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PART II

NARRATIVE SUMMARY

1. (U) The period of time covered by this chronology has the First Marine Aircraft Wing still maintaining its combat readiness and effectiveness through continued exercises and deployments.
2. (C) During this reporting period the Wing had several units participating in exercises BLTEX 1-76 and the Cold Weather Exercise at Camp Fuji.
3. (U) Detailed chronologies of all staff sections and subordinate units are contained in PART IV. The following items are summarized.

PERSONNEL

4. (U) The G-1 Division continued to support the Wing with augmentations for the various exercises during this reporting period. A total of 12 personnel (8 Officers and 4 Enlisted) were assigned for support in exercise Focus Lens FY-76 and 154 personnel (8 Officers and 164 Enlisted) for the Cold Weather Exercise at Camp Fuji. The overall average strength of 1st MAW was 877 Marine Officers and 6532 Marine Enlisted with 23 Naval Officers and 100 Naval Enlisted.

INTELLIGENCE/SECURITY PROGRAM

1. (C) The Air Combat Intelligence Branch (ACIB) have continually updated study folders assigned by the Intelligence Analyst.
2. (U) The G-2 Division was inspected by CG FMFPac during 20-23 October 1975.
3. (U) Staff Counterintelligence Section continued to brief all new enlisted marines upon reporting to 1st MAW.
4. (C) The ACIB conducted a study evaluating the major threats to 1st MAW contingencies. The study was initially used to prepare a reply to the Haynes Board Mission and force structure questions.

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OPERATIONS

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1. (U) Regular deployments to NAS Cubi Point, R. P., Naha, Japan, and Kadena AB, Japan have continued to produce a high level of squadron combat readiness for units of First MAW.
2. (C) There were two major exercises during this reporting period. BLTEX 1-76 and the Cold Weather Exercise at Camp Fuji.
3. (C) The attack community within First MAW has been greatly enhanced with the addition of 10 A-6E aircraft.
4. (U) In December, VMA(AW) 533 was replaced by VMA(AW) 224.

LOGISTICS

1. (U) During the six month period the major efforts of the G-4 Division were directed toward improving the material readiness within the Wing and coordinating the Wing Ground Support Test (CMC Project #43-71-12).
2. (U) The Embarkation Section coordinated the Airlift of 51 units/detachments. Additionally, much effort was directed toward relocating the MACG-18 Headquarters.
3. (U) The Wing 3M Analysis transferred operations/cognizance from Assistant Chief of Staff, Management to Assistant Chief of Staff, G-4.

COMPTROLLER

1. (U) Overall Financial System procedures and files were satisfactory with stated discrepancies noted during the FMFPac inspection. The overall Wing accounting system was sufficiently responsive to enable the Wing to perform its mission.

COMMUNICATIONS-ELECTRONICS

1. (U) Improvement of personnel, equipment and procedural readiness resulted in improved communications-electronics activities in the First MAW.

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2. (U) Seventeen Link II and Link III circuits were successfully activated for long haul HF teletype training. Operator proficiency and thus circuit quality improved with each activation.

MANAGEMENT

1. (U) Revised planning throughout the First MAW resulted in the implementation of the Flight Readiness Evaluation Data System (FREDS) during the third quarter FY-76.

2. (U) Transfer of the 3M Analysis to the staff cognizance of G-4 was completed in October 1975.

INSPECTOR

1. (U) The Wing Inspector office coordinated functional Management Inspection for all subordinate units during July, August and September 1975. The Force Inspector, FMFPac, inspected the First Marine Aircraft Wing during the period 14-24 October 1975 with overall satisfactory results.

STAFF JUDGE ADVOCATE

1. (U) During this reporting period a total of 4,000 legal assistance cases were processed by the Joint Law Center, Iwakuni and the Branch Law Office, Okinawa. A breakdown is as follows:

- a. General Court Martial - 9
- b. Special Court Martial (BCD) - 15
- c. Special Court Martial (NON-BCD) - 53
- d. Summary Court Martial - 76
- e. Non-Judicial Punishment - 615

2. (U) Administrative discharges were as follows for the reporting period:

WING SUPPLY

1. (U) A concentrated effort has been focused on purging of excess material. During the period, July - December 1975, \$3,078,743.78 in NSA material and \$15,010,575.65 in APA excess material has been returned to the supply system.

WING SAFETY CENTER

1. (U) The First Marine Aircraft Wing completed the first half of Fiscal Year 1976 without a major aircraft accident.

2. (U) On 20 September 1975, VMFA-232 and HMMH-462 were FMFPac winners of the CNO Annual Aviation Safety Award for Fiscal Year 1975.

WING CHAPLAIN

1. (U) The Wing Chaplain office continued its efforts in providing spiritual guidance for 1st MAW personnel.

WING PUBLIC AFFAIRS OFFICE

1. (U) The Wing PAO released 2,293 Fleet Hometown news releases on Wing personnel.

2. (U) During the reporting period a total of 66 outside news releases were distributed to civilian media, also a total of 51 Japanese news media queries were answered.

PART IINARRATIVE SUMMARY

1. PERSONNEL. During this reporting period, 1stMAW, G-1 provided a total of 12 personnel (8 officers and 4 enlisted) for exercise Focus Lens FY76; and 154 personnel (8 officers and 146 enlisted) for Operation Rechochet 1-76.
2. ADMINISTRATION. During the period 1 July - 31 December 1975, this office processed 112 special correspondence messages and letters. These included congressional interest correspondence (CONGRINTS), financial assistance requests (FINAN ASST), welfare reports (WELREPS) and special interest letters (SPLINTS). The largest single problem area is financial support of dependents. Many Marines seem to simply forget about their support obligations while overseas or to misjudge the amount of support required to adequately provide for their dependents. Several financial assistance requests resulted in failure to provide support during the time lag between submission of NAVMC 10685 and the arrival of the first allotment check. CONGRINTS, although representing a larger numerical total, addressed a host of specific problem areas. The majority of these CONGRINTS originated with the next of kin of Marines who were involved in legal difficulties. These CONGRINTS required complete information on all legal proceedings including details surrounding offenses charged, date and type courts-martial, pleas, findings, sentences, name of counsel, action on review, pre-trial confinement and pre-trial agreement.
3. MANPOWER MANAGEMENT SYSTEM (MMS). The Disbursing On-Site Examination was conducted during the period 14 - 26 August 1975. The purpose of the examination was to detect errors connected with the administration of pay and allowances and to furnish specific identification of existing errors to provide basis for corrective actions by administrative personnel. A further purpose was to identify existing weaknesses in recording and reporting personnel actions affecting credits and checkages of pay and allowances. The examination involved a comparison of service records with leave and earning statements, review of military pay orders, promotion files, unit punishment books and unit diary entries. The examination involved 16 per cent of the personnel records maintained. Of the 587 discrepancies noted, 230 were in the monetary category, involving \$18,500.83 potential overpayments and \$5, 637.37 potential underpayments, for a total of \$24,138.20. The average dollar value was \$104.95 per monetary error. The remaining 357 discrepancies were in the advisory category because sufficient information was not available to determine the dollar value of the discrepancies.

4. CAREER PLANNING. The First Marine Aircraft Wing enjoys a relatively high reenlistment rate. Monthly break down is as follows:

10 Marines completed the Career Information and Counseling Course in Okinawa to serve as Career Planners in the Wing. The testing section administered a total of 153 tests to Marines of the Wing, MCAS Iwakuni, and the three Marine Barracks at Atsugi, Yokosuka, and Sasebo. Results of the FY75-2 Semiannual Augmentation Board showed that out of the 81 applications processed by this section, 15 officers were offered Augmentation into the Regular Marine Corps, 11 were placed in an Extended Duty Reserve Status and 18 were granted an Extended Active Duty or Standard Writted Agreement contract for additional service. During this period 80 additional Augmentation Requests were forwarded for consideration by the FY76-1 Semiannual Augmentaion Board. 2 officers requested to resign thier commissions.

5. PERSONNEL SERVICES. The 1st MAW Personnel Services Officer coordinated and implemented various programs designed not only to aid the morale of 1stMAW Marines but also to ensure that updated information was provided through various means for their general well-being. Several hundred Marines continued to partake in the Far East travels. The highlight of these flights was the Christmas Flight to CONUS for a handful of 1stMAW Marines. Joint Reception Center officials agreed that through the thorough briefings given new arrivals in the the "Welcome Aboard" lecture series there was a definite decline in desciplinary action reflected via the MP Blotter. Lectures given by the Staff Judge Advocate, Provost Marshall and Personnel Services Officer were instrumental to affect the problem of new personnel assimilating to a different country and its lifestyle. The Courtesy Patrol teams enhanced these lectures through their scrutiny of off-base problem areas assisting Marines when situations deemed it necessary. JRC information pamphlets also emphasized pertinent facts with the lifting of the FMF West-Pac restricted visit by dependents. An Iwakuni fact sheet for sponsors and the hassles to look for are available to all incoming Marines at JRC. One area to receive the most distinguishing facelift was the revamping of the Hospital Visit to the Naval Regional Medical

Center at Yokosuka. The visit was extended from a one to three day visit to effect a better rapport and response to patient's requests and problems. The "Out of Sight, Out of Mind" adage no longer applies with the implementation of the revised Wing/Station Order.

6. POSTAL. During the period 26 November - 4 December 1975, air support was obtained to transport incoming and outgoing U. S. Mail between MCAS, Iwakuni and NAS, Atsugi, due to train strikes, and as an alternate means.

NARRATIVE SUMMARY

1. Air Combat Intelligence Branch (ACIB)

a. 1stMAW contingency countries area study folders have been continually updated by the assigned intelligence analyst. The efforts of the entire branch were used in the preparation of intelligence briefs and reports for the use of the Commanding General, his staff and subordinate units.

b. A staff study was conducted by the ACIB during the period 1 July to 15 August 1975 to determine the feasibility of renting a correlator to semi-automate the updating and general maintenance of the NIPS III aperture card data base. It was recommended by the ACIO that the rental of a correlator would greatly enhance the operational capability of the ACIB by facilitating the initial filing/purging of the NIPS data base during the periodic updating. The correlator would also facilitate the retrieval of information from the NIPS data base either by subject title, country, geographic coordinates, or control number. It is considered both economically feasible and operationally desirable to have use of a correlator as it, would significantly reduce the number of man hours presently expended to accomplish these same functions, would reduce the possibilities of errors in filing and would provide information on a more timely basis. A request was initiated for an IBM 084 correlator on 18 August 1975.

c. The intelligence Library (hard copy) was inventoried and purged of all outdated and superseded materials during the period of 4 through 6 August by the ACIO. In conjunction with the inventory a computer program was written that identified documents to be deleted or reviewed for currency. The computer program will provide a means of sorting all existing references by either country code, keyword, long title or short title thus facilitating the listing of research information sources for the intelligence analyst.

d. Agenda items were submitted by the Assistant Chief of Staff, G-2 during August to FMFPac for the September FMFPac intelligence conference. Items addressed by the 1stMAW representatives were, "the establishment of an All Source Intelligence Center," "Automating the intelligence library inventory", and "automating the present map inventory and requisition procedures"

e. Major COX, the Air Combat Intelligence Officer, III MAF was briefed on our proposal to utilize a correlator for the NIPS data base and our recently computerized inventory systems on 29 August 1975. The same information has been provided to 3rd Marine Division Intelligence Section.

f. The AC/S, G-2 and the ACIO attended the FMFPac Intelligence Conference at Camp Pendleton, California during 8-12 September.

Briefings were given as on the agenda items indicated in paragraph (d) on the application of computerized programs into intelligence management functions.

g. The 1stMAW including the G-2 Division was inspected by the CG, FMFPac Inspection Team during 20-23 October 1975. The G-2 Division was adjudged to be satisfactory.

h. The Air Combat Intelligence Branch prepared and routed a study on the HLA/DZ, and a terrain and weather study for Operation Ricochet I. Ricochet I was a cold weather training exercise conducted in the Camp Fuji area during the period of mid-November through mid-December.

i. The Air Combat Intelligence Branch conducted a study evaluating major threats to 1stMAW contingent areas and thus possible areas of U.S. involvement within our area of responsibility. This study was initially used by a committee appointed by the CG, 1stMAW to prepare a reply to the Haynes Board mission and force structure questionnaire.

2. Staff Counterintelligence Section.

a. SCI continued to monitor and report on subversive/disident elements within the Iwakuni, Japan area.

b. Counterintelligence briefs are provided to all incoming enlisted Marines by personnel from either the SCI or the 7thCIT.

c. CG, FMFPac Inspection Team was augmented by Capt CARSON during the inspection of 3rd Marine Division.

3. Photo Imagery Interpretation Branch.

a. During this reporting period the PIIB has initiated, reviewed and forwarded 21 aerial reconnaissance request. Six of these missions have been completed. One mission requested from the last reporting period was cancelled by the requestor. Of the 15 aerial reconnaissance request still pending, 4 were required to be re flown, because the initial product was considered unsatisfactory.

b. The PIIB received and processed three (3) requests for photo reproduction/enlargements in support of 1stMAW units during this reporting period.

c. GySgt H. C. SILAS inventoried the photographic equipment held by MABS-36 warehouse at Futema during the period of 14 to 20 July 1975.

d. The G-2 Division has augmentative photo interpreters in support of the photo reconnaissance detachment aboard the USS Midway during those periods when the reconnaissance detachment was deployed aboard ship. The OIC, PIIB has made liaison visits to USS Midway, to discuss, both intelligence matters and use of augmentation personnel.

e. During the week of 15 September 1975 1stLt L. M. DAY (new OIC, PIIU, 3rd Marine Division) and MGySgt F. D. DURKEE (NCOIC, PIIU, 3rd Marine Division) conducted a liaison visit with the PIIB at 1stMAW.

4. SSO/SIGINT SUPPORT BRANCH

a. The Sigint Support Branch prepared and routed to the Commanding General and his staff, items of interest from Special Intelligence communication sources.

b. The request for an increase in SI billets (CG 1stMAW 07001Z May 75) was approved by CMC on 10 Sep 1975. This increasing the total number of approved SI billets to 61 active and 27 cadre.

c. The Special Security Office (SSO) indoctrinated 23 new personnel into SI billets and debriefed 11 personnel who were transferred during the period. The present status of the designated SI billets is 50 percent occupied.

d. Courier service was performed for incoming SI materials on a as required basis.

e. SSO administrative support was provided for HQMC (INTS) and 14 Special Background Investigation were submitted during this period.

NARRATIVE SUMMARY

The period of 1 July through 31 December 1975 the 6th FASC provided services to customers through a Remote Job Entry Device located in DPI #41, MCAS and connected to the 3rd FASC computer in Okinawa. Major applications supported in this manner included; DAMS, MARES, 3M, SASSY, MANPOWER, MEDS, and MAGFARS. During the period 1 July to 30 November FORSTAT was processed at 6th FASC on the IBM 1401-C6 computer system. The FORSTAT system received support from 3rd FASC, Okinawa during December 1975. The IBM 1401-C6 was discontinued on 30 November 1975 and prepared for shipment to Okinawa in accordance with HQMC directives. Projects initiated during July to construct a security fence around the 6th FASC computer module and to install a fire proof safe to protect back-up magnetic tapes were completed on schedule.

During August HQMC approved the consolidation of computer assets on Okinawa. This project delayed the transfer of the 6th FASC Computer System from September to November 1975. The equipment was received by 6th FASC on 26 November 1975.

Although IBM customer Engineers arrived at 6th FASC on December 1, 1975, installation of the computer was delayed until IBM authorized their representatives to begin work. The reason for the delay was that HQMC had not finished negotiations on the maintenance contract for 6th FASC. Through telephone conversations with HQMC, FMFPAC and IBM an interim agreement to install the equipment was reached and work began at 1435 on 3 December 1975. As the installation progressed it became evident that the Disk Drive from Federal Data Corporation had arrived, missing cables. HQMC was notified as to the missing items, discovered by the IBM Japan Customer Engineers who were hired by the vendor to install the equipment. On 9 December a bank of 8 Disk Drives arrived from Computer Wholesaler's Corporation. This equipment had received some damage in shipment, was missing cables required to perform the installation, and was not the correct configuration of drives and central units. HQMC was notified by telephone. Installation of the Federal Data disk drives was completed on 22 December 1975. Installation of the Computer Wholesaler drives was interrupted pending receipt of cables. The 6th FASC ended this reporting period in a non-operational status because of missing items of equipment, missing cables to connect equipment and the lack of a maintenance contract between HQMC and IBM.

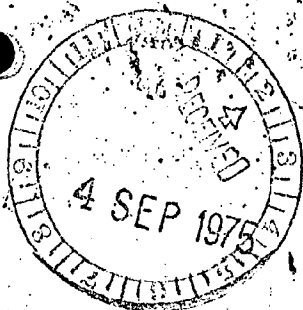

NARRATIVE SUMMARY

1. General. Improved personnel, equipment and procedural readiness were the goals of First Marine Aircraft Wing Communication-Electronics activities. Although subject to many restraints imposed by Japanese national authorities in terms of frequency, emission, and power limitations, the overall readiness of the Wing materially improved during the period of this report.

2. Training

a. Within the restrictions noted above, realistic training in HF, VHF and UHF frequency ranges using all applicable emission types per range was conducted. Rotation of net control station, not only among units located in Iwakuni, but those located in Okinawa, provided an excellent means to significantly enhance the tactical communication/message center procedures. Three Wing wide communication exercises, three to five days in duration each, coupled with short term exercises initiated in conjunction with the FMFPAC inspection, provided the training vehicles required. The results of the training were reflected in the successful execution of Operation Ricochet I which involved utilization of all aspects of the training program.

b. Seventeen Link II and Link III circuits were successfully activated for long haul HF teletype training. Operator proficiency and thus circuit quality improved with each activation.

c. Entry to the Defense Communications System on the FMF Mobile Command Net was effected thirteen times during the period. Covered teletype and AUTODIN procedures were closely watched and measures to improve them instituted.

3. Frequency Management. Frequency management in the Japanese Island area remains a continuous and complex problem which requires continuity and expertise as in few other areas of the world. Close and detailed coordination is maintained with the U. S. Forces governing agencies to both improve the procedures required and provide a vehicle of constant training of frequency managers for the First Marine Aircraft Wing.

4. Maintenance Readiness. The cyclical rotation of personnel within WestPac is a continuous problem because of the requirement to train or retrain maintenance personnel and revitalize maintenance programs. Add to this a general shortage of technicians to support the myriad of Communication-Electronics equipment associated with the Wing, and the problem is compounded.

ENCLOSURE (1)

A more active program of staff visits/inspections particularly to units located in Okinawa coupled with inspections by CG, First Marine Aircraft Wing, CG FMF Pacific and FSMAO have provided means to obtain higher visibility to problem areas allowing more responsive support from Wing to subordinate Wing Communications elements.

5. Relocation Planning. Potential relocations of the First Marine Aircraft Wing on short notice to any of several locations in WestPac, in response to actual or administrative requirements, impose a continuing burden on the communication community to be prepared to meet them. During this period significant efforts were made to upgrade and/or revise current plans to accomodate any such relocation.



Narrative Summary

1. Aviation Supply Support

a. During July 1975, two repairable management programs were directed by higher authority which significantly revised the methodology of managing aeronautical repairable components. Throughout the succeeding months, management meetings were held with appropriate personnel of the Marine Aircraft Groups preparatory to and during the implementation of these programs, development of local support procedures and subsequent identification of certain inadequacies of the programs. Problem areas were forwarded to higher authorities for resolution. The repairable management program was implemented on 31 December 1975.

b. In August 1975, A6E outfitting funding requirements of one hundred and forty-eight thousand dollars (\$148,000.00) for NSA/DSA material were identified and provided to initiate requisitioning action. Subsequently, a decision to transfer aircraft from a Navy squadron, deployed in WESTPac, resulted in modification of the selected critical repairable components to those assets aboard the supporting aircraft carrier. Approximately eighty-five percent of the initial outfitting was in place prior to the receipt of aircraft. MCAS, El Toro served as the outfitting stock point for all requirements.

c. During November 1975, HMM-165, deployed aboard the USS New Orleans. Shortly thereafter, HMM-165 reported a decline in operational readiness attributed to a supply problem. In response to inquiries by higher headquarters, a representative of this office, accompanied by a COMFAIRWESTPac representative, visited HMM-165/USS New Orleans to investigate the cause of reported support problems and to provide possible technical assistance. As a result of the visit, proper supply support channels and chain-of-command relationships were defined and improved squadron/supporting ship relationships were encouraged. In addition, the apparent need for increased improvement in the effectiveness of LPH aeronautical support was identified to the Navy commands responsible for same.

d. Increased emphasis on supply expediting functions were provided during October-December 1975 time-frame. Inadequacies of Special Interest Aircraft Reporting procedures were identified, and a revision to the Wing Order 4790.7 was drafted in December to improve both visibility of the status of those aircraft at the Wing level, as well as to enable

supply expediting efforts to be expended on valid material deficiencies.

e. A concentrated effort has been focused on the purging of excess material. During the period, July-December 1975, \$3,078,743.78 in NSA material and \$15,010,575.65 in APA excess material has been returned to the supply system.

2. Marine Corps Property Supply Support

a. The SASSY Management Unit (SMU) located at Third FSR is the central control and data collective agency for 1st Marine Aircraft Wing Marine Corps Supply Accounts. Because of the geographical separation, a detachment of the SMU has been established and physically located at Iwakuni. The main objective of the detachment is to sustain uniformity in the application of SASSY management techniques and coordinate the flow of input/output data to insure optimum supply support for the Marine Corps Supply Accounts of Iwakuni SASSY Units. The detachment is under the operational control of the Commanding Officer, 3rd FSR and administrative control of the Commanding General, 1st MAW.

b. The Maintenance Float Mount Out/Mount Out Augmentation is presently in process of being consolidated with all WESPac Mount Out and Mount Out Augmentation held in the consolidated account at Third FSR. The Commanding General, 1st Marine Aircraft Wing will retain responsibility for the semi-annual recomputation and will furnish the Commanding Officer, Third FSR a listing of all additions and deletions under these procedures. The Commanding Officer, Third FSR will be responsible for budgeting, procurement of excesses and redistribution of excesses.

c. The quarterly 1st Marine Aircraft Wing Supply Officer Conference was held during the period 16-17 September 1975. The most significant agenda items pertained to recent changes and new procedures established within the Marine Corps Supply System. Representatives from all Marine Corps organic accounts were in attendance as well as representatives from Third FSR, and Direct Support Stock Control (DSSC), Okinawa, Japan.

3. Aviation Supply Management Team

a. During the period 1 July through 31 December 1975 the normal supply management functions were employed. The team provided frequent visits to the two Group Supply Departments and MWHS-1 located at MCAS Iwakuni and to MAG-36 located at MCAS(H) Futema.

b. During July and August 1975 the team accompanied the FMFPac Aviation Supply Assistance Team to assist with the Aviation Supply analysis of MAG-36 and MAG-12.

c. During October the team conducted a pre-analysis visit with MAG-15 and MWHS-1 in preparation for the scheduled FMFPac Aviation Supply Assistance Team visit in November 1975. Subsequently the team accompanied the FMFPac representative, assisting with the Aviation Supply analysis of these two units.

d. During this reporting period, the management team, developed and refined an extensive and comprehensive checklist. The checklist is currently being reproduced for distribution to subordinate units.

4. Marine Corps Supply Management Team

a. The period of 1 July through 31 December 1975 was utilized to conduct a formal SASSY school for all units within the First Marine Aircraft Wing. Present plans call for the aforementioned school to be conducted on a monthly basis for all joining supply personnel.

b. Formal assistance visits were provided to eight separate supply accounts during the period 1 July to 31 December. The Wing SASSY Team further provided frequent informal visits to provide assistance and training when requested by Supply Officers or when noted problem areas occurred.
