

Part II. Narrative Summary. During February 1968 this Command and its subordinate units performed our assigned missions of providing administrative, materiel, camp facilities and communications support for the Headquarters, 1st Marine Aircraft Wing, and organic units.

Part III. Significant Events

1. Morale/Welfare. Although liberty remained secured in the Danang area, RON flights to Hong Kong and Bangkok were offered. Additionally, 80 personnel participated in the regular III MAF R&R program.
2. Casualties. During the month of February there were three hostile fatalities and five non-hostile casualties.
3. Training. During this reporting period, training in Basic Military Subjects was conducted and coordinated by the Group Headquarters (S-3). Aggregate attendance for the 5 classes was 275. Training lesson plans for each subject are maintained by the S-3 for use by the individual instructors.

4. MONTHLY RECAPS

a. H&HS-1

During the past month the H&HS-1 Civic Action Team provided material for the repair of three houses and are in the process of building two new houses. One is 80% completed and the other is 50% finished. 4000 loaves of bread, 50 gals. of cooking oil, 500 lbs. of bulgar and 400 lbs. of rice was distributed to the villagers. One American boar hog was obtained for breeding purposes and concrete pig pens were built in the refugee camp for sanitary reasons.

b. 11th Dental Co.

Two Vietnamese nurses are receiving dental training at USOM Hospital and one at the MWHG-1 clinic. The MWHG-1 Dental clinic supports two student nurses with contributions of \$1000VN each monthly. Project in progress to build a student nurses dormitory for 40 nurses at USOM Hospital.

1. Divine Services

- a. Roman Catholic Mass was said in the Wing Chapel in the month of February by Wing Chaplain P. J. Ferreri and later by L. S. Darkowski who reported 12 February to relieve P. J. Ferreri as Wing Chaplain. Sunday Masses (0800 and 1730) had a total attendance of 421. Daily Mass at 1145 totaled 151.
- b. Protestant Services were held at 1000 Sundays and total attendance was 141.
- c. Episcopal Services were conducted each Sunday at 1600.
- d. Orthodox Services were conducted the 1st and 3rd Sundays of the month.
- e. Jewish Services are held Saturday morning at III MAF.

2. Personnel

- a. Chaplain L. S. Darkowski, Capt, the Wing Chaplain, now serves as Roman Catholic Chaplain since Chaplain P. J. Ferreri's departure 27 February 1968.
- b. Chaplain C. D. Harper Jr., Lt, serves as the Protestant Chaplain and Wing Administrative Assistant.

3. Civic Action



4. Lectures

- a. Chaplain Harper gave One Moral Guidance Lecture with an attendance of 18. One Indoctrination Lecture was given to newly joined personnel with 20 attending.

5. Other Items

- a. Chaplain Harper still assumes the responsibility of director and regular host on the I Corps Chapel of the Air, T.V. show sponsored by the 1st MAW Chaplains.
