1. In accordance with the instructions contained in references (a), (b), and (c), the following is submitted.

#### 2. Narrative Summary

The squadron has had an active month in the recalling and displacement of DASC's. The arrival of the Army in Southern I Corps eliminated the requirement for our DASC, Landshark "Yankee", at Duc Pho. Operations there ceased on 10 April, and in approximately three days all equipment and personnel were returned to Chu Lai. On 17 April personnel and equipment and HDC were embarked by 3 KC-130's to Phu Bai, and then by motor convoy to Phong Dien, to support operation "SHAWNEE". The HDC was established and ready to control aircraft on the 19th, although the operation did not commence until 22 April 1967.

On 26 April 1967, the Task Force "X-RAY" FSCC was disestablished and replaced by the US Army Provisional Division (Task Force Oregon) Tactical Operations Center (TOC) and Tactical Air Control Party (TACP). Exchange of fire support/air support information between the MASS-3 DASC, Landshark "Alpha" and the TOC/TACP has been established without difficulty although no formal procedural guidance has been promulgated. TPQ-10 target clearance, formerly performed by the Task Force "X-RAY" FSCC, is now being performed by the G-3 portion of the Chu Lai Installion Coordinator's staff.

TPQ-10 missions and total ordance dropped did not exceed the squadron high of last month, although, overall, it proved to be a better than average month. Cross training of controllers continued with two officers becoming dual qualified as Strike Controllers and DASC Senior Air Directors.

Construction on the squadron recreation but continued throughout the month and should be completed in early May. Work also commenced on a 40' x 96' butler building for supply storage.

- A. <u>Personnel</u>. Eighteen (18) personnel were promoted to the rank of Corporal, fourteen (14) to Lance Corporal and four (4) officers were promoted to First Lieutenant.

#### C. <u>Special Operations</u>

- (1) Landshark "Yankee". Marine operations in southern I Corps were greatly reduced when the Army moved into this area, therefore it was determined that the DASC at Duc Pho was no longer required. Landshark "Yankee" control ceased on 10 April and the airlift of personnel and equipment to Chu Lai commenced.
- (2) <u>King Lear "Zulu"</u>. An HDC in support of Operation "SHAWNEE" was established at Phong Dien and was ready for operations on 18 April although the operation itself did not commence until 21 April 1967. Though termed a HDC, King Lear "Zulu" has a full DASC capability should Operation "SHAWNEE" warrant a more elaborate air support system.
- D. Training. Cross training of all Strike Controllers has proved extremely beneficial when personnel are required for DASC and HDC displacements. At present, only four controllers are dual qualified in the DASC and ASRT.
- E. Supply. On 23 April, the squadron supply section commenced the transition from SLITT to MUMMS (Marine Corps Unified Material Management System) with a target date of 5 May 1967 for completion.
