13. LOX. The MAG-13 IOM-5 was in a deadlined status. The MAG-12 10N-5, after receiving insulation from MAG-11, was jut into production but only a low production rate was attained because of the moistum content of the insulation received. Ten days of production resulted in only 3,860 gallons of liquid caygen. 10,000 gallons of liquid caygen had to be flown in from sutside sources. The two M-1 Lox Plants were in periodic operation producing gaseous caygen and nitrogen. Gaseous caygen produced was 110,100 cubic feet; Gaseous nitrogen, 111,625 cubic feet.

M. Special Services. The issue room at the MAC-1: beach area is now open. Two life guard stands and cight picnic tables have been built. Inspection and approval by III MAF will ensite the beach area to be opened for use. The tennis court has been completed, less the perimeter fence which is being held up by the unavailability of piping ascessmy for its construction. Construction has begun on a new band-ball court which it located on the south side of the recreation but.

17. Food Services. Progress has been made as a non milk discense; was installed in the Officers Mess, the old moved into the Enlisted Mess allowing for easier access by the troops. Two new possters were provided for the Officer Mess and two large teasters for the Enlisted Mess. Other new equipment received was a new dishwasher for the Officer/Staff MCO Messes. Plastic sheets were erected over portions of the screened areas to lessen the anount of sand blowing into the Messivile.
