

PART II

NARRATIVE SUMMARY

- 1. During November the MAG-12 Civic Action Team devoted most of it's time helping the village and hamlet educational system through building repair, outside beautification and academic scholarships. Monetary donations, to be used for student scholarships, were taken from Marine Aircraft Group-12 with gratifying results. The leading Squadrons were, VMA-311, with a total of \$1300.00 and VMA-211 totalling a \$700.00 contribution. Altogether the MAG-12 Marine Aircraft Group contributed in excess of \$3000.00 as of the end of November 1969.
- 2. In addition to the scholarship program, an effort was made to improve both the inside and outside of all classrooms. Filmstrips were shown in Ky Chanh Village and the hamlet of Ly Tra in hopes this program would continue and soon enclude all hamlets with at least one showing per month.
- 3. MEDCAPS are now held three days per week. A dental corpsman has been accompanying several MEDCAPS and the results have been excellent. Civic action is up to T/O and the month of December should prove to be a full one weather permitting.

1. PERSONNEL

During the month of November, M.G-12 joined 9 USMC Officers and 122 USMC Enlisted personnel. Rotated during the month were 9 USMC Officers and 96 USMC enlisted personnel.

3. AIR OPERLITIONS

- a. M.G-12 flew 1328 sorties for a total of 1,618.1 flight hours. Included were 1168 combat sorties which expended 1,425.2 tons of ordnance for an average of 45 tons per day.
