2. General Summary: H&MS-16 supported operations in all TAOR's. The Army, also supported U.S. Army, U.S. Navy, US Marine Corps and ARVN units throughout I Corps.

3. Chronological Summary

1 October - Operations in the Dong Ha area and Phu Bai TAOR were normal. In the Danang TAOR one HHM-463 CH53A was hit by enemy fire at coord. BT 194865, no injuries.

2 October - In the Dong Ha area one HMM-362 UH-34D was hit by enemy fire, no injuries. Operations in the Phu Bai TAOR were normal. In the Danang TAOR the VMO-2 quick reaction armed helicopters provided support for recon team "Crankcase". The VMO-2 APD aircraft flew in support of the 1stMARCIV.

3 October - In the Dong Ha area one H&MS-16 O-1G made an emergency landing 3 miles north of Dong Ha Airfield due to engine malfunction, no injuries. The aircraft was recovered by CH-53A. Operations in the Phu Bai TAOR were normal. In the Danang TAOR the following aircraft were hit by enemy fire: one HHM-463 CH-53A, coord. BT 0733, no injuries; one HMM-363 UH-34D, coord. ZC 139691, no injuries.

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4 October - Operations in the Dong Ha area and Phu Bai TAOR were normal. In the Danang TAOR one HMM-363 UH-34D was hit by enemy fire at coord. BT 047647, no injuries.

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13 October - Operations in the Dong Ha area and Danang TAOR were normal. In the Phu Bai TAOR one HMM-362 UH-34D was hit by enemy fire at coord. YD 350370, one minor injury. The VMO-2 APD aircraft flew in support of the 3rd MARDIV.

14 October - Operations in the Dong Ha area and Phu Bai TAOR were normal. In the Danang TAOR one VMO-2 UH-1E was hit by enemy fire at coord. ZC 176977, no injuries. The VMO-2 quick reaction armed helicopters flew in support of recon team "War Cloud".

15 October - In the Dong Ha area one H&MS-16 O-1G was hit by enemy fire at coord. YD 170795, no injuries. Operations in the Phu Bai TAOR were normal. The VMO-2 quick reaction armed helicopters supported recon teams "Texas Pete" and "Petrify". HMM-265 flew on an emergency extract of recon team "Petrify" escorted by VMO-2 armed helicopters; however, the mission was aborted due to intense enemy fire.

18 October - One HMM-363 UH-34D made an emergency landing at coord. ZD 073113 when the engine caught fire and seized, no injuries. The VMO-2 quick reaction armed helicopter flew fire suppressive and TAC(A) missions in support of recon team "Petrify". One UH-1E was forced down at coord. ZC 177996 after being hit by enemy fire, no injuries. An HMM-265 CH-46A was hit by enemy fire and forced down at coord. ZC 168012, no injuries, while in support of the same recon team. 12. Base Operations. During the first half of October, the Operations Section continued supporting all Marine Aircraft Group 16 operations in the Marble Mountain Air Facility, Phu Bai, Dong Ha and Khe Sanh areas. 17. Ordinance. During the month, the Ordinance Section issued 519,396 rounds of small arms ammunition, 6,240 rounds of 2.75 white phosphorus and high explosive rockets and over 2 tons of assorted chemical and smoke agents.

18. Logistics. Air Freight and Passenger Section processed the following during the month of October:

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a. A new communications office was completed during the month enabling the Communications Section to expand and remodel resulting in more suitable facilities.

b. The U.S. Air Force began laying 900 pair cable at IMAF in order to install a central office dial telephone system in the near future.

c. MAG-36 assumed control and communications responsibility for Phu Bai and Dong Ha during this period resulting in 10 communications personnel and several pieces of communications equipment being transferred to that unit. The Communications Section assigned 3 teams of radio operators as Landing Zone Control Teams to the 1st Marine Division during an operation and a small communications section was established at MCAS Chu Lai to support MAG-16 Detachment Alpha.

d. The message traffic increased by 1,090 messages during this period. Total volume of messages processed was 8,869 with 2,337 originated by MAG-16. A minimum of down time was experienced by the message center due to cooler weather coupled with the installation of air conditioning in the message center.

e. The following transactions were affected by the repair section:

- (1) 176 items of equipment processed.
- (2) 18 items of equipment evacuated to higher echelons of maintenance.
- (3) 11 items of equipment returned from higher echelons of maintenance.
- (4) 144 items of equipment returned to users.
- (5) 79 requisitions processed by supply section.

Interim change 12 changed to read as follows:

MK24 MOD 2A/3 FLARES: PREPARATION OF, PRIOR TO LOADING IN AIRCRAFT

- a. Take each flare in turn, assure that safety cotter pin is in place then remove plastic cap and recertify that pin is properly engaged.
- b. Set ignition and ejection delay fuses to values desired in accordance with procedures in Ordnance Pamphlet OP-2213, first revision dated 1 October 1965.
- c. Recoil lanyard and replace plastic cap; place flares in storage containers (remove flare from foam shipping container and place in wood/metal container of local manufacture of a size to contain ten (10) flares in two (2) rows of five (5) flares per row).

LOADING AND STOWAGE OF STORAGE CONTAINERS WITH FLARES

- a. Ensure that boiler plate (or other suitable armor type protection) is placed on floor of aircraft where flares will be stowed.
- b. Ensure that all flare container boxes are placed on rollers to enable rapid jettison in case of emergency. (Cargo rollers: Conveyor, wheel, gravity, FSN 3910-248-9403).
- c. Load storage containers aboard aircraft with flares standing vertical along the port side of the aircraft with the fuse end up, in quantity required for the mission.
- d. Ensure that all flare container boxes are properly secured to the deck of the aircraft with 10,000lb test tie down straps.

HUMAN SAFETY PRECAUTIONS FOR FLARE HANDLING AND DISPENSING CREW

- a. Assure adequate level of lighting.
- b. Assure that no obstructions, cables, lines or stores exist between the flare storage containers and the starboard side of the aircraft.
- c. All personnel involved in the dispensing operation shall be equipped with a gunner type safety harness which

shall be attached to a high strength cargo tie down ring and snubbed up to prevent inadvertent egress from the aircraft. In addition, all flare dispensing personnel shall wear a backpack parachute.

- d. Prepare a static line of sufficient length to permit a three (3) foot stream from the hatch with a one hundred (100) pound strength (minimum) snap hook and affix to aircraft at hatch opening.
- e. Assure that adequate safety equipment is on board the aircraft and immediately available for use, to include two (2) pressurized water fire extinguishers, one (1) snow type shovel and one (1) pair of asbestos gloves for handling any flares that might ignite aboard the aircraft.

FLARE DISPENSING PROCEDURES (Minimum) crew of five (5) men supervised by a responsible senior NCO.

- a. Man no.1 (ordnance man) is responsible for removal of the plastic cap from each flare and making sure of the proper setting in accordance with the procedures in Ordnance Pamphlet OP-2212, first revision dated 1 October 1965.
- b. Man no.2 (handler) will take the flare from the ordnance man and pass flare to the lanyard man.
- c. Man no.3 (lanyard man) will ensure that both ignition and ejection dials are properly set, that the flare lanyard is in good working order, and that the lanyard is securely attached to the aircraft.
- d. Man no.4 (Kicker) ejects the flare from the aircraft upon signal from the aircraft commander, immediately prior to ejection, he will make the final arming of the flare by pulling the ignition cotter pin.
- e. Man no.5 (intercom talker) will maintain communication with the aircraft commander and pass all required information to the flare crew NCOIC or to the flare crew as appropriate.

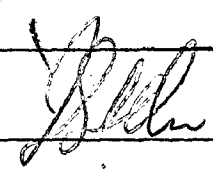
