

PART IINARRATIVE SUMMARY

The month of July 1972 Marine Aircraft Group-15 has continued in support of Combat Operations for South Vietnam ground forces and continued in it's buildup of the Royal Thai Air Force Base Nam Phong, Thailand. One squadron of F-4's is now supporting the United States Air Force Linebacker series by flying BARCAP missions over North Viet Nam.

Even though the aircraft availability suffered due to the inherent difficulties of operating from an expeditionary environment the subordinate units of Marine Aircraft Group-15 have delivered 2656.9 tons of ordnance on target while amassing 1830.8 flight hours. As FAC's were not able to report all BDA the following is considered impressive.

In addition to the above BDA there were 200 secondary explosions, 105 secondary fires, and 15 IOL fires reported. The 3 operating squadrons conducted the majority of their strike missions in MR-1.

On 7 July 1972 VMA(AW)-533 lost one A-6A due to AAA in the vicinity of Khe Sanh. Both crewmembers are listed as MIA.

Throughout the month of July Marine Aircraft Group-15, in addition, to it's combat role, continued improving the base facilities at Nam Phong and have transitioned from billeting in general purpose field tents to the more permanent hard backed tents.

July was also marked with several VIP's in the Marine Aircraft Group-15 area. On 1 July 1972 Major General L. E. BROWN, 1st MAW Commander visited MAG-15 and on 15 July Marine Aircraft Group-15 was inspected by Lieutenant General METZGER III MAF Commanding General.
