NARRATIVE SUMMARY

Marine Aircraft Group 13 Completed combat operations on 3 September 1970. A total of 159 sorties were flown expending 54.7 tons of ordnance. The remainder of the month was devoted to detachment of VMFA-122 and VMFA-314 and embarkation of the support squadrons as part of the Phase IV withdrawls.

SEQUENTIAL LISTING OF SIGNIFICANT EVENTS1. Personnel

During the month of September 1970, Marine Aircraft Group 13 had a loss of 52 officers and 790 enlisted personnel due to rotation and transfers. On 10 September 1970 Marine Fighter/Attack Squadron 122 was redesignated Marine Fighter/Attack Squadron 122, Marine Aircraft Group 24, 1st Marine Brigade and relocated at MCAS, Kaneohe, Hawaii; 12 September 1970 Marine Fighter/Attack Squadron 314, was redesignated Marine Fighter/Attack Squadron 314, Marine Aircraft Group 33, 3rd Marine Aircraft Wing and relocated at MCAS, El Toro, California; 30 September 1970 Marine Air Traffic Control Unit 67 was redesignated Marine Air Traffic Control Unit 67, Marine Aircraft Group 33, 3rd Marine Aircraft Wing and relocated at MCAS, El Toro, California. The redesignation and relocation of these units created an additional loss factor to Marine Aircraft Group 13 as follows: VMFA-122 23 Officers and 84 Enlisted; VMFA-314 13 Officers and 19 Enlisted; MATCU-67 1 Officer and 4 Enlisted. During this same period, 2 Officers and 5 Enlisted personnel reported to this Group for duty.

2. Intelligence

During the month of September 1970, Chu Lai Air Base received a total of 9x122mm rockets with no casualties or damage.

The S-2 section continued to accomplish its mission of supporting MAG-13 with intelligence information by preparing daily briefs for the aircrrew members as well as the Commanding Officer and Executive Officer.

The last MAG-13 combat mission was flown on 3 September 1970 and the S-2 Section then continued to supply ground order of battle to support the final stages of Keystone Robin.

9. Significant Events

3 September 1970

The final combat mission flown by VMFA-122 in RVN was shared with VMFA-314. LtCol J. V. COX executive Officer of MAG-13 led the mission with LtCol C. F. SCHWAB as his RIO. Major R. C. CHAINSON commanding officer of VMFA-122 was dash two with Major C. R. FAIRCHILD as his RIO. LtCol R. H. CHRISTY commanding officer of VMFA-314 was dash three with Major D. T. BENN as his RIO. Dash four was Colonel L. J. STIEN, Commanding Officer of MAG-13 with Major R. R. DUNLEVY as his RIO. This mission also closed combat air operations for Marine Aircraft Group 13 in RVN.
