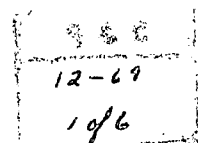

PART II NARRATIVE SUMMARY

## 1. None.

PART III SEQUENTIAL LISTING OF SIGNIFICANT EVENTS

1. Personnel. During the month of September, MABS-11 joined one Marine Corps Officer, twenty-nine Marine Corps Enlisted, and transferred four Marine Corps Officers, and fifty-one Marine Corps Enlisted. Eleven Marine Corps Enlisted were promoted to Sergeant, one hundred twenty-three to lance Corporal and three to Private First Class. Two Marine Corps Enlisted went on Special Leave and five returned from Special Leave.

2. Training. The following correspondence courses were applied for during the month:

- a. Marine Corps Institute: 7
- b. U. S. Armed Forces Institute: 1

3. Awards. None.

4. Motor Transport. The Motor Transport Section operated with an average effective strength of 93 during the month of September.

a. The Operations Section fulfilled approximately 3,928 vehicle requests, traveling 109,443 miles, carrying 249,519 passengers, and 7,632 S/T of cargo.

b. The Refueler Section hauled 57,775 gallons of Diesel Fuel, 78,745 gallons of 115/145, 13,912 gallons of 80/Octane, and 30,360 gallons of water. A total of 20,145 gallons of contaminated fuel was defueled.

c. There were no major accidents during the month.

d. The Tire Shop repaired 447 Motor Transport tires and 50 Heavy Equipment tires.

e. The Maintenance Section accepted 159 work orders for the month and completed all of them. One-hundred vehicles were Lubed on the Maintenance Lub Rack during the month.

5. TAFDS. The TAFDS Section pumped 2,865,995 gallons of J-P4 and 80,381 gallons of 115/145 fuel. One pump was placed into 4th Echelon maintenance, 10 pressure nozzles repaired, 7 separators rebuilt and 15 monitors also rebuilt. Twenty tanks for fuel storage and issue were installed.

6. Cryogenics. The Cryogenics Section produced 10,550 gallons of LOX and did not draw any from other sources, and 1,410 gallons of LN2 were produced. There were 81,940 cubic feet of Gaseous Oxygen and 107,060 cubic feet of Gaseous Nitrogen produced. A total of 9,540 gallons of LOX was issued to Marine Corps Units and 1,010 gallons were issued to other units.

7. Communications

a. The Message Center processed 5,598 incoming messages, and cut 1,726 outgoing messages.

b. The Radio Section manned the Wing Command One net during the hours of 1800 - 0800 daily, to provide radio communications between Wing Headquarters and all groups within 1st MAF less MAG-15 located in Japan. Due to a shortage of radio operators, the radio watch in the command bunker was cut to one man on watch. To maintain a professional level of operation, the Radio Section augmented with personnel from other Communication Sections conducted a Communications CPX on the 8th of September. Assignments of alert operations was activated on the 6th of September when DaNang Air Base was under enemy rocket attack.

c. The Wire Section manned the group field switchboard/telephone system, handling approximately 13,500 telephone calls of which 165 were trouble calls.

d. The Electronics Repair Section processed 123 pieces of equipment of which 103 pieces of equipment was returned to the Sections and 20 pieces of equipment remain awaiting parts status or evacuated to higher echelon of maintenance.

8. Food Services. During the month of September 64,246 pounds of fresh meat and 10,800 dozen fresh eggs were prepared. 14,923 gallons of fresh milk was consumed by MAG-11 personnel. There was 2,130 party rations prepared and issued. The month saw the completion of plywood siding of Officers, SNCO's and Enlisted dining area; painting of the Officers Mess has been completed.

9. Security. Work progressing in rebuilding Security Bunker and relocating Security Office. Bunkers in Charlie Area are being rebuilt to rain proof standards in anticipation of forth coming rain season. Initiated procedures to keep MAG-11 Security Post in proper police at all times.

10. Materiel. The Materiel Section processed 544 Navy and 69 Marine Corps requisitions. WgBul 4400 establishes a system whereas a direct liaison is set up with MCAS El Toro Contractor Operated Automotive Parts Store as a source of supply. This enables the supply system to procure necessary parts for downed vehicles by open purchase in California. We have attained an additional grant of \$60,000.00 dollars. This has permitted us to reduce the amount of priority O2's and utilize the priority O5 once again at a restricted rate. A battery recharging area for all departments has been centralized at the Motor Transport area. A total of two battery chargers are rated by the squadron, hence it is felt necessary to centralize both chargers where the greater assets are assigned. Serv-Mart runs have been established and utilized by all departments. We saw the realization of the Pre-Expended Bins in the Motor Transport area during this reporting period. Materiel has acquired the old chapel as a warehouse, thus giving Materiel more storage area and permitting us to remove the Group field mess equipment from the H&MS storage area.

11. Recovery. A total of 370 arrestments were made of which 138 were made by the Air Force. There were 8 emergency arrestments of which 1 was made by the Air Force. The Section now has a total of 18,722 arrestments.

12. Utilities

a. Laundry processed a total of 17,860 pounds of laundry, using 300 pounds of soap, 40 pounds of sour, and 20 pounds of bleach.

b. During the month of September a total of 42 work request, and 172 minor request were completed requiring a total of 4,574 man hours.

c. The Utilities Section performed routine maintenance and repairs in the electric, generator, welding, plumbing, and carpenter shops.

13. Heavy Equipment. While supporting MAG-11 in heavy equipment maintenance and operations, the heavy equipment section ended the month with eleven equipment mechanics and seven equipment operators. During the month the section maintained fifty-seven percent ready status.
