1. Marine Air Base Squadron 13 continued its support of Marine Aircraft Group 13 and the Air Base at Chu Lai, RVN.

PART THREE: SIGNIFICANT EVENTS

1. Personnel. Two Officers and forty seven enlisted were joined while four officers and sixty enlisted were transferred.

2. Administration. There were four enlisted persons promoted during this period.

3. Awards. Three Meritorious Mast. One single strike Air Medal.

4. Casualties. None
5. Morale. Morale remains at a high level.
6. Informational Services. 81 Fleet Home Town News Releases were submitted during August 1968.
7. Ground Defense. The Alert Platoons continued to muster daily. The Perimeter Platoon is still used on the perimeter at night.
8. Training. On the job training is continued in all sections. GWT and technical training programs are being implemented in all sections.
9. Logistics. TAFDS received 4,349,345 gallons and issued 4,362,349 gallons of JP-4 fuel while refueling 2,169 aircraft.
10. Motor Transport.
 - a. The Maintenance Section completed 133 work orders yielding 652 hours of work.
 - b. Operations Section compiled the following while traveling 63,450 miles:

Cargo Hauled - 936 tons
Passengers Hauled - 19,136
Total Runs - 2,080
