Narrative Summary

- General (U) On 1 September 1967 the mission of Marine Wing Headquarters Group One was revised, dropping air defense and air control. The Headquarters Group continued to provide administration, communications, and maintenance of Wing Headquarters Camp Facilities.
- Personnel (C) During the month of September H&HS-1 remained and MWFS-1 was activated in a C-1 condition. MWCS-1 was activated in a C-2 category and remained so throughout the month.
- Administration (U) On 1 September 1967 CMD directed the reorganization of Marine Wing Headquarters Group One, with MASS-2, MASS-3, MACS-4, 1st LAAM Bn, and 2nd LAAM Bn being reassigned to the newly activated Marine Air Control Group Eighteen. H&HS-1 was reorganized to include Wing and Group staff only, and Marine Wing Communications Squadron One and Marine Wing Facilities Squadron One were activated, as squadrons assigned to Marine Wing Headquarters Group One.
- Morale/Welfare (U) Liberty remained secured in DaNang and Hoa Phut Village outside the DaNang Air Base, throughout the month of September. The beach facilities in the DaNang/Chu Lai areas were open to all hands and in-country R&R was provided at China Beach. There were one day cultural sight-seeing trips to HUE, along with one day fishing trips every Wednesday and Saturday. R&R flights to the following locations were conducted during the month of September:

7. Air Operations. (U) No air operations were conducted by MWHG-1 during the month of September.

8. Training. (U)

a. General Military Subjects Training was conducted by all units of this Command during the month of September.

b. Troop Indoctrination lectures for newly arrived personnel and Firearms Indoctrination lectures were administered.

c. The General Military Subjects Training Schedule for the 2nd Quarter, Fiscal Year 1968, was prepared by MWHG-1 (S-3).

d. Technical Training.

(1) On Squadron level technical training took the form of technical instruction and on-the-job training.

9. NBC Defense. (U) No significant events for the month of September.

10. Ground Defense. (U) No significant events for the month of September.

11. Civic Action. (U) See Appendix (1) to this enclosure.

12. Logistics. (C)

a. MWHG-1 has furnished twenty (20) vehicles to MACG-18 from assets on hand from H&HS-1.

b. Generator maintenance and repair/rebuild program is being strongly emphasized with satisfactory results.

c. The rehabilitation program in the Tango Sector Alpha has been delayed due to diversion of Sea Bees to construction projects with higher priorities in units of the Ground Forces.

13. Communication-Electronics. (U)

a. During September 1967, the 1st Marine Aircraft Wing Communication Center handled a total of 113,570 messages. Of this number; 56,003 were outgoing, and 57,567 were incoming; and all were transmitted over crypto-covered circuits.

b. A total of 727 messages were transmitted or received over command/administrative radio nets established in the 1st Marine Aircraft Wing Radio Central.

c. A total of 710 troubles over 1st Marine Aircraft Wing Communications circuits were handled by Facilities Control Coordinator (Moment 69).

d. During the period 9-15 September 1967, a MRC-62 radio relay shot from 1st Marine Aircraft Wing to Hill 63 was established for King Lear traffic.

e. On 26 September 1967, the radio relay terminal located at Panama was relocated to MACS-4



4. MONTHLY RECAPS

a. H&HS-1

During the month of September, H&HS-1 distributed 500 School Kits and four General Walt Scholarships to the students of Hoa Cuong Village. A party was held for the children of the village on the day of the Autumn Festival and 400lbs of food and 200 gals. of kool aid were distributed. 90 lbs of clothing was also distributed in the Refugee Camp for the party. Tin and dunnage has been provided for the Village Headquarters which is 90% completed. Additional tin and plywood is needed. Shower runs are being made for the refugees every Sunday and soap is being issued.

b. 11th Dental Co.

The Dental Civic Action Team provides dental support for the 3 ARVN Signal Battalions in the Danang Area. Two Vietnamese nurses are receiving dental training at USONN Hospital and one at MWHG-1 dental clinic. 11th Dental Co. personnel are reconstructing a private residence in Phu Toung Village. 11th Dental and Wing Supply support 2 student nurses with \$2000VN month.

Subj: Command Chronology for September 1967

1. Divine Services

a. Roman Catholic Mass was said in the Wing Memorial Chapel through the month of September by Wing Chaplain Ferreri. Sunday Masses (0800 and 1745) had a total attendance of 463. Daily Mass at 1200 totaled 92.

b. Protestant Services were held at 1000 Sundays and 1830 Monday through Saturday. Sunday attendance was 183, with 135 attending during the week.

c. Episcopalian Services were conducted each Sunday at 1600.

d. Orthodox Services were conducted the 1st and 3rd Sundays at 1100.

e. Rabbi Kirsh from III MAF holds Jewish Services each Friday evening and Saturday morning.

2. Personnel

a. Chaplain Peter J. Ferreri, CDR, CHC, USN, Wing Chaplain serves as Roman Catholic Chaplain for MWHG-1.

b. Chaplain William J. Winslow, LCDR, CHC, USN, Admin-Assistant to the Wing Chaplain is now serving as the Group Chaplain.

3. Civic Action

a. Chaplain Winslow donated 1 truck load of scrapwood and \$150.00 to the CMA. Chaplain Winslow also gave 5 boxes of clothes, 2 boxes of school supplies, and 60 bags of food stuffs to the Baptist Mission.

b. Chaplain Winslow gave 2 Indoctrination Lectures with 35 attending.
