

1. Marine Air Base Squadron-13 continued its support of Marine Aircraft Group-13 and the Air Base at Chu Lai, RVN.

- 1. Personnel. 28 enlisted and two officers were joined while 38 enlisted and two officers were transferred.
- 2. Administration. There were four enlisted promoted during this period.
- 3. Awards. One gold star in lieu of a second purple heart, and one distinguished flying cross.
- 4. Casualties. None

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5. Morale. Remains high.
6. Informational Services. 62 Fleet Home Town News Releases were submitted during this period.
7. TAFDS. A total of 3,921,531 gallons of JP-4 fuel were received, 3,944,211 gallons of JP-4 fuel issued, and a total of 2,064 aircraft refueled.
8. Motor Transport. A total of 61,231 miles were traveled during this period. 3,843 tons of cargo was hauled. A total of 27 vehicles are presently deadlined.
9. Air Operation. Total amount of arrestments is now 23,328. A total of 53 washdowns were performed.
10. Ground Defense. The Alert Platoon and the CLDC Platoon muster nightly.
11. Base Services. The utilities section completed over 50 work requests. The laundry washed approximately 35,000 pounds of clothing. The water point supplied 2,250,000 gallons of water for the MAG-13 Cantonment.
