

4. Important Visitors to this Command: N/APart II. Narrative Summary

During the month of February 1969, Marine Wing Headquarters Group - One and it's subordinate units provided administrative and logistical support for the 1st Marine Aircraft Wing Headquarters at Danang Air Base, Republic of Vietnam and provided communications support to the 1st Marine Aircraft Wing, 1st Marine Division and the 3rd Marine Division at Danang, Monkey Mountain, Chu Lai, Phu Bai, Quang Tri, Dong Ha, An Hoa and Vandegrift Combat Base. Administrative support provided at Danang Air Base consisted of transportation, billeting, messing facilities, material, local area defense and recreation areas. Tango Sector Alpha (1st Marine Aircraft Wing Command Post) was in Defense Condition #3 or higher every night during the month except 14, 15 and 16 February. No enemy rounds were received in this compound during the month.

Part III. Significant Events

1. Personnel. The Group continues to be over the approved T/O but below the provisional T/O. Because of the size of the 1st Marine Aircraft Wing, the accompanying workload in the Wing Headquarters requires the additional Wing Staff personnel. The lack of the recommended number of personnel is not considered to have a deleterious effect on the ability of this Group to carry out all assigned missions and tasks.

2. Administration. Routine administrative work was performed during the month of February 1969.

3. Awards. The following awards were presented during the month of February 1969:

4. Casualties. There was one Hostile Injury and three Non-Hostile Injuries to personnel of this Group during the month of February 1969.

5. Morale/Welfare Programs. Special Services provided the Tango Sector Alpha Compound with many and various off-duty activities; handball, volleyball, tennis, horseshoes, basketball and weightlifting. Movies are shown almost nightly. Clubs offered entertaining floor shows and happy hours several times throughout the month. The Freedom Hill, China Beach and Golden Gate USO's supplemented the aforementioned activities. Although liberty remained secure in the Danang area, the China Beach recreation center continued operation for the enjoyment of all hands. Also, R&R seat allocations and RON flights enabled personnel to relax out of country for several days.

6. Civic Action. Details of the MWHG-1 Civic Action program for the month of February 1969 are outlined in Appendix (A).

7. Intelligence/Counter-Intelligence. The Intelligence Section performed routine administrative support during February 1969, including an Intelligence brief for the weekly Command Indoctrination Presentation, handling all matters pertaining to requesting security clearances and access for Group personnel and obtaining the daily G-2 briefing on significant events in I Corps.

8. Ground Defense. Ten patrols were conducted in the villages surrounding the 1st Marine Aircraft Wing Headquarters Compound. Nothing of significance was discovered.

9. Training. General Military Subjects Training for all enlisted

Marines is held at the Group level each Friday morning. A total of 90 personnel attended GMST. A total of 52 officers and enlisted attended the Command Indoctrination presentation which is held each Saturday morning. A total of 23 Marines of the Group FAM fired their T/0 weapon. Technical Training was conducted by the squadrons at four hours per month per MOS. Formal schools were attended by 2 officers and 8 enlisted personnel during the month of February 1969.

10. Logistics. The Logistics Section carried out routine administrative support for the Group.

11. Supply. The Supply Section conducted normal supply operations in support of the Group and the First Marine Aircraft Wing. The Marine Corps Property Section processed 1143 requisitions and Navy Property processed 2266 requisitions with a net effectiveness of 46% and 95% respectively for February 1969.

1. In accordance with reference (a), the following report is submitted:

### PART III

#### 2. Civic Action

a. Coordination with Hamlet Officials has increased significantly during February. Four formal meetings were held with the Hamlet Chief, Phuoc Thuong. We have established contact with Hoang Thi Nam, president of the Vietnamese/American Association. This woman has helped us with our Civic Action Program. The '68 Party was a large success for the Vietnamese and the Americans.

b. Materials have been requested for the re-building of a temple located in the Phuoc Thuong Hamlet. It will require (50) bags of cement to complete this project. Also lumber and tin have been requested for construction of a house.

c. The Saturday afternoon Med-Caps are still being continued. An average of (5) persons are treated each Saturday. The Hamlet Chief is always present and security is provided by volunteers. (250) civilians have been treated during the month of February.

d. The Khue Trung School has been completed and one classroom of the two room structure is operational. They are awaiting lumber to complete the second classroom. One house has been completed for Nguyen Thi Hai.
