

Part II Narrative Summary

(C) During the month of September, Da Nang ASRT "A" reported 12 secondary explosions while conducting their TPQ-10 bomb drops. In addition, the Da Nang ASRT "A" had its bomb drops adjusted by an A/O spotter to completely destroy a 37 millimeter AA site west of Da Nang. This ASRT is averaging 40 targets hit and controlling fifteen aircraft per day.

The First Marine Division has given the Da Nang detachment the added responsibility of manning an additional fighting hole for its perimeter defense, making a total of five.

During the last week in September, Da Nang ASRT "B" received a TPQ-10 system A-15 replacing their previous set (A-12), which was the oldest TPQ-10 in Viet Nam. After assembling the set, the technicians will perform computer alignments and gear train checks on the system.

Major problems continued in the Chu Lai TPQ until a new antenna was obtained from MASS-2. The system (redesignated A-7 vice A-17) is now operating well. The major reason for the relative inactivity of this ASRT is getting enough targets from the Army FSE, and then getting enough Marine Corps aircraft to hit these targets. Several secondary explosions were reported by Chu Lai ASRT "A" during September and when the aircraft came up with a workable beacon (ARW-67) aboard, targets in excess of 30 miles from the ASRT were able to be hit.

## 3 (U) Personnel

On 12 September Major William J. SULLIVAN relieved Lt Col Johnny O. GREGERSON as Commanding Officer of Marine Air Support Squadron 3. The change of command ceremony was held at the MASS-3 headquarters area in Chu Lai. Among the guests attending the change in command ceremony were the Commanding Officer of Marine Air Control Group 18, Col FRIES, as well as the Commanding Officer of the Chu Lai air base, Col CARPENTER.

## 4. (U) Civic Action

During the month of Sep, MASS-3 Med Cap treated 171 children and 39 adults.

On 3 Sep 12 scholarships were awarded to children in Trung Tean and Sam Hai Hamlets.

Cement and gravel were donated for well improvement and house construction.

One hundred dental kits were distributed to hamlet children. The MASS-3 Civic Action Officer met with hamlet officials to discuss future projects, notably the installment of a pump on the hamlet's main well.
