Part III. Significant Events

1. Morale/Welfare. Liberty remained secure in Danang and Hoa Phut Village outside the Danang Air Base. The beach facilities in the Danang area were open to all hands and in-country R&R was provided at China Beach. There were also one day cultural sightseeing trips to Hue and Danang. Ninety-two personnel participated in the R&R program.

2. Casualties. During the month of November there were eight non-hostile casualties.

3. Training. Transitional training in the care, cleaning and firing of the M16A1 Rifle continued. Officer and staff noncommissioned officer personnel involved with the inspection and supervision of required first and second echelon maintenance, as well as persons to be armed with the weapon are required to receive this training.

4. MONTHLY RECAPS

a. H&HS-1

During the month of November, H&HS-1 delivered crutches to a crippled boy in Hoa Cuong Village and therapy is being provided twice weekly by the Civic Action Team. Five loads of fill were dumped and spread at the refugee camp for better drainage. Two loads of dunnage lumber and 30 bags of cement were used for home and well repairs in the village. Med Cap is held twice weekly by a PF Corpsman and members of the Civic Action Team. Employment is being provided for 8 refugees on the MWHG-1 Compound.

b. 11th Dental Co.

Headquarters Group One of the 11th Dental Co. support two Vietnamese student nurses completing their education with monthly contributions of \$1000VN. Two Vietnamese nurses are receiving dental training at USOM Hospital. One Vietnamese nurse is being trained at MWHG-1 Dental clinic. Project in progress to build a nurses dormitory at USOM Hospital to house 40 nurses.

c. MWCS-1

In conjunction with H&HS-1, MWCS-1 helped spread the fill at the Hoa Tien Refugee Camp.

d. MWFS-1

For the month of November a negative report is submitted.

Subj: Command Chronology for November 1967

1. Divine Services

- a. Roman Catholic Mass was said in the Wing Chapel in the month of November by Wing Chaplain P.J. Ferreri. Sunday Masses (0800 and 1730) had a total attendance of 960. Daily Mass at 1145 totaled 263.
- b. Protestant Services were held at 1000 Sundays and 1830 weekdays. Sunday attendance totals were 178 and weekday totals were 201.
- c. Episcopal Services were conducted each Sunday at 1600.
- d. Orthodox Servies were conducted the 1st and 3rd Sundays of the month.
- e. Jewish Services are held Saturday mornings at III MAF.

2. Personnel

- a. Chaplain P.J. Ferreri, CDR, the wing chaplain, serves as the Roman Catholic Chaplain for MWHG-1
- b. Chaplain William J. Winslow Jr. LCDR, served as the Protestant chaplain. Chaplain Winslow will be detached on Dec 6, 1967 and Chaplain Harper, the Wing Admin-assistant will assume duties as Protestant chaplain for the group also.

3. Civic Action

- a. Chaplain Winslow donated: 10 bags of cement to CMA, 60 bags of food stuffs to DaNang Baptist Mission, 3 boxes of clothes to DaNang Baptist Mission, 1 6x6 load of lumber to ARVN Protestant Chaplain, and 1 box of apples to 5th ARVN social workers.

4. Lectures

- a. Chaplain Winslow gave two Indoctrination Lectures to newly joined personnel. Chaplain Ferreri gave one lecture to newly joined personnel. Total attendance 108.

5. Other Items

- a. Chaplain Winslow was the MC for the " I Corps Chapel of the Air" during November. This program was originated by 1st MAW Chaplains. on January 1, 1968 Chaplain Harper will be the MC and director of the program.
