




PART IIISEQUENTIAL LISTING OF SIGNIFICANT EVENTS1. Chronology

- 1 June 1970 Commenced the grading of area for the permanent fuel berms at the North end of the Air Group Flight line. Heavy Equipment conducted daily round the clock sweeping of the MAG-11 Flight line.
- 2 June 1970 Foyers to the entrances of the troop Mess area have been completed to reduce the insect population within the Mess area.
- 3 June 1970 Completed the rescreening of the Pot Shack and the GI house.
- 4 June 1970 Replaced an absorber at the 2000 foot moreset installation on 17R due to excessive wear. The unit had logged 6,093 arrestments.
- 8 June 1970 Completed the construction of the water drainage pipe between pot shack and galley to collect and drain surface water from the area.

- 9 June 1970 At 2000H an Air Force OV-10 making an emergency landing left the runway at the 5000 foot marker and struck and killed Corporal Richard T. CARLSON 240 07 07/7011 USMC, a member of the recovery crew standing by to rerig cross deck pendants.
- 12 June 1970 Memorial Services held in the Group Chapel for Corporal Richard T. CARLSON 240 07 07/7011 USMC.
- 14 June 1970 Utilities completed the construction of the new Heavy Equipment Machine Shop.
- 18 June 1970 Wire Section utilized a unique method in setting up the public address system for the Air Group Change of Command. Two (2) PRT-4's were used in place of the normal microphones with outstanding results. TAFDS completed the drainage ditches around the south fuel dispensing point. All ice making machines were reworked and are in top operating condition.
- 19 June 1970 Heavy Equipment submitted surveys to Material on a M-60 crane and a D-6 caterpillar.
- 20 June 1970 Material received nineteen (19) embarkation boxes from Utilities which will be used for garrison property, mount-out. Held reconciliation with SAS on BPN-15 account - no discrepancies were noted.
- 27 June 1970 TAFDS received 2" X 50' Discharge Hose, 4" X 25' Suction Hose, 12 drum unloading Manifold and 6 suction studs from MWSG-17 to complement our present system.
- 28 June 1970 Utilities completed a generator maintenance shed and added a generator to Recovery runway operations. At 0015 an Air Force F4 engaged the 2000 foot recovery gear at gross weight of 33,900 and estimated 160 KTS. The reel failed but the Aircraft stopped normally.
