PART TWO: Narrative Summary

Marine Aircraft Group 13 continued its support of III MAF and all other free world armed forces in the I Corps Tactical Zone, Laos, and the Gulf of Tonkin. Operations supported were; Iroquois Grove, Pipestone Canyon, Herkimer Mountain, Idaho Canyon, Williams Glade, Arlington Canyon, Virginia Ridge, Lamar Plain, Montgomery Rendezvous, and Victory Dragon. Flying a wide variety of missions, MAG-13 Phantoms provided support for the First and Third Marine Divisions, Task Force 77, Attack Force Alpha, Republic of Korea Marines, ARVN Popular Forces, 7th Air Force, 101st Airborne, Americal Division and various other U.S. Army units.

Air to ground strikes, consisting of 2,487 sorties, resulted in 69 KBMA, 705 bunkers destroyed, 86 damaged, 651 structures destroyed, 93 damaged, 45 hootches destroyed, 1 bridge destroyed, 2 damaged, 1 AA position destroyed, 3 rocket positions destroyed, 2 mortar positions silenced, 1 truck destroyed, 2845 meters of treeline destroyed, 60 secondary fires and 162 secondary explosions.

MAG-13 lost 1 aircraft due to enemy action during July. On 25 July 1969, F4J 155809 from VMFA-232 was hit by enemy ground fire approximately 17 NM west of Chu Lai; both crew members were successfully recovered.

PART THREE: Significant Events1. Personnel

During the month of July, MAG-13 had a loss of 23 officers and 136 enlisted personnel due to rotation and transfers. During this period 32 officers and 107 enlisted personnel reported aboard for duty.

4. Civic Action

a. During the month of July, MAG-13 Civic Action personnel assisted the 29th Civil Affairs Company in conducting an agricultural school. The school was designed to develop and improve farming methods in Viet Nam.

b. Civic Action officials from MAG-13 have been also devoting their efforts to obtaining IR-5 and IR-8 rice seeds for the citizens of Binh Sa Village.

c. MAG-13 is also participating in a project for the construction of a road between Dong Binh and Trung An. Although final plans have not been formulated, it is anticipated that a new roadway will soon link the two villages, with the help of MABS-13 Heavy Equipment.

5. Intelligence

a. During the past month, MAG-13 S-2 has continued it's mission of supplying intelligence information, and briefing newly arrived aircrrews.

b. A new Group Order has been published on the disposition of War Trophies, and War Trophy firearms.
