- 7. TAFDS. A total of 3,921,531 gallons of JP-4 fuel were received, 3,944,214 gallons of JP-4 fuel issued, and a total of 2,064 aircraft refueled.
- 8. Motor Transport. A total of 61,231 miles were traveled during this period. 3,843 tons of cargo was hauled. A total of 27 vehicles are presently deadlined.
