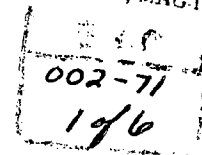

## PART III

SEQUENTIAL LISTING OF SIGNIFICANT EVENTS1. Chronology

- 1 February 1971 VMGR-152 rejoined MAG-11 messhall. MAG-11 Fire Department extinguished fire caused by enemy rockets. Recovery removed fence between Motor Transport and Recovery and policed area. Motor Transport provided two (2) cargo trucks and one (1) tractor trailer in support of MACS-4. Heavy Equipment started stand down on five (5) items of equipment, three (3) for the flying squadrons and two (2) for the Rehab program.
- 2 February 1971 Recovery removed sandbags from 2000 ft installation and taken to midfield, and also constructed pallets for pre-fab materials. Motor Transport provided one (1) cargo truck in support of MACS-4.
- 3 February 1971 Cable #232 required splicing after being ruptured by fragments. VMGR-152 command unit moved from sub unit #1 area to hanger area. Security received a briefing on communication security and the necessary information needed for reporting a breach of security when classified information is passed over the net.
- 4 February 1971 1stMP distribution frame rewired and their COC and switchboard is being rewired. Re-located antenna, radio and power source for E.O.D. in hopes of solving the problem of breaking squelch. Security built bunkers in Charlie Area.
- 6 February 1971 Fire Department conducted inspections of H&MS-11, MABS-11 and VMA(AW) 225. Security policed all lines and bunkers in A, B, C, areas. Utilities built a security booth.
- 8 February 1971 Communications re-wired and installed an AN/TRC-75 in the VMGR-152 hanger. TAFDS line at 152 closed for approximately ten (10) days due to expansion of Air Force Fuel pits. Utilities repaired a ME-10 and washed and painted generators.

- 9 February 1971 TAFDS gear at old 152 site removed, expected to be complete when all fuel has been issued.
- 11 February 1971 Utilities installed flood lights in Security, repaired a ME-10 and worked on recreation hut.
- 12 February 1971 Communications moved TSC-15 van and relocated it closer to a power source. Moved E.O.D.'s RC 292 and removed the radio.
- 14 February 1971 Security repaired fence by Post #12 in Alpha area. Heavy Equipment transferred three (3) items of equipment, 1 fork-lift to VMO-2 1 RT-6000 and 1 crane to VMFA-115. Total arrestments for the week were 118 aircraft. Number of emergencies were 5. One retrieve engine has been repaired, sanded and painted.
- 15 February 1971 Communications re-wired the Enlisted and NCO Clubs, and installed additional fixed plant teletype equipment at the Comm Center. Motor Transport provided two tractor trailers in the support of 11th Motors to assist in Operation Dewey Canyon II. A Special Services recreation shelter is now under construction. Fire Department responded to two grass fires, one at VMFA 115's staff quarters and one at the Golden Gate USO, both were caused by unauthorized firing of flares.
- 17 February 1971 Communications section installed a remote unit at VMA-311 for TED-9 and also installed two (2) new security locations, both new gates at MAG-11 "A" area.
- 21 February 1971 Fire Department assisted Air Force Crash Crew in extinguishing a fire on an Air Force KC-130 caused by enemy rockets. Total arrestments for the week were 108 aircraft and 10 emergencies.
- 19 February 1971 Fire Department was requested to support the City of DaNang Fire Station in a large structural fire. Fire was extinguished before FD arrived.
- 23 February 1971 Motor Transport provided two dump trucks in the support of 1stMP BN. Fire Department conducted inspections for the MAG-11 A&M inspection.
- 24 February 1971 Comm Section reterminated 238 cable, and removed unused wire from VMFA 115's living area.
- 25 February 1971 Communications Section removed bad cable at MABS-11 living area.
- 26 February 1971 Communications Section installed an intercomm system at MAG-11 NCO Club.
