Subj: Intelligence Input for the Command Chronology (U)

Ref: (a) Group Order 5750.1C, paragraph 6.a.

1. In compliance with reference (a), the intelligence input for the MAG-16 Command Chronology for November 1969 is submitted herein.

2. Ground Activity. During the month of November the enemy conducted the following attack against Marble Mountain Air Facility.

3 November - 19 rounds of 82mm mortar - light damage

3. Anti-Aircraft Fire Incidents

a. 145 fire incidents were reported during the period, up 29 from the previous month; 37 of which resulted in aircraft hit, up 8 from the previous month.

b. Out of a total of 145 fire incidents, 9 of these were reported to be .50 caliber, up 4 from the previous month.

4. Intelligence Information

a. 77 aircrew spot reports of intelligence value were received from aircrews and other sources; this is an increase of 31 from the previous month.

b. No reports of intelligence value were received from indigenous sources, no change from the previous month.



1. In accordance with reference (a) significant events within the logistics field for the period 1 through 30 November 1969 were as follows:

- a. During the early morning of 3 November, 19 82mm mortar rounds impacted within Marble Mountain Air Facility. Three (3) Marines and six (6) Army personnel were wounded, three (3) buildings damaged, eight (8) holes in the PSP aircraft mat, five (5) CH-46 and five (5) CH-53 aircraft damaged. Public Works repaired the PSP and buildings at first light.
- b. On 4 November, MCB-4 started construction on the new MAG-16 Post Office.
- c. On 5 November two aerology vans were installed to the south of the crash crew building.
- d. On 8 November, MCB-4 started work on the 4th 14 man BOQ.
- e. On 10 November a new SEA hut was constructed for MATCU-68 by MCB-4.
- f. On 15 November MCB-4 started work on the 4th building for the dispensary complex.
- g. On 15 November Utilities completed work on a prototype wooden revetment for SEA huts.
- h. On 17 November Utilities commenced work on erecting a building for the MARS station.
- i. On 19 November a conference to determine MAG-16 requirements for collateral equipment for MILCON C-523 buildings was held at COMNAVFORV Headquarters at Red Beach.
- j. On 19 November a conference to discuss RMK storage yard land acquisition was held at OIOC, Div Con North, Da Nang.
- k. On 21 November a new trash and garbage contractor started work for MAG-16. He will provide three trucks each making three trips per day.

1. On 22 November asphalt paving was completed by RMK on the northern half of the west ramp taxiway.

m. On 25 November work was completed on bricking the front gate house.

n. On 26 November Public Works commenced work on re-roofing the troop billeting huts in the 600 block.

o. On 27 November Public Works completed the interior finishing of the two new medical buildings.

p. On 29 November MCB-4 was relieved by D Company, MCB-121. They will complete all Seabee tasked construction associated with MILCON C-523.

2. During this period MAG-16 Air Freight handled 1,481 passengers and 208,025 pounds of cargo.

3. Motor Transport travelled 94,715 miles hauling 577 tons of cargo and 28,653 passengers. During the same period 179,819 gallons of POL were transported.

COMMUNICATIONS:

RADIO SECTION: Continues to operate necessary nets to support the group. A net utilizing the AN/PRC-77 with speech security equipment KY-38 was established for check out of compatible equipment (KY-28) as needed.

MAINTENANCE: The following transactions were made for the previous month.

1. 106 pieces turned in for repair
2. 98 pieces of gear repaired
3. 7 pieces of gear evacuated
4. 6 pieces returned from higher echelon
5. 56 requisitions were processed

MESSAGE CENTER SECTION: The Message Center processed a total of 5,469 on line message and 2 off line messages for the month of November 1969. 90 hours of down time was experienced during the past month due to minor equipment, power, and preventive maintenance. Prior to total outage with a MAG-16 detachment Message Center, a total of 182 messages were transmitted to MAG-16 detachment with 0 incoming.

WIRE SECTION: Continues to maintain the field wire system. With an increase in units attached to MAG-16, a shortage of telephones and switching equipment is ~~will~~ be experienced by this section.

COMMUNICATION SECTION: MAG-16 detachment Communication Section continues to provide communication support for MAG-16 units located at Phu Bai. Considerable down time was experienced with the Radio Relay System (AN/TRC-97) to Phu Bai, as a result 1st MAW Communication has been relaying all message traffic to Phu Bai for MAG-16 detachment. Lt Tisdale the assistant Communication Officer attended the Communication Security School at Yokosuka, Japan.
