



- 2. Utilization of MACS-8's TYA-5 allowed MACS-4 to continue operations without degradation while modifications were performed on MACS-4's TYA-5.

SIGNIFICANT EVENTS

1. Operations

- a. The following services were provided during the month:
 - (1) Tracks reported to Panama 36
 - (2) Aircraft provided Navigational Assistance 13,335
 - (3) TPQ-10 Runs monitored 1,385
 - (4) IFF/SIF 11,600
 - (5) GCI/GCA 1,766
 - (6) Intercepts (practice) attempted 84 completed 81

2. Logistics

a. The T/E shortage of one (1) PU-344 generator and one (1) PU-648 generator still exists.

3. Utilities

a. No major failures experienced during this period.

4. Motor Transport

a. During the month of October, MACS-4 vehicles traveled 22,086 miles. No cargo or passengers were transported during this time.

5. Communications - Electronics

- a. 3 October 11 October 1968 Experienced encoder problems in the TPS-22. After three (3) encoder failures, the TPS-22 and UPS-1 were slaved together pending the arrival of another encoder.
- b. 12 October 1968 MACS-8 AN/TYA-5 arrived from Okinawa with ECP 202 installed.
- c. 17 October 1968 Exchanged MACS-8 AN/TYA-5 with MACS-4 AN/TYA-5 and began installing ECP 202 in TYA-5 SN# A-3.
