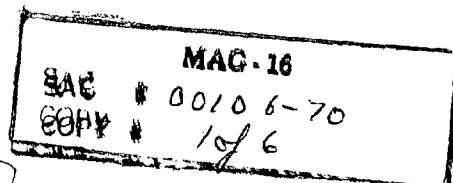



PART IINarrative Summary

1. During the month of January, MAG-16 flew a total of 11,471.6 hours and 33,939 sorties in support of FVMAF in I Corps Tactical Zone. Over 59% of this effort, 6,882.9 hours and 22,500 sorties were flown in direct support of the First Marine Division.
2. Marine Aircraft Group 16 supported the following operations during January 1970: Victory Dragon XVIII through XIX.
3. Contact at Marble Mountain with the VC/NVA during January 1970, was one (1) rocket attack on the night of 4 January. Light damage was incurred.
4. There were three changes of command in January. Major R. A. GOVONI assumed command of HMM-361, LtCol C. A. BLOCK assumed command of HMM-463, and LtCol J. M. MORIARTY assumed command of VMO-2.
5. On 31 January 1970, HMM-361 was deployed back to CONUS as part of the Phase III withdrawal after only six months in the Republic of Vietnam.
6. During January, VMO-2 operated for the first time as an all fixed wing squadron.
7. HMM-161 reached 10,000 accident free flight hours during this month.
8. HMM-167 flew 2466 flight hours during January which is an all time high for HMM-167.
9. During January, Operation Kingfisher was refined, developed and used extensively as an airborne combat patrol. Kingfisher consists of one (1) UH-1E(S), C&C aircraft, carrying the Helicopter Commander Airborne (HCA), the Troop Commander and a representative from the Battalion or Regiment, three (3) CH-46's with a platoon reinforced aboard, four (4) AH-1G Cobras for gun support and one (1) OV-10A to control the air if required. Kingfisher is normally airborne at first light flying a specific route based on intelligence, however it is used on any target of opportunity. The UH-1E(S) and two AH-1G's precede the CH-46's searching for VC/NVA. On locating a suspicious target the HCA and Troop Commander make a decision on the spot to commit the platoon. If committed, smoke is dropped on the target and the CH-46's land. The rest of the company is kept in reserve for a quick reaction force if required.

During the month of January, Kingfisher was executed 17 times with the following results: 86 VC/NVA KIA(C) and 15 POW's.

10. On 1 January 1970, MAG-16 sent a detachment of CH-53D's, Luminous Delta, to the Republic of Malaysia, to support Vice President AGNEW during his visit to Kuala Lumpur.

Six aircraft and personnel from two squadrons were committed. HMMH-463 provided three (3) aircraft and HMMH-361 provided three (3) aircraft.

All six aircraft departed Marble Mountain Air Facility, RVN on 1 January 1970 and flew to Binh Thuy, in the Mekong Delta. The next day two of the aircraft remained at Binh Thuy as back up aircraft until the other four were in Malaysia, then returned to Marble Mountain, RVN. Luminous Delta arrived in Kuala Lumpur the afternoon of 2 January after a 1220 mile trip.

From 3 January until 7 January the flight crews were briefed and familiarized with the mission and the area.

On 8 January 1970, Luminous Delta supported Mr. AGNEW carrying 88 passengers, flying 3.6 hours and 16 sorties.

On 10 January, Luminous Delta started the 1220 mile return trip, arriving at 1730H on 12 January 1970.

a. During the month of January 1970, the MAG-16 Civic Action provided MEDCAPS to the hamlets of Nui Kim Son and Binh Ky. DENTCAPS were initiated

in Binh Ky. Expansion of this program is expected to include Nui Kim Son and Khac Bac hamlets. Medical treatment was rendered to 846 people during the month of January.

b. A total of 52 2X6's, 10 bags of cement and 6 sheets of tin were delivered to the Nui Kim Son school to be used in the construction of a breeze way and milk house for the students. In addition to the building materials, approximately forty (40) reams of lined and unlined tablets were given to the school. Twenty (20) General WALT scholarships were given at the Nui Kim Son School. Additional school books and paper were also given to Khac Bac School. Binh Ky School, which had been without teachers, now has two Vietnamese teachers who began teaching on 19 January. MAG-16 provided Binh Ky School with textbooks (120), paper (50 reams) and pencils.

c. The construction of a Town Meeting Hall (constructed by the villagers) has been completed at Binh Ky. 20 bags of cement used on the floor were given by MAG-16 Civil Affairs. The building is used by the Village Chief for conducting civil matters and is also used by the R. D. C. to give lectures to the people. Two pallets of bricks have been taken to Binh Ky to be used in the construction of a market place which will begin after Tet. Another well pump has been placed in Binh Ky and is being used extensively. Several wells have been refaced with cement and cleaned up. The pig project at Khac Bac is a continuing success. Two of the pig pens have had cement floors poured with the villagers providing some of the help. The boar and sow will be mated after Tet. A pesticide program is to be started in Khac Bac after Tet. Six spray cans (5 gallon capacity) will be supplied by Wing.

d. A total of \$1,050, 1,210 lbs. of clothing, 135 lbs. of food, 1,300 gifts to orphanages for Tet, a pump organ to the Hue seminary and initiation of MEDCAP services three times weekly to the China Beach orphanage were all disseminated and supervised by the MAG-16 Chaplains.

6. Intelligence/Counterintelligence. (MAG-16 S-2 Command Chronology)

aa. There were 246 fire incidents during the month of January resulting in 48 aircraft hits.

b. No reports of intelligence value were received from indigenous sources, no change from the previous month.


