NARRATIVE SUMMARY

1. GENERAL. (U) During the period 1-31 January 1967, Marine Wing Headquarters Group One continued to provide 1st Marine Aircraft Wing with support in air control, air defense, administration and maintenance of Wing Headquarters camp facilities.

2. PERSONNEL. (C) During the month of January 1st and 2d IAW Battalions and MACS-7 joined sufficient trained personnel to off-set normal rotation losses and remain in a C-2 condition. MACS-3 remained in a C-1 category.

3. ADMINISTRATION. (U) Routine administration progressed through out the month of January.

4. MORALE/WEWFARE. (U) Liberty remained secured in DaNang and Hoa Phut Village, outside the DaNang Air Base, through out the month of January. The beach facilities in the DaNang/Chu Lai areas were open to all hands and provided the majority of recreation for personnel. Rest and Recuperation flights to the following locations were conducted during January:

11. COMMUNICATIONS - ELECTRONICS. (C)

a. The total outgoing messages transmitted over crypto covered circuits was 52,093. Incoming 52,438.

b. The Communication Technical Control Coordinator handled 731 trouble calls within the Wing communications system.

c. During the month of January the Comm-Elect Section hosted the FTFac Electronics Maintenance Instruction Team (26-28Jan), the FTFac Dial Central Office Survey Team (29-30Jan) and the FTFac Radar Assistance Team (30-31Jan).

d. On January 25th two IRC-62 Radio Relay Teams, with equipment, were dispatched to MACS-7 to participate in operation "De Soto".

12. CIVIC ACTION. (U) See Appendix (1) to this enclosure.13. LOGISTICS. (C)

a. Group S-4 fulfilled its requirement for MACRON 6 ASRT. The equipment was gathered from within the Group and air shipped to Okinawa on 26 January.

b. The rehabilitation program in Tango Sector is moving rapidly. FCB-58 personnel are working on several buildings at the same time and have completed five enlisted barracks, G-2, G-3 and the Group Supply warehouse.

c. 1st LAAM Bn is still in process of displacing to their new site. A conference was held with the Base Development Board and plans were submitted for desired contonment.

d. There has been no improvement in 2d LAAM's 400 cps generator problem, and is still in need of 60cps power. At the present time the battalion contonment is using three FU-239's and one IU-482 generator. The 60KW is more appropriate and would release the smaller generators for outlying battery sites.
