5. Morale. Contracts were completed to build a tennis court, remodel the basketball court and handball court.
6. Informational Services. 39 Fleet Home Town News Releases were submitted during this period.
7. TAFDS. A total of 3,692,148 gallons of JP-4 fuel were received, 3,501,029 gallons of JP-4 fuel issued, and a total of 2,027 aircraft refueled.
8. Communications. A total of 16,674 messages were handled in the MAG-13 Communication Center. Installation has begun on the new dial telephone systems.
9. Motor Transport. A total of 61,878 miles were traveled during this period. 2,159 tons of cargo was hauled. A total of 44 vehicles are presently deadlined.
10. Air Operations. Total amount of arnestments is now 22,823. A total of 40 washdowns were performed.
11. Ground Defense. The Alert Platoon and the CLAC platoon muster nightly. 11 new bunkers are in the process of being constructed.
12. Base Services. The utilities section completed 50 work request. The laundry washed approximately 35,000 pounds of clothing. The water point supplies 2,250,000 gallons of water for the MAG-13 cantonment.
