Narrative Summary

1. General. (U) During the period 1 - 31 July 1967, Marine Wing Headquarters Group One continued to provide 1st Marine Aircraft Wing with support in air control, air defense, administration and maintenance of Wing Headquarters Camp Facilities.
2. Personnel. (C) MASS-2, MASS-3, MACS-4 and 2nd LAM Bn all joined sufficient trained personnel to offset normal rotation losses and remain in a C-1 category. HETS-1 and 1st LAM Bn remained in a C-2 condition.
3. Administration. (U) Routine Administration progressed throughout the month of July.
4. Morale/Welfare. (U) Liberty remained secured in DaNang and Hoa Phut Village, outside the DaNang Air Base, throughout the month of July. The beach facilities in the DaNang/Chu Lai areas were open to all hands and provided the majority of recreation for personnel. In country R&R was provided at China Beach and there were one day cultural sight-seeing trips to HUE, along with one day fishing trips every Wednesday and Saturday. R&R flights to the following locations were conducted during the month of June:

5. Casualties. (C) During the month of July there were 57 non-hostile casualties and 11 hostile casualties. The sharp increase over previous months attributed to the rocket attack of 15 July 1967 and the 11 personnel injured in the accident involving a 1st LAM truck coming down hill 724 from "A" Battery.

6. Intelligence. (U) The Group S-2 completed the below items:

- 4 Top Secret Clearances were requested
- 3 Top Secret Clearances were issued
- 12 Secret Clearances were requested
- 36 Secret Clearances were issued

10. Ground Defense. (U) On 15 July, DaNang AB came under rocket attack. Tango Sector took no direct hits but recieved exterior and interior building damage from secondary explosions.

11. Civic Action. (U) See Appendix (1) to this enclosure.

12. Logistics. (C)

a. MACS-7 departed RVN with supplies and equipment.

b. The helo pad at 1st IAAW Bn "C" Btry was rebuilt.

c. A security fence is being constructed around Hill 327 perimeter by personnel of HEHS-1.

d. A SeaHut has been constructed for "C" Btry, 1st IAAW Bn for radio relay equipment.

e. Tango Sector (ALPHA) rehabilitation progresses satisfactorily.

13. Communication-Electronics. (U)

a. The total outgoing messages transmitted over crypto-covered circuits was 50,164. In coming messages totaled 52,135.

b. A 25 pair cable was installed between the TADC and Radio Central for improvement of radio circuits.

4. MONTHLY CIVIL AFFAIRS REGR/RS.

a. H&ES-1

The Civic Action Team from H&ES-1 has conducted the following at Hue Tien Refugee Camp. Medops by a company from Fortnot 5, 4th Special Medical Team and 1st LAM Bn. Medical Team gave the camp much needed medical help.

150 tons of soap and 4 tons of clothes were distributed and a well was constructed but not finished because of the lack of water. With the water supply diminishing, the Civic Action Team together with the chief and two other refugees, dug the well approximately 2 feet deeper to allow for more water. A new well casing was also constructed. The well was repaired under the 4th teams supervision.

English classes for adults and children in English language classes to be conducted for the next three days a week. The classes will only be held once a week for the next three days of the month.

b. MASS-2

During the month, MASS-2's medcorp team reported 935 patients at Hoa My Hamlet and distributed 1000 bars of soap to 1000 people of the hamlet. Future plans call for the completion of the aid station already under construction in the Hoa My Hamlet and English language classes to be held at Hoa My School. School kits have been ordered from the Wing CMO as have books.

c. 1st LAAM Bn.

On 1 July, a piano purchased with the funds from Miss Helen Janick of Gary, Ind., from church funds and from donations of the battalion, was presented to the Sacred Heart Orphanage. Fifty-two reams of paper were given to the RVN Hospital at DaNang. Refugees from Hoa Tien Refugee Camp were employed six days a week filling sandbags and were paid with foodstuffs.

On 14 July, a 2½ ton truckload of wood and 5 bags of cement were given to the Houng Young IV School and on the 27th, another truckload of lumber was delivered. A truckload of scrap lumber was delivered to the Sacred Heart Clinic also.

d. MACS-4

During the month, Hoa Tien refugees filled over 30,000 sandbags and were paid 93 bags of Bulgar, 5 bags of flour and 22 cans of salad oil. There were no medcorps during the month.

e. 2nd LAAM Bn.

During the month, 2 dump trucks from the 9th Engineers were used daily to haul laterite to Ky Hoa Island. The laterite is intended to strengthen the sandy roads before the monsoons make them impassible. The Hoa Long dispensary is progressing rapidly and advisers from Tam-Ky are supervising the foundation and wall construction. Materials have been provided for the construction of pens for 4 Yorkshire Pigs for the Hog Improvement Program on Ky Hoa. Food for the pigs is provided by the battalion messhall.

English classes are held weekly at Hoa My, Hoa Long and Ky Hoa. Future plans are to continue road improvement, new school structure on Hoa Thanh Island and increasing the English classes to twice a week.

f. 11th Dental Co.

The 11th Dental Co. is sending 2 student nurses to night school to complete their high school education and is contributing \$2000VN a month for their education. During the month they treated 3920 dental patients and have 1 Vietnamese nurse at H&MS-1 dental clinic undergoing Dental Training. They also evacuated 12 people for medical treatment. The English classes are held once a week with 31 people attending.

1. Divine Services

a. Roman Catholic Mass was said in the Wing Memorial Chapel through the month of July by Wing Chaplain Ferreri. Sunday Masses (0800 and 1745) had a total attendance of 561. Daily Mass at 1730 totaled 155.

b. Protestant services were held at 1000 Sundays and 1830 Monday through Saturday. Sunday attendance was 223, with 263 attending during the week.

c. Episcopalian services were conducted each Sunday at 1600.

d. Orthodox services were conducted the 1st and 3rd Sundays at 1100.

2. Personnel

a. Chaplain Peter J. Ferreri, CDR, CHC, USN, Wing Chaplain serves as Roman Catholic Chaplain for MWHG-1.

b. Chaplain William J. Winslow, LCDR, CHC, USN, Admin-Assistant to the Wing Chaplain is now serving as the Group Chaplain.

3. Civic Action

a. Chaplain Winslow donated \$150.00, 40 lbs. of food stuffs, and two boxes of clothes to the Baptist Mission in Danang. Chaplain Winslow also donated \$150.00 and 30 lbs. of food stuff to WEC and 30 lbs. of food stuff to CMA.

b. Group Chaplain Winslow gave 2 Indoctrination Lectures with 35 attending.
