PART II

During the month of July 1970, Marine Wing Headquarters Group One and its subordinate units provided administrative and logistical support for the 1st Marine Aircraft Wing Headquarters at Danang Airbase, Republic of Vietnam and provided command administrative communications for the 1st Marine Aircraft Wing Headquarters and air control communications for the Tactical Air Direction Center. Tango Sector Alpha was in defense condition #3 every night during the month of July 1970. There were no rocket warnings during the month of July 1970.

PART IIISEQUENTIAL LISTING OF SIGNIFICANT EVENTS

1. Personnel. The Group continues to be over the approved T/O, but well below the provisional T/O. Because of the size of the 1st Marine Aircraft Wing, the accompanying workload in the Wing Headquarters requires the additional Wing Staff personnel. The lack of the recommended number of personnel is not considered to have a deleterious effect on the ability of this Group to carry out all assigned missions and tasks.

2. Administration. Routine Administrative work was performed during July 1970.

3. Awards. The following awards were presented during the month of July 1970.

One Marine Officer was awarded the Navy Achievement Medal
 Four Marine Officers were awarded the Strike/Flight Air Medal Award
 Seven Marine Enlisted were awarded the Strike/Flight Air Medal Award
 One Marine Officer was awarded the Bronze Star with Combat "V"
 One Marine Officer was awarded the Meritorious Service Medal
 Four Marine Enlisted were awarded Meritorious Masts
 Three Marine Enlisted were awarded Good Conduct Medals

4. Casualties. There were two Marines hospitalized during the month of July 1970. There were no hostile or non-hostile casualties.

5. Morale and Welfare Programs. Wing Special Services provided the Headquarters Group Compound with many off-duty activities including handball, volleyball, tennis, horseshoes, basketball and weightlifting. The Group as well as Wing offered entertaining floor shows and happy hours several times throughout the month of July. The China Beach, Freedom Hill and Golden Gate USO's supplemented the aforementioned activities. Although liberty remains secured in the Danang area, the China Beach recreation center continued operations for the enjoyment of all hands. Also, R&R seat allocations and RON flights enabled personnel to relax out of country for several days.

6. Civic Action. Details of the MWHG-1 Civic Action Program are outlined in the Civic Action Command Chronology.

7. Intelligence and Counter-Intelligence. The Intelligence Section performed routine administrative support during the month of July 1970. There were 35 clearances processed to Group personnel. The Intelligence section processed 3 war trophies and turned in 41 unauthorized war trophies to the Group Armory. The Intelligence Section also held Intelligence Briefs for the Command Indoc-trination Presentation and obtained the daily G-2 briefing on significant events in I Corps.

8. Industrial Relations. Details of the MWHG-1 Industrial Relations Program are outlined in the Industrial Relations Command Chronology.

9. Ground Defense. The Ground Defense Reserve Company A/Zulu One, was deployed on a sweep of the Phuohg Xuan Hoa Area in support of 1st MP Battalion on 24 July 1970. The results were 49 detainees and 23 of these detainees were confined for further questioning.

10. Training. General Military Subjects Training for all enlisted Marines is held at the Group Level each Wednesday morning and Thursday afternoon. A total of 428 personnel attended General Military Subjects Training during the month. A total of 89 officers and enlisted attended the Command Indoctrination Presentation and Fam Fire Exercise. Drug Abuse Indoctrinations were attended by 102 officers and enlisted during the month of July.

11. Maintenance. The Utilities Section cleared the front and rear revetment from G-2 Modules, covered the gravel lot at the Post Office with oil, repaired a number of air conditioners for various reasons, and there was an air vent installed for the Wing Adjutant to let hot air escape from the burn machine. They received 140 trouble calls, completed 139, and referred 1 to Public Works. They received 243 Work Orders, completed 193 and 50 were left pending.

12. Logistics. The Logistics Section carried out routine administrative support for the Group.

13. Supply. The Supply Section conducted normal supply operations in support of the Group and the 1st Marine Aircraft Wing. The Marine Corps Property Section processed 2,557 requisitions with a net effectiveness of 99%.

14. Communications. See Part III Paragraph 5 of Marine Wing Communications Squadron One Command Chronology.

15. Religious Services. See Marine Wing Headquarters Group One Chaplain's Command Chronology.


