PART II

1. From 15 June to 30 June 1971, MACS-4 successfully completed 38 out of 38 attempted Ground Controlled Intercepts. This was accomplished with the support of Squadrons: VC-5, VMA-211, VMFA-232, VMFA-115 and VF-151 aboard Midway.
2. On 15 June, 1st Lts. B. J. Williamson and D. L. Frieson began TAD tours with the 7th Fleet in the Gulf of Tonkin.
3. On 15 June, MACS-8 conducted a combined Change of Command, Squadron redesignation and Retirement ceremony. During this ceremony LtCol. M. S. Jolley was relieved as Commanding Officer by LtCol. R. D. Miller, MACS-8 was redesignated as MACS-4, and the MACS-8 colors were retired.
4. On 15 June, SgtMajor Hogue retired with 28 years of service.
- *5. On 17 June, 1st Lts. C. J. Boyle and H. B. Downey returned from their TAD tours with the 7th Fleet in the Gulf of Tonkin.
6. On 18 June, Lt. R. A. Andres completed 90 days TAD with the 7th Fleet aboard the USS Iwo Jima and USS New Orleans (JPH). Performing Air Support Control Officer Cross Training Program, Lt. Andres also completed 17 GCI's while aboard.
7. On 19 June, MACS-4 conducted TADIL A Link operations with the USS Preble off the Okinawan coast.
8. On 21-25 June, MACS-4 moves two MEDE huts, seven generators, one AN/SPS-1 radar and one AN/TPS-22 radar to White Beach to support missile firex with VF-151, and VMFA-232.
9. On 26-27 June, MACS-4 supported the USS Midway in a portion of the Missile Firex with VF-151. At the same time MACS-4 conducted TADIL A Links operations.
10. On 30 June, the missile firex ended and MACS-4 White Beach detachment secured with a total of 10 missiles fired.

*The two controllers attempted 122 GCI's and completed 122 of the intercepts while aboard the Truxtun, Cockren and Standley.
