PART II NARRATIVE SUMMARY

1. None.

PART III SEQUENTIAL LISTING OF SIGNIFICANT EVENTS

1. Personnel. During the month of August, MABS-11 joined four Marine Corps Officers, twenty-four Marine Corps Enlisted, and transferred four Marine Corps Officers, and forty-four Marine Corps Enlisted. Fourteen Marine Corps Enlisted were promoted to Corporal, six to Lance Corporal and one was promoted to Private First Class. Five Marine Corps Enlisted went to Special Leave and four returned from Special Leave.

2. Training. The following correspondence courses were applied for during the month:

- a. Marine Corps Institute: 3
- b. U. S. Armed Forces Institute: 6

3. Awards. Two Marine Corps Enlisted were presented Navy Achievement Medals with Combat "V" and one Marine Corps Enlisted was awarded a Vietnamese Cross of Gallantry.

4. Motor Transport. The Motor Transport Section operated with an average effective strength of 95 during the month of August.

a. The Operations Section fulfilled approximately 3,849 vehicle requests, traveling 122,995 miles, carrying 148,788 passengers, and 9,867 S/T of cargo.

b. The Refueler Section hauled 23,833 gallons of Diesel Fuel, 227,572 gallons of 115/145, 22,641 gallons of 80/Octane, and 62,400 gallons of water. A total of 19,805 gallons of contaminated fuel was defueled.

c. There were no major accidents during the month.

d. The Tire Shop repaired 475 Motor Transport tires and 59 Heavy Equipment tires.

e. The Maintenance Section accepted 133 work orders for the month and completed all of them. Eight (8) annual inspections and fourteen (14) quarterly inspections were completed.

5. TAFDS. The TAFDS Section pumped 3,162,731 gallons of J-Pl and 188,235 gallons of 115/145 fuel.

6. Cryogenics. The Cryogenics Section produced 7,100 gallons of LOX and did not draw any from other sources, and 1,470 gallons of LN2 were produced. There were 110,760 cubic feet of Gaseous Oxygen and 154,070 cubic feet of Gaseous Nitrogen produced. A total of 8,580 gallons of LOX was issued to Marine Corps Units and 1,150 gallons were issued to other units.

7. Communications

a. The Message Center processed 6,376 incoming messages, and cut 1,035 outgoing messages.

b. The Radio Section manned Wing Command One net during the hours of 1800 - 0800 daily. Due to a shortage of (1) 400 cycle converter permission was secured from Wing Headquarters to secure net during the hours of 0800-1800. This net provides radio communications between Wing Headquarters and all groups within 1st MAF less MAC-15 in Japan. To maintain a professional level of operation, the Radio Section conducted a communications CPX on the 4th of the month. Assignments of alert operations was activated on the 12th, 13th, 19th, and 22nd of August.

c. The Wire Section handled approximately 13,100 telephone calls and 134 trouble calls. The security guard posts in "C" area was completely rewired.

d. The Electronics Repair Section processed 74 pieces of equipment of which 60 pieces were repaired and returned to operations. Fourteen pieces were sent to higher echelon and the supply section processed 60 requisitions.

8. Food Services. During the month of August 63,927 pounds of fresh meat and 9,690 dozen fresh eggs were prepared. 13,897 gallons of fresh

milk was consumed by MAG-11 personnel. There was 2,339 party rations prepared and issued. The month saw the completion of the installation of the gas oven in the bakery shop; a new fat fryer installed to aid in food preparation, new doors installed within the messhall, complete repair and rescreening to improve sanitation and eliminate excessive flies. A cement slab was also installed in front of the GI house for sanitation improvement.

9. Security. Land lines to all security posts in the Class (A) ASP were installed and are now tied into the MAG-11 Communications Network. Work has been started on re-building the security bunker and re-locating security office spaces to the adjoining hut.

10. Materiel. The Materiel Section processed 431 Navy and 163 Marine Corps requisitions. The budget requirements for BP 09 were submitted on 9 August 1969. This will improve the supply posture of the squadron if approved, filling some of the deficiencies discovered during inventory. A revised system for reconciliation of requisitions with Materiel by departments was established. This month, implementation of Squadron Order 4400.2, which directs Sections to report on all supplies obtained by sources other than through supply channels, was promulgated. By the publication of this Order, valid usage data can be accurately reflected within the Supply System. Through this reporting, many items of supply will now receive their necessary "hits" thus qualifying for stockage.

11. Recovery. A total of 85 arrestments were made of which 23 were made by the Air Force. There were 8 emergency arrestments of which one was made by the Air Force. The Section now has a total of 18,358 arrestments.

12. Utilities

a. Laundry processed total of 20,010 pounds of laundry, using 175 pounds of soap, 25 pounds of sour, 9 pounds of bleach and 5 pounds of alkaline.

b. During the month of August a total of 42 work requests were completed, and 89 trouble calls requiring a total of 264 man hours.

c. The Utilities Section performed routine maintenance and repairs in the electric, generator, welding, plumbing, and carpenter shops.

13. Heavy Equipment. While supporting MAG-11 in heavy equipment maintenance and operations, the heavy equipment section ended the month with nine equipment mechanics and seven equipment operators. During the month the section maintained fifty-two percent ready status.
