1. In accordance with reference (a), significant events within the Logistic's Field for the period of 1 April through 15 April were as follows:

- a. BGen SIMMONS toured base on 1 April 1971.
- b. Col HAMLET, USA toured MMAF on 1 April 1971 and checked all facilities the Army would take over.
- c. USAF Weather Detachment commenced operations at MMAF on 1 April 1971.
- d. Planning conference on 10 April with USA representatives. The Army presented their situation and problem areas in moving to MMAF.
- e. A program making it possible for MAG-16 personnel to sell their personal appliances to USA personnel was promulgated by letter on 12 April 1971.
- f. A Letter of Agreement assigning 5 Sea Huts to the USA was jointly signed by Col L. C. STREET and Col J. F. HAMLET on 12 April 1971.
- g. The US Army desires to utilize all the facilities and base equipment presently operated by MAG-16 was presented by LtCol PATE (USA) in planning conference held on 12 April 1971.
- h. 14 April 1971. Representatives from the 45th Engineer Group inspected the runway and taxiways prior to commencing a repair of the facilities.
