PART TWO - Narrative Summary

- 1. (U) On 1-4 August 1966 Col ARMAGOST and party flew to Danang te conduct liasion with the First Marine Aircraft Wing.
- 2, (U) On 5 August 1966 Col TOSDAL assumed command from Col ARMAGOST in a formal change of command ceremony.
- 3. (C) 'The Tom Green County arrived on 13 August 1966 embarked MABS-17 vehicles, Group/Wing Supply, and the Data Processing Unit and departed for Danang on 14 August 1966.
- 4. (C) On 12 August 1966, First MAW pilots accepted 4 TF-9J aircraft from MAMS-17 for ferry to Danang.
- 5. (U) On the 13th of August 1966 plans were formulated for the Reorgan-ization of MWSG-17.
- 6. (U) On 15-20 August 1966 Col TOSDAL conducted a liasion trip to Danag.
- 7. (U) On 22-24 August 1966 Col TOSDAL and party flew to Banang to conduct liasion with First Marine Aircraft Wing and formulate plans for MWSG-17 Movement.
- 8. (C) On 19 August 1966 MWSG-17 reported OPCON TO MAG-15.
- 9. (U) MAMS-17 continued to support the First Marine Aircraft Wing and MAG-15 by flying the daily MANTACLOG and other commitments. During August 1966, MAMS-17 aircraft flew 217.3 hours and carried 1,102 passengers and 289,037 pounds of cargo and mail while flying 30,512 nautical miles.

PART THREE - Significant Events

1. Reorganization of MWSG-17

- a. (U) The date for reorganization of Marine Wing Service Group to the Marine Wing Support Group concept has been designated as 1 September 1966.
- b. (U) In preparing for this change-over, the H&HS-17 Administrative Section has been physically moved to the MAMS-17 office spaces. All Group personnel now in Iwakuni which will eventually be in H&MS-17, have been transferred to MAMS-17.

2. Movement of MWSG-17

- a. (C) The major obstacle to the entire Group's moving to RVN is the delay in the completion of ramp facilities. Provisions have been made to establish the Group Headquarters in the MAG-13 messhall. Also, four troop shelters have been made available for admin/billeting spaces. Therefore, the plan to deploy the Group Staff and associated personnel on or about 12 September 1945, continues unchanged.
- b. (C) MAMS-17, which will be designated H&MS-17 by then, will deploy with its remaining personnel and US-2B aircraft upon the availability of sufficient ramp space, working areas, and living spaces. The programmed assignment to the Group of 30 FASGA structures will materially assist in providing for the latter. The other aircraft still under the custody of MAMS-17 will be transferred as directed.

3. Civil Affairs

- a. (U) The assistance program, conducted by H&HS-17 for the YAHATA GAKUEN ORPHANAGE has been discontinued owing to the impending disestablishment of the Squadron.
- b. (U) Chaplain WEAVER continued his English classes, conducting a total of 14 hours of instruction during August 1966. He also visited two orphanaes.
