased during this period partially due to more aggressive actions on their part. GVM venpon losses continue as a problem, but even this factor has improved on a statistical basis. The greater portion of GVM venpon losses came as the result of a few well conducted VE actions. While the VC continue to maintain the capability of conducting large scale attacks, and even to control some sections of the sountry. GVM forces continue to improve their offensive capability.



Since 15 April 1962, Marine Aviation units have been deployed in support of the Government of Viet Nam. One Medium Helicopter Squadron of the First Marine Aircraft Wing plus supporting units was deployed to Soc Trang on the 15th of April where they operated until mid-September 1962. At that time the squadron was relocated to Da Nang which is located in the mountainous northern region of Viet Nam.

The mission of Marine units is to provide support to the Government of Viet Nam forces in their struggle against the Viet Cong guerrillas. Due to the nature of the terrain and the requirement for surprise in the conduct of guerrilla warfare, the support being given consists of the helicopter lift of Government of Viet Nam forces to landing zones in the interior from where they conduct operations against the guerrillas.

Since April of 1962 there have been three Marine helicopter squadrons deployed to Viet Nam; HMM-362, HMM-163, HMM-162. Squadrons on duty with the First Marine Aircraft Wing are currently spending approximately six months of their overseas tour in Viet Nam.

Statistically, from April of 1962 through 18 May 1963 the Marine squadrons have flown 21,865 hours in lifting 126,000 troops and 4 1/2 million pounds of cargo. A total of 118 hits have been received by Marine aircraft, however only one helicopter has been lost due to the effects of Viet Cong gunfire.

SECRET

Each squadron deployed to Viet Nam has an assigned allowance of 24 UH-34D helicopters. The average strength of the Marine aviation units in Viet Nam is approximately 420 officers and men.

Operations in Viet Nam have proved to be an excellent testing ground for the Marine Corps developed concepts of vertical envelopment, and for the development of new concepts. In this connection, a project has been conducted during the past several months at VMO-6, Camp Pendleton where the T-28 aircraft has been undergoing evaluation as a Light Armed Reconnaissance Aircraft. The project has determined that the T-28, whole limited in rough field capability is suitable in this role. Minor aircraft modifications have been recommended in order to make the aircraft more suitable to the expected mission. It is expected that a firm requirement for this type aircraft will be made known and that some of these aircraft will be assigned to the Marine aviation units in Viet Nam.

The Marine Corps has continued to exhibit an interest in the arming of helicopters. The Army UH-18 helicopters operating in Viet Nam have provision for external armament consisting of gun packages and have been used with some effect. However, at present there have been no conclusive reports.



- 1. The following casualties are the official figures reported by the Marine Corps:
  - a. Casualties caused as the result of Enemy Action:
    - (1) Killed 10 (5 officers, 5 enlisted) (9 million had a thick)
    - (2) Injured 31 (\*19 officers, 12 enlisted)

\*One officer injured on two separate occasions.

- b. Casualties not as the result of Enemy Action:
  - (1) Killed 7 (3 officers, 4 enlisted)
  - (2) Injured 3 (2 officers, 1 enlisted)

- 1. How many Marine Helicopters are there, and what is their mission?
- a. There are 27 UH34D helicopters. The mission of the helicopter task element is as follows:
- (1) Provide helicopter support to the military forces of the Republic of Vietnam in maintaining internal control of the country.
- (2) Advise the U. S. MAAG personnel and supported ARVN forces on the proper employment and suitability of helicopters in counter guerrilla operations.
- (3) Insure the employment of attached helicopters and liaison aircraft is in accordance with FMFM-24 (Helicopter Operations).
- (4) Develop and evaluate tactics and equipment to improve the effectiveness of helicopter operations.
- (5) Operate and maintain base facilities and services for an advance base to support the element or squadron deployed thereon.

- 1. Figures provided Mr. McGiffert and Dr. Schwebs were those provided by the CEG (Mr. Sessler) Quantico. The figures are based on the operations of 12 73.3.6 only.
- 2. These figures are subject to error due to misinterpretation of the operational summaries from which derived. This office has subsequently reviewed the summaries with the OEG at Quantico and have detected only one significant error. The 1 KIA reported due to enemy action, OpSum 043, was not KIA but wII. Accordingly, there should be no KIA as a result of enemy action and there should be 5 pilots KIA as the result of operational accidents (OpSums 024, 048, 078).
- 3. Attention is invited to the fact that total figures are ostensibly those previously reported.



#### **Helicopter Operations** Data

- 1. Mr. Grains of your office made an inquiry regarding casualty data previous submitted to your office on 11 May 1964. Figures submitted were the from the operational summaries of the Marine element in the Republic of Viet Nam without reference to other staff sections of this Headquarters. It has been determined that the Casualty Reporting Branch of this Headquarters did report nine (9) Marines killed as a result of enemy action, that this office reported as an operational accident. The reason for this office reporting the accident as operational was due to the fact that it was a suspected mid-air collision and the subsequent investigation that fallowed the accident indicated that the cause could not be determined.
- 2. The three (3) USA personnel included in the figures submitted by this office were a part of the Marine task element. Subsequent Navy action listed the Navy personnel as killed as a result of enemy action and the casualty reporting branch adjusted their figures accordingly.
- 3. A review of the material previously submitted has been conducted and the figures submitted are correct consistent with the operational summaries from which derived. A revised data sheet with explanatory notes is attached for your convenience.
