

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20 June 1971PART IINarrative Summary

This report constitutes the final chronology of Marine Aircraft Group-16 in the Republic of Vietnam. All support missions were terminated, embarkation continued to completion, units were transferred, and after changes of Command for H&MS-16, MABS-16, and MAG-16, the Air Group redeployed to MCAS (H) Santa Ana, California.

Although HML-167 was in stand-down status, two (2) UH-1E's were faithfully maintained and flown in support of the Commanding General, 3d Marine Amphibious Brigade through 9 June 1971. Comprising the only flight operations creditable to MAG-16, the UH-1E's were expertly made available by Marines with a minimum of tools and parts available. HML-167 equipment for embarkation, including all maintenance gear, was staged dockside commencing 6 June 1971. Under the circumstances encountered, the efforts and accomplishments of this, our last operational Marine Helicopter Squadron engaged in the Vietnam conflict, are exceptionally noteworthy. "Comprise" flew 63 sorties for 29.3 hours and carried 19 passengers on behalf of 3d MAB. Operational and administrative control of HML-167 was passed to CG, 2nd MAW at 100200Z June 1971. The remaining two (2) UH-1E's were flown aboard USS DUBUQUE for transfer to MAG-36, 1st MAW on 15 June 1971.

On 1 June 1971, LtCol C. E. REESE relinquished Command of HML-367 to Maj. R. SANCHO who, on 2 June 1971, reported to operational and administrative Control of CG, 1st MAW. No longer maintaining the long held distinction of the Marine Corps AH-1G Cobra squadron, "Scarface" received its compliment of UH-1E Aircraft at MAG-36, Okinawa.

With the greatest part of embarkation and personnel transfer completed in Headquarters and Maintenance Squadron-16, Maj. C. D. SILARD, JR. relinquished Command at 150400Z June 1971 to Maj. D. R. BOWEN who was prepositioned with the advanced element at MCAS (H) Santa Ana, California. Command of Marine Air Base Squadron-16 was similarly relinquished by LtCol D. A. SPURLOCK to Maj. C. W. DIPIETRO at 150400Z June 1971. With all retrograded equipment loaded in shipping and ready for sail, Col L. C. STREET, III passed Command of Marine Air Group-16 to LtCol J. E. GILLIS, likewise stationed at MCAS (H) Santa Ana, California. Simultaneous with the Change of Command at 200400Z June 1971, the Air Group and support squadrons were transferred to the operational and administrative control of CG, 3d MAW for ultimate replacement of Marine Air Group-56.

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The retrograde of MAG-16 equipment was declared by many seasoned Marine Corps and U.S. Navy experts as having been the most efficiently planned and executed movement of this magnitude witnessed by them to date. Serious difficulties resulting from planning inaccuracies made by other Marine Corps retrograde units were encountered and solved through the diligent efforts on the MAG-16 Embarkation staff. Excellence in planning and readiness to take advantage of shipping space made available in the course of loading other units permitted subsequent cancellation of 4 amphibious ships. Seizure of an opportunity to use the latest innovation in sea cargo, the Sea-Land road transportable container, also contributed immensely to the cancellation of amphibious shipping. This use of such a concept is believed to be the first in connection with a combat or administrative movement of U.S. Marine Corps units. A total of 5,000 tons of cargo equalling 195,672 cubic feet, 57,853 cubic feet of vehicles and 64,173 cubic feet of aircraft were loaded in 9 ships under the outstanding planning guidance of LtCol R. R. LEISY, Maj W. B. JOHNSON, and the most direct attention of Capt D. E. MEARES and GySgt D. D. DAIL Embarkation Team ("Old Gas 6").

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20 June 1971PART IIISequential Listing of Significant Events

1 June 1971: H&MS-16 received a grade of Outstanding on the Personnel Inspection administered by Major General A. J. ARMSTRONG, CG, 3d MAB.

1 June 1971: Major R. SANCH0 relieved Lieutenant Colonel C. E. REESE as the Commanding Officer of HML-367.

2 June 1971: Control of HML-367 was transferred from the 3d Marine Amphibious Brigade to the 1st Marine Aircraft Wing.

9 June 1971: HML-167 completed mission #3, which was the last mission flown by MAG-16 aircraft in the Republic of Vietnam.

9 June 1971: MAG-16 retrograde was loaded in USS DURHAM LKA-114 and departed for CONUS. In a 32 Hour period, 600.7 Tons of MAG-16 Cargo were loaded.

10 June 1971: Control of HML-167 was transferred from the 3d Marine Amphibious Brigade to 2nd Marine Aircraft Wing.

15 June 1971: Major D. R. BOWEN relieved Major C. D. SILARD, JR. as the Commanding Officer of H&MS-16.

15 June 1971: Major C. W. DEPIETRO relieved Lieutenant Colonel D. A. SPURLOCK as the Commanding Officer of MABS-16.

15 June 1971: Control of MATCU-68 was transferred from the 3d Marine Amphibious Brigade to the 1st Marine Aircraft Wing.

15 June 1971: The remainder of MAG-16's aircraft (seven UH-1E's from HML-167) were loaded aboard the USS DUBUQUE LPD-8 for a surface movement to the 1st Marine Aircraft Wing.

20 June 1971: The USS MANITOWOC LST-1180 was loaded with the remainder of MAG-16 retrograde cargo.

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20 June 1971: Col L. C. STREET III passed command of MAG-16 to LtCol J. E. GILLIS at MCAS (H) Santa Ana, Calif. The Air Group redeployment embarkation phase is complete and henceforth no U.S. Marine Tactical Air Units are present in the Republic of Vietnam. Control of MAG-16, H&MS-16 and MABS-16 was transferred from the 3d Marine Amphibious Brigade to the 3d Marine Aircraft Wing.
