Part II - Narrative Summary

1. MABS-13 continued its support of MAG-13 in the development and maintenance of the MCAS Chu Lai Airfield.

Part III Significant Events

- 1. Personnel. The personnel strength on 31 July 1967 was 19 Marine Officers, 4 Naval Officers, 565 Marine Enlisted and 25 Naval Enlisted men on board. 4 Officers and 43 Enlisted men joined and 2 Officers and 68 Enlisted men were transferred. The following number of personnel were promoted during this period: 32 Enlisted and 1 Officer integrated into the regular Marine Corps.
- 2. Awards. Major Ray B. STICE was awarded the Vietnamese Cross of Gallantry.
 - 3. Casualties. None
- 4. Civic Action. The MAG-13 Chaplain distributed 4 boxes of food, clothing, toys and 300 writing tablets to the Dong Cong School at Chu Lai. The Medical department administered medical assistance to 1,218 Vietnamese in the Village of An Tan.
- 5. Air Operations. During July 1967 there were 27,209 take-offs or landings on the Chu Lai Runways. There were 475 arrested landings and 936 instrument approaches.
