1. Purpose. To promulgate information concerning the 5th Air Force Sea Survival School at NUMAZU, JAPAN, and to publish a schedule of quotas provided MAG-13 (REIN) for utilization of same as outlined in enclosure (1).

2. Information

a. Reference (a) establishes this season's Sea Survival School at NUMAZU, JAPAN. This is a three (3) day school offered to pilots each year during the summer months and offers familiarization and operation of personal and survival equipment, basic sea survival techniques and skills and medical aspects of survival basic ichthyology.

b. Attendees will go up to Atsugi on the daily MARLOG flight one (1) day prior to their scheduled class. Each student will be required to provide his own transportation from Atsugi to Numazu, and shall be subject to reimbursement for his expenses. Travel information will be provided by the Group Training Officer.

c. All prospective students are directed to report to their unit training officer/NCO for further information.

3. Action. Squadron Commanders will insure that:

a. All pilots flying ejection seat type aircraft are scheduled to attend as soon as possible commensurate with normal training schedule.

b. This command be notified at least one (1) week prior to class convening date with names of personnel to be sent.

c. Attendance of each individual be made a matter of record subject to review by the Group Training Officer.
