NARRATIVE SUMMARY

Marine Aircraft Group 13 continued its support of III MAF and all other free world forces in the I Corps and II Corps Tactical Zones, Laos, Cambodia and the Gulf of Tonkin.

SEQUENTIAL LISTING OF SIGNIFICANT EVENTS1. Personnel

During the month of June 1970, Marine Aircraft Group 13 had a loss of 30 officers and 297 enlisted personnel due to rotation and transfers. During the same period, 17 officers and 138 enlisted personnel reported to this Group for duty.

2. Intelligence

During the month of June Chu Lai Air Base received 2 rocket attacks, consisting of a total of 4X122 rockets resulting in 1XConex Box destroyed and 1X3/4 ton truck damaged.

The S-2 Section continued to accomplish its mission of supporting MAG-13 with intelligence information by preparing daily briefs for the aircrew members as well as for the Commanding Officer and Executive Officer. All incoming flight personnel received their in-country brief from the S-2 Officer. During the month of June a total of 11 newly arrived crew members were briefed by the S-2 Officer. In addition there were 2 indoctrination briefs presented to newly arrived personnel.

On 7 June 1970, an F-4B from VMFA-122 was destroyed when it crashed as a result of enemy ground fire. The RIO ejected successfully from the aircraft and was rescued almost immediately. The pilot did not eject and is MIA. Ref: VMFA-122 Command Chronology (C). (Appendix 4 to MAG-13 Command Chronology).

On 7 June 1970, an A-4E from VMA-311 was destroyed when it crashed as a result of enemy ground fire. The pilot ejected safely and was recovered by helicopter. Ref: VMA-311 Command Chronology (C). (Appendix 6 to MAG-13 Command Chronology).

On 11 June 1970, an F-4B from VMFA-314 was destroyed when it crashed in the South China Sea near Chu Lai as a result of a fire within the aircraft. Both crew members ejected safely. Ref: VMFA-314 Command Chronology (C). (Appendix 5 to MAG-13 Command Chronology).

On 19 June 1970, an F-4B from VMFA-122 was destroyed when it crashed while attempting a landing at Chu Lai Air Base, RVN. The pilot had been unable to jettison the ordnance from the right wing. As the aircraft was flared for landing an uncontrollable roll to the right developed. The crew ejected safely. Ref: VMFA-122 Command Chronology (C). (Appendix 4 to MAG-13 Command Chronology).

7. Civic Action

a. During the first week of June 1970, the Civil Affairs Team held MEDCAPs in the hamlets of Dong Thanh and Hoa Xuan 1 & 2. Approximately 160 people were treated. The team also took 5,500 Primary School Lesson Books to the Tam Ky Education Department.

b. During the second week of June 1970, the Civil Affairs Team held MEDCAPs in Duc Bo, Ly Tra, Xuan Ngoc, and Tien Xuan Hamlets. The corpsmen and doctors treated 240 people.

The Civil Affairs Team also took 900 bricks, 20 rocket boxes, 36 bags of cement and 12 steel pallets to Ky Chanh Village for use in the rebuilding of offices, schools and wells.

c. During the third week of June 1970, the Civil Affairs Team held MEDCAPs in Phu Vinh and Dong Thanh Hamlets. Approximately 265 people received treatment. The team also took 1,400 bricks to Ly Tin District Headquarters to be used in building a wall in the front of the compound.

d. During the last week of June 1970, the Civil Affairs Team went to Duc Bo Hamlet, Ky Chanh Village and picked up two children with massive scar disfigurement. With the aid of an American Representative from Saigon, and the Duc Bo Hamlet Chief, these children were persuaded they should have plastic surgery done. The children were then taken to 27th. Surgical Hospital to await their trip to Saigon.

8. Morale and Welfare Programs

a. There are presently two Chaplains and two enlisted assistants assigned to MAG-13. They have additional duties of coordinating Chaplain coverage for Combined Action Group 1 and Catholic coverage for the Naval Support Activity.
