NARRATIVE SUMMARY

- GENERAL. (U) During the period 1-31 October 1966, Marine Wing Headquarters Group One continued to provide 1st Marine Aircraft Wing with support in air control, air defense, administration and maintenance of Wing Headquarters camp facilities.
- PERSONNEL. (C) The 1st and 2nd LAAM Battalions were in a C-3 (marginal combat ready) condition during the month. It is anticipated that sufficient trained personnel will join this command during November to upgrade them to a C-2 condition. The advanced detail of MASS-3 arrived in RVN during October and are located in Chu Lai. The remainder of MASS-3 is expected to join MWHG-1 in November.
- ADMINISTRATION. (U) Routine administration progressed through out the month of October.
- MORALE/WELFARE. (U) Liberty remained secured in DaNang and Hoa Phut Village, outside the DaNang Air Base, throughout the month of October. The beach facilities in the DaNang/Chu Lai areas were open to all hands which provided the majority of recreation for personnel. 8. GROUND DEFENSE. (C) Bunkers in Tango Security Sector are being repaired and/or rebuilt.

9. TRAINING. (U)

a. General Military Subjects Training was conducted by all units of this Command.

b. Troop information lectures were also given as well as the orientation/indoctrination lectures for all newly arrived personnel.

10. NBC DEFENSE. (U) A check for defective M5A1 and M5A3 Protective and Treatment Kits was completed.

11. COMMUNICATION - ELECTRONICS. (U)

a. During October 39,606 outgoing messages were transmitted by electrical means, incoming 37,985.

b. Three communication personnel were sent to the Phillippines on 11 Oct for "Operation File Cabinet" and returned from TAD on 31 October.

c. Five personnel, 2541/2543 TAD, 15 October for period of about one week to assist 1st Marine Division in installation and operation of their communication center.

d. Wing Radio/Relay and 3rd Marine Division established a circuit to PHU BAI, RVN while the Air Force TRC-80 was undergoing repairs.

e. Communication Section, H&HS-1 continues to have a Communication Detachment of eight personnel at Dong Ha in support of "Operation PRAIRIE".

f. Wire section installed a twenty-five pair cable from the 1st MAW CP to the Air Force 197 2nd Communication Squadron. Answered 104 trouble calls, completed 12 work requests and installed a remote cable from the 1st MAW Comm center and TACC to the 1st MAW Radio Central.

g. Group teletype technicians assisted MAG-16, in their off duty hours, in installing and rewiring their teletype and crypto shelter. This phase of communication with MAG-16 has shown a marked improvement.

h. Group has requested a special allowance for Power Supply, PP-388/u. At present, Group Headquarters has one such power supply, but the increased need for 24 volt power has necessitated the need for an additional three units.

12. CIVIC ACTION. (U)

a. There were 196 Fleet Home Town News Releases, and 14 stories forwarded to Wing ISO.

13. LOGISTICS. (C)

a. The redistribution of group assets has solved the MASS-2 400 cycle generator problems and provided a back-up for ASRT & DASC generators. However, the overall Group 400 cycle generator problem remains critical.

b. 15 trucks/drivers from 1st LAAM Bn participated in a Rough Rider Convoy from Danang to Phu Bai.

c. The generator situation of both LAAM Battalions remains critical. 60 cycle generators for communication and lighting and 400 cycle generators for HAWK radios continue to be deadlined for lack of spare parts.

d. Tin roofed tropical huts have been completed for all 2nd LAAM Battalion battery billeting and it is expected that H&S Battery tropical hut construction will be completed by 15 November.

e. Building rehabilitation by MCB-58 in the TANGO Sector has been delayed awaiting funding approval. MCB-9 is presently repairing TANGO Sector buildings as well as constructing 4 new buildings.

f. While the availability of $\frac{1}{4}$ ton trucks has been reduced by vehicle accidents and increased Wing Staff requirements, 80% of all requests for transportation have been filled within 10 minutes of request.

8. MISCELLANEOUS INFORMATION

a. MGen ROBERTSHAW[^] toured Ky Hoa Island with the 2ndLAAMBn Civil Affairs Officer on 5Oct66.

b. On 27Oct66, the maternity clinic was dedicated in the village of Ky Hoa on Ky Hoa Island. Mr. Hieu, the village chief, and all the island officials were present as well as Captain Be the district chief of Ly Tin. LtCol GUNNING, CO of 2ndLAAMBn, Capt CHESSON, civil affairs officer, and SSgt LEMOS, civil affairs NCO, were presented with Vietnamese paintings by the Vietnamese officials for their assistance in the construction of the clinic.

c. The Phuoc Tan Hamlet elementary school was dedicated on 10Oct66. MGen ROBERTSHAW, Colonel ATWATER and Commander HAMMERL represented the Marine Corps and representing the Vietnamese were the Director of the Worldwide Catholic Charitable Organization, CARITAS, in DaNang, the hamlet chief and Father Chau. The 1st MAW Band provided music as did the children of the hamlet who sang at the beginning and end of the dedication program. Approximately 500 attended the ceremonies. H&HS-1 assisted the villagers in construction of the school.

d. A dedication ceremony was held on 19Oct66 at Xuan Hoa Hamlet for the medical dispensary constructed by the villagers. Attending the ceremony were the hamlet chief, the CO of 1stLAAMBn, the civil affairs officer and the CO of "C" Battery who assisted in the project.

e. A civic afternoon was conducted by 1stLAAMBn at Phu Loc Hamlet #2. Approximately 500 people attended. The 1stMAW Band presented a one-half hour concert. Food and toys were distributed by 1stLAAMBn and the Army PsyWar Team passed out comic books. Speeches were made by the hamlet chief and Chaplain DAVIS of 1stLAAMBn.

f. Two hundred (200) plague shots were given by MACS-7 at Trung Toan Hamlet to help check the plague outbreak and prevent it from spreading from San Hai Hamlet. Rat specimens obtained from both hamlets were examined in DaNang which resulted in positive findings. On 14Oct66, the Preventative Medicine Unit from "B" Medical Battalion sprayed the hamlet. Several Vietnamese were treated as possible victims. No outbreak of plague resulted in the hamlet.

g. A Vietnamese nurse began working with 1stLAAMBn on 5Oct66. She received her training at USOM Hospital, DaNang, and previously worked at an Army Special Forces Camp in DaNang.

h. MACS-7 is training one Vietnamese woman to assist their corpsmen in treating people at Trung Toan Hamlet.

i. The Venerable Monk of Phuoc Tuong Buddhist Elementary School invited the 1stLAAMBn CO, Captain SILVA and Lieutenant GASIOR to dinner at the school on 7Oct66.

j. 1stLAAMBn delivered four sheets of plywood and one gallon of paint to Stella Maris Orphanage for construction of blackboards.

k. One male and one child were evacuated from MWHG-1 dispensary to NSA Hospital and "C" Medical Battalion respectively.

l. MEDCAPS are conducted at the following locations:

m. MEDCAP Teams within MWHG-1 conducted 66 medical sick calls during October. 809 Vietnamese were treated at the Dispensary and 24 at the Dental Clinic.

n. MWHG-1 has the overall responsibility for 11 hamlets.

Subj: Command Chronology for October

1. Religious Services

a. Protestant. LCDR William J. Wright, CHC, USNR is the Protestant Chaplain for MWHG-1.

1) Sunday. The following services are held at Wing Chapel: 0930 General Protestant, 1400 RLDS, 1600 Episcopal, 1400 Lutheran, and 1830 Protestant. Attendance for Protestant Services at the Wing Chapel totaled 282.

2) Week Day. Activities of the week include worship sessions and study discussion groups at 1830 attendance for October was 227.

3) I held a Protestant Monthly Rally on 23 October at the MCB-10 Chapel. There were 157 people present for this meeting. This included men from Navy and Marine Units as well as Air Force, Army and Missionaries from the DaNang area.

4) Lectures. One (1) indoctrination was given.

b. Catholic. CDR Paul C. Hammerl, CHC, USN, Wing Chaplain for the FMAW, serves as priest for MWHG-1.
