Two Vietnamese nurses are being supported by monthly contributions at USOM Hospital. Two Vietnamese are receiving training on the MWHG-1 compound.

H&HS-1

During March 8000 lbs. of food and 100 lbs. of soap were distributed in Hoa Cuong Village. Three brick houses are 60% completed and plans are made and material being gathered to start 6 more. Six loads of fill dirt were spread in Hoa Tien Refugee Camp and 6500' of wire fence was strung along the river bank in back of the camp to help protect the refugees. A vet was brought to the village to examine the pigs. 150 packages of seed from the states was given to the refugee camp to start a garden. Paperwork was started to get 6 refugees a job on the MWHG-1 compound.

1. Divine Services

- a. Roman Catholic Services were held in the Wing Memorial Chapel in the month of March by the Wing Chaplain, L.S. Darkowski. Sunday Masses - 0800 - 1730. 20 Masses with total attendance of 840. Week Day Masses 39 with total attendance of 373.
- b. Protestant Services were held at 1000 Sundays. 5 Services with 216 total attendance.
- c. Episcopal Services were conducted at 1600 on Sundays.
- d. Orthodox Services are conducted on the 1st and 3rd Sundays.
- e. L.D.S. Lay Services are conducted at 1900 on Thursdays.
- f. Jewish Services are conducted at 0830 Saturday at III MAF.

2. Personnel

- a. Chaplain L.S. Darkowski, Capt, USN, Wing Chaplain serves as Catholic Chaplain
- b. Chaplain C. D. Harper, Jr. Lt, USNR, Administrative Assistant to the Wing Chaplain gives Protestant coverage to MWHG-1.

3. Civic Action

- a. Chaplain Darkowski participated in the distribution of food and tools to Vietnamese victims of a recent fire. Donated, via Catholic Chapel fund \$150.00 for purchase of Kitchen and eating utensils for fire victims.
- b. Chaplain Harper via Protestant Chapel Fund donated \$150.00 for purchase of Kitchen and eating utensils for fire victims and supervised the distribution of these goods. Also participated in the distribution of food and tools to fire victims.

4. Lectures

- a. Chaplain Darkowski gave two (2) Indoctrination Lectures with fifty-three (53) attending.
- b. Chaplain Harper gave two (2) Indoctrination Lectures with twenty-two (22). Also one (1) moral guidance lecture with forty-five (45) attending.


