- 4. Casualtics. None
- 5. Morale. Morale remains at a high level.
- 6. <u>Informational Services</u>. 81 Fleet Home Town News Releases were submitted during August 1968.
- 7. Ground Defense. The Alert Platoons continued to muster daily. The Perimeter Platoon is still used on the perimeter at night.
- 8. Training. On the job training is sontinued in all sections. GMST and technical training programs are being implemented in all sections.
- 9. Logistics. TAFDS received 4,349,345 gallons and issued 4,362,349 gallons of JP-4 fuel while refueling 2,169 aircraft.
- 10. Motor Transport.
