2. General Summary. MAG-16 supported operations in all TAOR's. The Group also supported U.S. Army, U.S. Navy, ROK Marine Corps and ARVN Units throughout I Corps.

3. Chronological Summary

1 November - Operations in the Danang TAOR were normal. MAG-16 provided a detachment of five UH-34D's and four UH-1E aircraft at Chu Lai to support the ROK Marine Corps Brigade on a continuing basis.

2 November - Operations in the Chu Lai area were normal. In the Danang TAOR one VMO-2 UH-1E was hit by enemy fire at coord. AT 895506, no injuries.

3 November - Operations in the Chu Lai area and Danang TAOR were normal. The VMO-2 APD Aircraft flew in support of the 3rd MARDIV and was hit by enemy fire at coord. YD 0967, no injuries.

4 November - Operations in the Chu Lai area were normal. In the Danang TAOR operations were greatly hindered due to inclement weather.

5 November - Operations in the Chu Lai area and Danang TAOR were normal.

4. Civic Action

a. Water Point. The water point personnel processed 1,566,425 gallons of water during the month, 118,300 of which were non-potable.

b. Paint Shop. The paint shop personnel completed twenty projects. A total of fifty signs were painted.

c. Electric Shop. Electric shop personnel completed one hundred four projects and answered numerous trouble calls.

d. Plumbing Shop. Plumbing shop personnel completed sixteen work requests and answered numerous trouble calls.

e. Refrigeration Shop. Refrigeration shop personnel completed fifteen work assignments.

f. Carpenter Shop. Carpenter shop personnel completed seventy-five trouble calls and work assignments.

g. Generator Shop. Generator shop personnel performed all first and second echelon maintenance with a minimum of breakdown.
