Narrative Summary

1. General (U) During the period 1 - 31 August 1967, Marine Wing Headquarters Group One continued to provide 1st Marine Aircraft Wing with support in air control, air defense, administration and maintenance of Wing Headquarters Camp Facilities.

2. Personnel (C) MASS-2, MASS-3, MACS-4 and 2nd LAAM Bn all joined sufficient trained personnel to offset normal rotation losses and remain in a C-1 category. H&HS-1 and 1st LAAM Bn remained in a C-2 condition.

3. Administration (U) Routine Administration progressed throughout the month of August.

4. Morale/Welfare (U) Liberty remained secured in DaNang and Hoa Phut Village, outside the DaNang Air Base, throughout the month of August. The beach facilities in the DaNang/Chu Lai areas were open to all hands and provided the majority of recreation for personnel. In country R&R was provided at China Beach and there were one day cultural sight-seeing trips to Hue and DaNang City, along with one day fishing trips every Wednesday and Saturday. R&R flights to the following locations were conducted during the month of August:

12. Logistics (C)

a. Beds, mattresses, pillows, clothing lockers and trunk lockers have been requested from Public Works Facility to complete installation of garrison property at H&S and "B" Battery sites. Bunks and mattresses have been furnished "C" Battery.

b. Seven (7) Bunkers (8'x8'x8') Advance Base Functional Components (ABFC) have been requested for Tango Sector Alpha-1st MAW Hq. perimeter defense.

b. During August, 1967, a total of 476 troubles over 1st MAW communications circuits were handled by Facilities Control.

c. During the period 10-11 Aug 1967, a 5-man Inspection Team visited MASS-2 units for inspection/ assistance of communication-maintenance facilities.

d. Two MRC-62 radio relay teams dispatched to 1st MarDiv in support of Operation COCHISE during 9-31 Aug 67.

4. MONTHLY CIVIL AFFAIRS RECORDS

a. H&HS-1

During the month of August, H&HS-1 held dental medevacs at the OPR compound in Hoa Cuong Village and treated 107 patients. Rope was provided to finish a swing set being built in the Ho Tien Refugee Camp for the children. The clean-up campaign in the refugee camp is continually in progress.

b. 1st LAAM Bn.

Refugees were employed from the Ho Tien Refugee Camp for 2 weeks of time. Materials were sold in quantities; 24 bags of flour and 46 bags of kerosene oil. Ten bags of oats and ten bags of cement were donated to the orphaned Heart Orphanage this month. Two school kits were presented to Boung Truong IV School and ten bags of cement were donated to finish the floor of the dispensary.

c. MASS-2

During the month of August, MASS-2 Civil Affairs Team treated 945 patients and distributed 2000 bars of soap to Vietnamese civilians.

d. MASS-3

During the month, a census was taken of Trung Toan for the purpose of better soap distribution and medical attention. Sixteen softballs were distributed to the village children. An inspection tour of the wells found them clean and in good condition. On the 27th, twelve children were taken to the beach for a party by this section.

e. 11th Dental Co.

This unit is training 1 Viet nurse in the MWHG-1 clinic and 2 at USONN Hospital. Dental rehabilitation of a 14year old Viet boy who suffered facial wounds from the Viet Cong during an attack on Di Loc is continuing. He is furnished food, clothing, etc. and will be returned to his village through the assistance of the wing chaplain. A project to build a nurse dormitory at USONN Hospital is in progress.

1. Divine Services

a. Roman Catholic Mass was said in the Wing Memorial Chapel through the month of August by Wing Chaplain Ferreri. Sunday Masses (0800 and 1745) had a total attendance of 596. Daily Mass at 1730 totaled 136.

b. Protestant Services were held at 1000 Sundays and 1830 Monday through Saturday. Sunday attendance was 185, with 195 attending during the week.

c. Episcopalian Services were conducted each Sunday at 1600.

d. Orthodox Services were conducted the 1st and 3rd Sundays at 1100.

2. Personnel

a. Chaplain Peter J. Ferreri, CDR, CHC, USN, Wing Chaplain serves as Roman Catholic Chaplain for MWHG-1.

b. Chaplain William J. Winslow, LCDR, CHC, USN, Admin-Assistant to the Wing Chaplain is now serving as the Group Chaplain.

3. Civic Action

a. Chaplain Winslow donated 1 box of soap and 200 tooth brushes to the Buddhist School, 1 box of soap, 1 box of clothes to CMA, and two boxes of clothes to CAP unit.

b. Chaplain Winslow gave 4 Indoctrination Lectures with 78 attending. Chaplain Winslow gave 1 Lecture on the "Religions of Vietnam" with 30 attending.
