PART TWO: NARRATIVE SUMMARY

1. Marine Air Base Squadron 13 continued its support of Marine Air-craft Group 13 and the Air Base at Chu Lai, RVN.

PART THREE: SIGNIFICANT EVENTS

- 1. <u>Personnel</u>. Four officers and twenty-nine enlisted were joined while five officers and seventy-six enlisted were transferred.
- 2. Administration. There were eight enlisted persons promoted during this period.
- 3. Awards. One Meritorious Mast.

- 4. Casualties. One Lance Corporal died of acute poisoning.
- 5. Morale. Morale remains at a high level.
- 6. <u>Informational Services</u>. 78 Fleet Home Town News Releases were submitted during July 1968.
- 7. Ground Defense. The Alert Platoons continued to muster daily. The Perimeter Platoon is still used on the perimeter at night.
- 8. Training. On the job training is continued in all sections. GMST and technical training programs are being implemented in all sections.
- 9. Logistics. TAFDS received 3,999,614 gallons and issued 3,982, 614 gallons of JP-4 fuel while refueling 2,030 aircraft.
- 10. Motor Transport.
- a. The Maintenance Section completed 145 work orders yielding 627 hours of work.
- b. Operations Section compiled the following while traveling 63,019 miles.

Cargo Hauled - 1,449 tons Passengers Hauled - 20,677 Total runs - 3,000

c. Refuelers Section totaled 3,159 miles traveled in delivery of the following:

Fuel - 729,521 gals 0il - 2,868 gals

- 11. Base Development. The Utilities Section completed 75 work requests. The Water Point produced 2,100,000 gallons of potable water. The Laundry Section washed 25,000 pounds of laundry.
- 12. Communications. The MAG 13 Communication Center handled a total of 21,377 messages during this period.
