1. Colonel J. P. BRUCE assumed command of Marine Aircraft Group 16 on 1 October 1969, relieving Colonel F. K. FULTON.
2. During the month of October, MAG-16 aircraft flew a total of 7,375.3 hours and 20,954 sorties in support of FWMAF in I Corps Tactical Zone. Over 50% of this effort, 3,754 hours and 12,353 sorties, was flown in support of the First Marine Division.
3. Marine Aircraft Group 16 supported the following combat operations during October: PIPESTONE CANYON; VICTORY DRAGON XVI.
4. On 16 October, Marine Aircraft Group 16 assumed Administrative Control of HMM-161, HMM-262 and HML-367. Operational Control was not assumed during October. As a result of this, the Command Chronologies of these squadrons will be submitted by Marine Aircraft Group 36.
5. Contact with the VC/NVA at Marble Mountain Air Facility consisted of one mortar attack on 21 October which resulted in moderate damage.
6. Detachment Alpha of VMO-2 was formed on 2 October for the purpose of fulfilling a requirement to support the Third Marine Division with visual reconnaissance and FAC(A) aircraft after the deployment of VMO-6. The detachment was ADCON MAG-16 and OPCON ProVMAG-39 until 9 October when the detachment became OPCON MAG-36 for the remainder of the month.

e. The MAG-16 Utilities section aided our Civic Action effort by constructing two showers in Binh Ky and, with the aid of TAFDS, pumping a total of 840,000 gallons of water out of 30 homes in Nui Kim Son following heavy rains.

f. A 15 pound block of C-4 was discovered under the porch of a house in Nui Kim Son where Civic Action personnel and villagers usually congregate.

Ref: (a) Group Order 5750.1C, paragraph 6.a.

1. In compliance with reference (a), the intelligence input for the MAG-16 Command Chronology for October 1969 is submitted herein.

2. Ground Activity. During the month of October the enemy conducted the following attack against Marble Mountain Air Facility.

21 October - 13 rounds of 82mm mortar - moderate damage

3. Anti-Aircraft Fire Incidents

a. 116 fire incidents were reported during the period, up 13 from the previous month; 29 of which resulted in aircraft hit, up 15 from the previous month.

b. Out of a total of 116 fire incidents, 5 of these were reported to be .50 caliber, down 4 from the previous month.

4. Intelligence Information

a. 46 aircrew spot reports of intelligence value were received from aircrews and other sources; this is a decrease of 43 from the previous month.

b. No reports of intelligence value were received from indigenous sources, no change from the previous month.

1. In accordance with reference (a), significant events within the Logistics field for the period of 1 thru 31 October 1969 are as follows:

- a. On 1 October 1969, Base Development Officer, FMAW notified MAG-16 that USMACV approved MAG-16's emergency request for MILCON construction to expand the base facilities due to two more anticipated squadrons.
- b. On 2 October 1969, Commander THOMAS and Mr. DAVE BAUMGARTNER of OICC arrived at Marble Mountain Air Facility with RMK supervisor Mr. ALLEN ERHART to discuss contract work to build the emergency MILCON asphalt parking apron of 41,366 square yards and a taxiway of 26,000 square yards.
- c. On 3 October 1969, RMK began construction of the asphalt parking apron in the northwest side of the airfield.
- d. On 10 October 1969, MCB-4 began to fill in the site area and started construction on a 60 S.E.A. hut contonment on the west side.
- e. On 15 October 1969, BDO, FMAW notified BDO, MAG-16 that CONAVFORV would contract for a new 100' x 180' hangar on the west side via OICC contracting Office.
- f. On 16 October 1969, MCB-4 representatives concluded design plans with MAG-16 BDO on the construction of three BOQ buildings that will house a total of 66 officers.
- g. On 18 October 1969, the new post office, two admin/operations buildings, an OV-10A runup pad, VIP pad were staked out and construction started.
- h. On 19 October 1969, MCB-4 submitted the completed design of the new air freight building to MAG-16 BDO.
- i. On 19 October 1969, MABS-16 Utilities completed a wooden bridge structure leading to the enlisted club as part of a drainage system for the

living contonment.

j. On 27 October 1969, MMK began lifting the pierced steel planking matting on the center west parking apron to prepare for 26,000 square yards of asphalt taxiway/parking apron.

k. On 30 October 1969, MAG-16 S-4 moved the existing Air Freight building to another area to allow for MCB-4 construction of the new Air Freight building.



1. In accordance with reference (a), the following statistics represent Civic Action accomplishments by MAG-16 during the period 010014 October to 312400 October 1969.

A. Medical/Dental Treatment

(1) At the present time MAG-16 is not providing any MEDCAP services; however, when MCB #4 departs for CONUS, we will assume their Civic Action area of responsibility.

(2) The Civic Action Section has been providing MCB #4 with transportation and security during their MEDCAPS to the hamlets of Binh Ky and Da Ne #2.

B. Education

(1) Twenty Gen. Walt Scholarships were presented to the students of Hoa Long Village.

(2) One hundred reams of writing tablets were delivered to the various schools in the Danang Area.

C. Projects

(1) A pig farm has been established in the hamlet of Da Ne #2. 5th Comm Bn is providing the feed and instructions the villagers on the proper breeding and raising methods and procedures.

(2) Twenty bags of cements was donated to the Buddhist Monks on Marble Mountain to assist in the repairs of some of their war-damaged temples and shrines. A marked improvement was viewed by the undersigned of the reconstruction projects and it is gratifying to see the people utilizing the donated material.

(3) MAG-16 Utilities Section assisted the Civic Action Office by constructing two showerstalls in Binh Ky Hamlet. The CAP unit assigned in that area will be using these showers in hopes that through example the village children will pick up some sanitary habits.

(4) In conjunction with the RD personnel in Binh Ky, the Civic Action Team of MAG-16 is attempting to repair the school facilities so that school can be reopened. WE are performing this task on strictly a scrounging basis and so far have collected enough lumber to build desks for the school.

(5) Utilizing two pumps from Utilities and TAFDAS, we were able to pump a total of 340,000 gallons of water out of thirty homes in Nui Kim Son.

(6) The primary school in Nui Kim Son had a clean-up day of the village and this was conducted by the principal and his students. The Civic Action Team provided the necessary rakes, sandbags, and transportation to haul the trash away.

(7) We are attempting to start a Danang tour; however, it has not been very successful due to the lack of transportation.

D. Problems and incidents

(1) Binh Ky. We have encountered some personality conflicts with the hamlet chief, who is cooperative only when he benefits personally. RD suspects him of being a VC; however, has no proof. We commenced working with the RD personnel rather than with the chief and noticed a marked improvement in our rapport with the people.

(2) Nui Kim Son. A 15 pound, (command type) block of C-4 was discovered under the porch of a house where the Civic Action personnel usually congregate with the villagers.

(3) Binh Ky. A gunner's-mate from Mobile Construction Battalion #4 was killed in an ambush in Binh Ky.

(4) Nui Kim Son. A sweep was conducted of Nui Kim Son by members of the CMF team, National Police and 3rd Arttrks on 23 October 1969. Twelve VCs were netted and turned over to the National Police.



5. Civic Action. (MABS-16 and MAG-16 Chaplain's Command Chronologies)

a. During the month of November 1969, MAG-16 Civic Action commenced MEDCAP services in the hamlet of Binh Ky in place of MCB-4.

b. One hundred reams of writing tablets, ink wells, small blackboards and pens were provided to the re-opened school in Binh Ky.

c. When MAG-16 Civic Action commenced operating in the Hoa Phung Village Environments, the Binh Ky Hamlet School consisted mainly of a shell of a building with bullet-ridden walls and roof. The building was not being utilized as a school nor was there a single teacher in the village. The school was refurbished and reconstructed by the members of the Revolutionary Development Team with the building material "scrounged" by the Civic Action team. The RD's with the voluntary help of the local carpenters, constructed desks and doors out of discarded 3 X 12 planks from the old bunkers of Zulu Company. All the lumber that went into the reconstruction of the school was destined for the burn dump had not the Civic Action Team realized their potential use. Discarded plywood painted with black paint became blackboards while tin sheets off the MABS-16 Squadron Office was utilized as roofing for the newly refurbished school. The RD's reopened the school and are presently conducting classes for approximately one hundred and fifty of Binh Ky's children until province provides a suitable teacher. This project is representative of the capabilities of a Civic Action Team provided it possesses the full cooperation of the people. The MAG-16 Civic Action Team in conjunction with the 5th Comm Bn Civil Affairs section has inaugurated a hog-raising demonstration project in Khue Bach Hamlet, Hoa Long Village. Utilizing discarded lumber materials from Zulu Company, the Civic Action personnel have constructed two covered pig stys and a larger open-air rooting pen. Two boars and four sows were procured at half price from the Phuc Long piggery in Saigon. These animals are fed daily from the mess halls at 5th Comm and Marble Mountain and periodic innoculations are administered by the Army veterinarians. We are also attempting to cross-breed with the Vietnamese sows. To this date the villagers are reluctant because of the size of our animals. However, given time, we should be able to persuade them. Although the sty is not guarded by Americans and wholly situated in the hamlet environment, none of the pigs have been stolen or poisoned. This leads us to the belief that the villagers have accepted this project and seem interested in the outcome. Ultimately, the hog-raising enterprise will be handed over to the village in an effort to build up the economy of this area. The Buddhists at Marble Mountain are continuing to rebuild their temples at Nui Kim Son. Three pallets of discarded bricks and ten bags of cement were delivered to the Temple. An old woman's house was inadvertently destroyed by the CAP team in Binh Ky while in contact with the VC. Materials scrounged by the Civic Action Team was utilized in rebuilding her house. It was very encouraging to see the whole village turn out to rebuild her house. Marines supplied the materials while the villagers provided the labor.

d. Nui Kim Son - The pigs in the village self development projects have encountered some unknown disease and we haven't been able to convince the villagers to turn over the cadavers in order to perform an autopsy. They profess to have buried the pigs; however, they have probably sold them on the open market.

e. Binh Ky - The transfer of some of the individuals from the CAP

unit has facilitated for better working relations with the indigenous personnel. These individuals were a detriment to the Civic Action programs because of their negative attitudes towards the villagers. Two natives supposedly received flesh wounds from fam firing and steps were taken to remedy that situation.

f. A total of \$1,163.96, 19,680 pounds of food, 426 pounds of clothing and 55 gallons of gas was distributed by the MAG-16 Chaplain.
