



PART II Sequential Listings of Events

- a. <u>Personnel.</u> 4 Marine Corps Officers' and 60 Marine Corps Enlisted were joined. 2 Marine Corps Officers' and 32 Marine Corps Enlisted were transferred. 5 USN Enlisted were joined; 2 USN Officers' and 7 USN Enlisted were transferred. 48 Marine Corps Enlisted were attached for a period in excess of 30 days. 6 men were promoted to Cpl and 50 to LCpl. 1 Marine extended his enlistment for 3 months and 3 had their request for a 6 month RTD extension approved.
- b. Administration. Annual audit was completed and directives were reviewed. Corrections to Service Records and Personnel Accounting System continues.
- c. Photo. Produced a total of 2,732 units during the reporting period.
- d. Ground Defense/Security. Participated in 2 raids on Vietnamese house coordinated with PMO, 1st MarDiv which netted 7 Marines. Initiated a program for better control of persons having business in "C" area. 2 hours of school was held for Corpsman of MAG-11 on care, cleaning and safety of .45 cal. pistol.

- e. Training. The following correspondence courses were applied for during November 1966:
 - (1) MCI 23
 - (2) USAFI L
- f. Motor Transport. The Motor Transport section of MABS-11 operated with an average effective strength of approximately 116 men during the month of November. The operations section fulfilled 1,990 vehicle requests, traveling approximately 242 tons of cargo hauled in addition to 2,308 tons of ordnance. Only one major accident was reported. No man hours were lost as a result of this accident. The maintenance section accepted 118 vehicles for repair and 73 were completed. 15 of the 24 vehicles deadlined 1 November are still on deadline as of 1 December. 18 quarterly inspections and 15 annual inspections were completed. There were no lost man hours due to shop accidents during November.

g. Maintenance.

- (1) Plumbers and Water Point. This section has been supplemented with 8 pipefitters from MCB-9. Temporary drains were replaced; boiler installed in messhall, rehab cold water system and installed hot water system in messhall; installed 40 water stands in living areas and all shower heads were rehabed. The water point pumped 1,800,000 gallons of water during the period.
- (2) Electricians. Completed rehab of electrical wiring in Officer living area; general rehab of wiring in MAG-ll area continues.
- (3) Laundry. 4,118 bundles of laundry was washed and dryed. 2,450 pillow cases and 8,750 sheets washed and dryed.

h. Base Development/Military Construction.

- (1) Weather tower moved.
- (2) Completed ceiling in messhall.
- (3) Shed for boiler at messhall.
- (4) Moved a building for use by H&MS-11.
- (5) Constructed 4 sentry booths.
- (6) Constructed a new Post Office.
- (7) Completed concret walks for messhall.
- (8) Frame work for 20' x 28' extension of messhall galley set up.
- (9) Assisted in addition to MAG-11, S-2 building.
- (10) Constructed two covered entry ways for messhall.
- (11) 37 new huts louvered and eyebrows installed.
- (12) Officer & SNCO mess completed.

- (1) Pumped 2,732,134 gallons JP-4; 204,583 gallons of AVGAS and 45,000 gallons of Diesel Fuel.
- (2) Removed 2, 10,000 gallon tanks for survey and installed 2 others.
- (3) Repaired 5, 350 gpm pumps and returned to operational status.
 - (4) Repaired 4 filter separators and 4 meter manifolds.
- (5) Filled 50,000 sandbags and placed on line for protection of a 50,000 gallon fuel tank.
- k. LOX. Produced 17,350 gallons of LOX; issued 16,000 gallons LOX. Produced and issued 210,400 cubic feet of gaseous oxygen.

- (1) Received Class V(A) Munitions from the following ships.

 - c. SS LAS VEGAS VICTORY

- (2) Total bombs received during this period was 6,145 for a total of 3,017,870 lbs.
- (3) In addition we received 50,268 rounds of .50 cal. ammunition, 3,598 adapter boosters, 86,050 arming wires, 6,158 bomb fins, 23,617 bomb guzes, 1,881 sensing elements for electric fuzing, 5,548 2.75" rocket warheads, 2,016 MK 24 A/C flares, 38,708 cartridge actuating devices, 10,515 M9 delay elements, 7,760 2.75" rocket motors.
- (4) During November this section belted and delivered 12,542 rounds of 20MM ammunition to the squadrons of MAG-11, assembled and delivered 8,682 bombs along with all the items necessary to make a complete round, ie. fuze, booster, arming wire, suspension lugs etc.







(2) Messhall furnished 500 cookies and 10 gallons of ice cream for a youth conference. LOX provided 2,200 cubic feet gaseous oxygen to USAID(Da Nang Hospital).

p. Food Services.

- (1) Fed 120 regular meals; produced 24,927 pounds of bread; produced 900 gallons of ice cream and provided for 18 parties.
- (2) Officers mess was relocated providing better service for officers and SNCO's.
- (3) Hot boxes were tin foiled and sliding doors installed for durability and heat concentration.
- (4) Six tables were steel topped for better sanitation in food preparation.
- (5) Built and installed screen doors for bakery and vegetable preparation room.
 - (6) Mess deck screens were patched for fly control measures.
 - (7) Dish storage cabinet was built for Officer and Staff Mess.
 - (8) 47 new tables were received and are in use on mess deck.
- q. MOREST. A total of 426 arrested landings were made including 64 engagements of Air Force Aircraft. On 1 November a Marine F4-B skidded off the star-board side of runway 17 right at 9,000 feet after unsuccessfully attempting to engage the MOREST and destroyed the Fresnel Lens located at that point.
