

PART IIISEQUENTIAL LISTING OF SIGNIFICANT EVENTS1. Chronology

1 August 1970 Two Tractor Trailers were provided to VMA-311 in order to expedite their move from Chu Lai. Motor Transport acquired five (5) appropriated fund workers, three (3) mechanics, one (1) lubrication man, and one (1) body and fender man. Heavy Equipment supported VMA-311 by furnishing cargo handling equipment and operators, VMO-2 was supported by furnishing a scoop loader with operator for one (1) week; and supported Wing Engineers in preparation of Local bus stops.

The Section completed three (3) back work orders; graded the interior cantonment roads, laid crushed rock in the compound area; constructed a section tool shop.

- 2 August 1970 Food Services had a "Total Rations due" this date of 1,924. Security continued work on Bravo Area Command Post.
- 3 August 1970 Recovery made a Marine A-6 "Hung Ordnance" emergency arrestment.
- 4 August 1970 The Wire Section rewired the dial telephone terminal box to service the VMFA-115 hangar. Provided four (4) dump trucks for use by MAG-16 for about ten (10) days.
- 5 August 1970 The Communications Orphanage Committee, which voluntarily helps to support the Sacret Heart Orphanage in Danang City, donated over \$80.00 for the four Orphans which have been adopted by the section.
- 6 August 1970 Recovery made an Emergency Arrestment of a Navy A4-E with complete Hydraulic and Electrical failure.
- 7 August 1970 Communications completed satisfactory A&M inspection. Food Services served "Many Missions" dinner to Brigadier General Miller and 73 Officers of the Air Group.
- 8 August 1970 A heavy vehicle bridge was completed into the MAG-11 dismount point. A bridge and road are presently under construction to the old MWSG-17 area now occupied by VMFA-115. Overall fill operation continuing throughout MAG-11 area for the coming monsoon season. Re-furbishing of Enlisted huts continued.
- 9 August 1970 Emergency Arrestment of a Navy A-7, with no oil pressure. Communications now operating 95 dial telephone circuits with extensions for a total of 214 telephones in use. The cable #227, which runs from

the Bravo frame to the Group Supply building, was re-terminated and was buried for better protection.

- 10 August 1970 Air Force Phantom F-4D, with Hyd and Util failure, made an emergency arrestment. The Communication wire section moved their high frequency antenna to a new location for better Communications. Launch and Recovery commenced work on MAG-16's taxi-way lighting.
- 13 August 1970 Motor Transport provided one 5000 gal. JP-4 refueler to An Hoa for four (4), days in support of Force Logistics Command. Motor Transport provided four (4) tractors and trailers to assist in MMSG-17 redeployment. The radio section completed a series of tests with radio equipment in the areas that would require communications in case of an NBC attack, all areas were satisfactory in this test.
- 19 August 1970 Communications wire layed on ^e/mile of WD-1/TT wire for Recovery section and installed four (4) TS-10 sound powered telephones. The section provided communications for MAG-11 MED-CAP. Security provided fifteen (15) men for weekly MED-CAP. Re-Vamped Dry provisions storeroom, installing new pallets and rearranged items to match inventory forms.
- 20 August 1970 Food Services provided dinner for "Change of Command" at "O" Club for VMA- (aw)-242.
- 25 August 1970 The Communications wire section installed seven (7) new lines in the VMFA-115 hangar. Work began on installation of new Recovery gear, to be located 1965 feet from the approach end of runway 17R.
- 28 August 1970 Air Force F-4 Phantom, no flaps, emergency arrestment. Security completed two Posts in Charlie Area, and continued work on the Command Post.
- 31 August 1970 Work completed on second set of arresting gear located 1965 feet from approach end of Rwy 17R. Food Services served approximately 61,440 rations during the month, established by head count.
