Motor Transport: 163,876 gallons of JP-4, 22,328 gallons of 80 Oct., and 44,816 gallons of diesel fuel dispensed during this period. Total miles driven - 71,731.





**Utilities:** 

Carpenter Shop: As of 12 July 1972, working stock down to 5%. As of 20 20 July 1972 working stock down to 0. Water Supply: efforts were directed in getting operational the gear needed for the water treatment plant. This plant will allow for the distribution of both potable and nonpotable water to fill all requirements from a central location. Electric Shop: Electricians involved in wiring the hanger area and immediate flightline facilities along the parking apron. Other projects included wiring the Security Det. compound, the office area for the Squadrons. A security lighting system was installed between \_\_ the taxiway and main runway at bunker bocations for the Security Det... The generator mechanics maintained 38 operational generator locations and a total maintenance load of 97 generators organic to MABS-15.

MATCU-62: During the month MATCU-62 continued to provide ATC services as follows: GCA approaches - 342, Tower operations - take offs - 1353, Landings - 1362, touch and goes - 1748.

CRASH CREW: During this period CC stood by on 26 aircraft emergencies. The emergencies were varied and included hot brakes, blown tires, hydraulic failures, and engine failures. CC responded to two flight line incidents: the first an MB-3 starting unit that shorted out causing an electrical fire, the second was a ground accident involving a parked F-4 that rolled into two parked aircraft causing minor damage.

Launch & Recovery: During this period has arrested landings were made one of which was an aircraft going to fast to stop.





Communications: The communications section augmented by detachment MWCS-18 and 7th Comm Bn. provided a terminal link for entry into the Defense Communication Agency (DCA) worldwide Defense Communication System (DCS) in support of MAG-15 and Task Force Delta during this period.

From LJul72 to 7Jul72 intermitten Autodin service was provided into DCS to the forces located in Nam Phong, Thailand. On 8Jul72 fully operational Autodin service into DCS was established.

Heavy Equipment: Total number of equipment hours run - 472. Number of runs by equipment:
