CONFIDENTIALPart II Narrative Summary

(C) During the Month of July MASS-3 continued to provide close air support for elements of the 1st Marine Division in operations PIPESTONE CANYON, DURHAM PEAK, AND MIGHTY PLAY. Chu Lai ASRT supported the Americal Division in operations GENEVA PARK, NANTUCKET BEACH, BRAVE ARAMADA,, FREDRICK HILL, and RUSSEL BEACH.

The month of July has been a month of transition for MASS-3. The Squadron C.P. is to be moved in August and preparations are in progress for elements to be embarked whenever final notification of the exact time and place has been recieved. Elements of Det. "A" on Hill 200 are to be moved to Hill 327. Chu Lai ASRT will be moved to a site some two miles south of its present location to be collocated with MAG-12. Facilities have been obtained, a cement antenna pad poured, bunker constructed and elements of the Chu Lai ASRT team equipment already emplaced in the new site. It is to be operational in the new site on 3 August 1969.

During the month of July MASS-3 operations personnel took part in briefing the new CO's of MAG-13, MWSG-17 and the pilots of MAG-13. These briefs were part of a bigger brief given by MACG-18 on Air Control facilities in Viet Nam.

The daily newspaper is still being recieved on an infrequent, haphazard, nondependable basis. We are hoping this situation will change when we arrive in Da Nang.

Sergeants Howard J. Johnson and Richard Gardner were awarded the Bronze Star medal on 27 July 1969 by Col. DUNWIDDIE, Commanding Officer Marine Air Control Group 18. First Lieutenant Wilkes R. MORGAN and Sergeant Timothy O. SHEEHAN were awarded the Silver Star Medal on 29 July 1969 by Lieutenant General BUSE, Commanding General Fleet Marine Force Pacific.
