Part II Narrative Summary

(C) During the month of March 1969 MASS-3 continued to provide close air support and coordination for elements of the First Marine Division and the Americal Division in the Republic of Vietnam.

"Task Force Yankee" and the An Hoa Direct Air Support Center (DASC) were deactivated on 9 March 1969. The personnel and equipment from An Hoa DASC left on 10 March 1969 by convoy and arrived the same day at Da Nang. These resources are being used to augment the Da Nang DASC until a second DASC is required elsewhere.

As indicated by the statistics in Part III the volume of aircraft and ordnance dropped by Chu Lai ASRT and An Hoa ASRT increased during the month of March as the enemy offensive that started in February continued. The Da Nang AN/TPQ-10 that was damaged during the VC attack on 23 Feb 1969 was replaced by a system from CONUS which arrived on 25 March 1969. The new Radar Course Directing Central, serial no. A-11, was installed and became operational on 27 March 1969.

The DASC at Da Nang continued to provide effective control and coordination of fixed wing and helicopter aircraft operating in the First Marine Division tactical area of responsibility. In addition to previous duties, Da Nang DASC assumed control of aircraft working in the An Hoa area.

4. (U) Civic Action

During the month of March 1969 the MASS-3 Civic Action Team spent 20 man-days on civic action activities in Trung Toan Hamlet.

General Walt Scholarships totaling \$6,000 VN were given out to eleven (11) recipients in the hamlets of Trung Toan and Sam Hai.

The squadron Med-cap Team treated 223 Vietnamese civilians during the month.

The proposed Trung Toan school reconstruction and enlargement project was approved by Thiet Ta Co, Ly Tin District Chief and the senior MACV advisor and was forwarded to province headquarters via Americal Division G-5 for final approval.

A total of 185 Vietnamese children were shown movies at MASS-3 area in March. A beach party was also held for 36 children by MASS-3 personnel.

Occupants of homes bordering the Chu Lai Base perimeter in Trung Toan Hamlet are being forced to move to new locations by persistent small arms fire from perimeter bunkers. Chu Lai Defense Command is exercising control to minimize such incidents in the future.
